Pastors Letter

From the **earliest** days of the Church the disciples would carry the Eucharist to the **homes of the sick**.

The concern was that the faithful who were ill were deprived of **their rightful** and accustomed place in the Eucharistic community.

The outreach and care for members of the church who are **ill or physically impaired** continues to be in the **heart** of every Catholic parish. Just as we have **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC)** assisting in the distribution of the Eucharist at daily and Sunday Masses, we also have **ministers of the Eucharist** who carry the **Eucharist to the homebound, care centers and Little Company of Mary Hospital**.

In bringing Communion to them the Eucharistic minister **represents Christ** and manifests faith and charity on behalf of the **whole community** toward those who cannot be present at the Eucharist.

For the sick, the **reception of Communion** is not only a privilege but allows those who cannot come to a church the opportunity to **receive the Lord and to worship Him**, in the company of family and friends. It is also a **sign of support and concern** shown by the Christian community for its members who are ill.

In the past, the ministers at St. James were given the Eucharist **after the conclusion of Mass** and would begin their visits.

As Advent begins this year the **Eucharistic Ministers to the Sick will come forward** to receive the sacred Eucharistic hosts **before the end of Mass** and will be **blessed and sent by us** as a community to begin their visits.

If **you** would like to **help us expand** this outreach ministry to bring the Eucharist to our **sick and homebound** parishioners at home, or to bring the Eucharist to a **convalescent center** or **Little Company of Mary Hospital** please contact **Miki Finken** at 310.316.3890

If you have a loved one who is Catholic and **unable to attend Mass** with us on Sundays, we would be happy to send one of our ministers to the home or local convalescent center. Please call the parish office to arrange for a minister to come.

December 8 — Feast of the Immaculate Conception.

This is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please join us in celebrating this feast day.

Vigil Mass is 5:30 PM on Wednesday, December 7.
Feast day Mass celebration is December 8 at 8am, 12 noon and 7 pm.

Some people think the term refers to Christ's conception in Mary's womb without the intervention of a human father; but that is the **Feast of the Annunciation**, March 25th (9 months before Christmas.) Others think the Immaculate Conception means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit," in the way Jesus was, but that, too, is incorrect.



The conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary was brought about in the womb of **St. Anne** in the normal way with **Joachim**, her father. The Immaculate Conception

means that Mary was **conceived without original sin** or its stain—that's what "immaculate" means: without stain.

Nine months later on September 8, we celebrate the **Nativity (birth) of the Blessed Virgin Mary**.

Mary was preserved from the defects of original sin by God's grace; **from the first instant of her existence** she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings.

Advent: A Time of Preparation

The word Advent comes from the Latin advenio, **"to come to,"** and refers to the **coming of Christ**. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of **Christ's birth** at Christmas; but second, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the **Sacrament of Holy Communion**; and finally, to **His Second Coming** at the end of time.

Our preparations, therefore, should have all three comings in mind. We need to prepare our souls to **receive Christ worthily**.

You noted that some were very happy and some very sad. You stated over and over that all of life has its troubles, its ups and downs but we must not be dismayed! Our God is our constant! He will never fail!

We were moved, Father Jim by your trust and by the truth that the Lord is our Rock!

Reflection

"Produce **good fruit** as evidence of your repentance." John the Baptist **does not mince** words. He tells it like it is. When the hypocritical Pharisees and Sadducees show up piously for baptism, John calls them out, saying, "**You brood of vipers!**" Not welcoming words, to say the least. Then he tells them that being part of the religious club (i.e., children of Abraham) isn't enough. No, "every tree that **does not bear good fruit** will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

It can be easy to join John in **pointing fingers** at those self-righteous religious leaders. But we're usually **not** so quick to point fingers at ourselves. On this Second Sunday of Advent, as we seek to prepare for the coming of Christ, **we also need to hear** John's solemn warning.

How are **we** like these Pharisees? How have we excused ourselves because we are **part of the "club,"** because we are baptized Christians, regular churchgoers, **better** than others, or whatever justification we use to declare **ourselves** in good shape?

How have **we** failed to produce good fruit by being satisfied with a **comfortable life** and a routine practice of the faith? **What** do we need to change? **Where** do we need to grow? **How** do we need to reach out and **serve others**, to sacrifice sinful behaviors, to delve deeper into our love for the Lord?

John preaches today that God will "**gather his wheat into his barn**, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Advent is a **gift** from the Church--a time to **renew our spiritual life by getting rid of the chaff** in our souls and producing instead a fruitful harvest. **Now** is the time to do this work. As John tells us, "Repent, for the kingdom of **heaven is at hand!**"

Welcome Parents of Young Children!

The children created a "Tree of Thanksgiving" and their **own feelings of thanks.**


