Gospel Meditation

"He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him." Peter, Andrew, James, and John's lives would never be the same. They were going about their usual business--fishing on the Sea of Galilee--when Jesus approached them and said, "Come after me." And that's just what they did. "At once they left their nets and followed him." Such a quick response to such a radical request!

What compelled these men to leave their livelihood to follow the Lord? His promise to them was that he would make them "fishers of men." Perhaps they thought that promise sounded fabulous. But it seems more likely that it was Christ himself who drew the men. There must have been something utterly attractive about him, and completely trustworthy. Otherwise, it seems unbelievable that these men would have been so quick to respond to his call.

This compelling man is the same Christ who calls us. We hear his voice in a different way, of course, through the Church and through the Bible, through his Spirit in our hearts, but it is nonetheless the same Jesus of Nazareth who asks us to follow him. Have we allowed ourselves to be drawn by his voice? Are we open to a real encounter with the Lord who changes lives?

If our relationship with Jesus does not transform us, if it does not change us into different, better people moment by moment and day by day, then chances are that we are not truly encountering him. He is too powerful to be inconsequential. It might take some courage and commitment to come into authentic contact with the Lord, but when we do, our lives will never be the same.







St. Bernadette

St. Bernadette was born in Lourdes, France on January 7, 1844 and died on **April 16, 1879**

In 1928, Doctor Comte published a report on the exhumation of Blessed Bernadette in the second issue of the *Bulletin de l'Association medicale de Notre-Dame de Lourdes* . . . What struck me during this examination, of course, was the state of perfect preservation of the skeleton, the fibrous tissues of the muscles (still supple and firm), of the ligaments, and of the skin, and above all the totally unexpected state of the liver... One would have thought that this organ, which is basically soft and inclined to crumble, would have decomposed very rapidly or would have hardened to a chalky consistency. Yet, when it was cut it was soft and almost normal in consistency. I pointed this out to those present, remarking that this did not seem to be a natural phenomenon."

Our **developmentally appropriate** lessons are based on bible stories. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting.

The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby **creating a bible storybook** to have at home.

At Sunday School, **children meet other children**, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson.

They have a **simple snack** and some special celebrations and participate in the mass at **Thanksgiving and Christmas**.

Parents have the opportunity to **participate** in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass and know that their **children are safe and happy** participating in a faith experience created just for them!

Sunday School is held in the **preschool classrooms**. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty-trained and **3 years old by Sept. 1st**.

It's **not too late** to enroll. We have spaces available at both 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. Want to learn more?



St. James Preschool is a Catholic-Christian preschool that provides opportunities for each child to grow socially, physically, cognitively and spiritually. We believe in creating a warm and loving environment where children can learn about themselves, gain an understanding of others and develop strong self-esteem.

The preschool has four classrooms available. The classes are for potty-trained children who are 2 1/2 to 5 years old. Pre-K applicants must be four years old by September 1st to be eligible for our Pre-K program, but not 5 years old by September 1st.

At St. James Preschool the children are given many opportunities to develop literacy skills and reading readiness. Each month the children participate in a **Book Swap** where they bring "old" books from home to swap for "new" books for their home libraries. The children and adults both enjoy having new books to read at bedtime.



Along with our **Book Swap** fun, we love to celebrate our favorite literary characters.

Next month the children will celebrate **Clifford the Big Red Dog's birthday**. We will spend the week reading Clifford books, we will wear red clothes on his special day, and eat red snacks!

In the early church, people took their allegiance to certain leaders to an extreme. Paul chastised them for thinking that the baptism of one community or the teachings of a certain leader were superior to the anything else in this new movement of Jesus followers. He reminded them that there is to be no division in Christ and that all things flow from Christ, not from the leaders in the community. Those who follow Jesus are one body of Christ: a place where there is no room for competition or condescension.

Sometime our stewardship efforts in a parish become all about the parish. We seek to get people to do more stuff and give more money and we lose sight of why we live a stewardship way of life in the first place: Jesus. It is wonderful to watch our parishes grow into more vibrant communities that lead people to Jesus. We should rejoice to be in such a parish family. But one day there will be no parishes and those who have received his gifts freely and have followed him will live with Christ as one forever. In your stewardship, always keep Jesus as the main thing.
