Gospel Meditation

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was." In our day and age, the star of Christmas has become a kind of decorative symbol that adorns manger scenes and Christmas trees. It suggests something good and bright and holy, a visual indicator that the "Light of the world" has appeared. But today, on the feast of the Epiphany, we recall that originally, this star was not just a pretty symbolic ornament. This star was a sign from God that intervened in the operations of the physical universe. The Magi understood that this star was sent from God to indicate where his Son would be born.

Of course it should not surprise us in this season of all seasons that God should choose to order the universe according to his purposes. Jesus has just been born of a virgin! God has just taken on human flesh. These events in themselves are extraordinary divine interventions--miracles that defy the standard operation of things. Why shouldn't God choose to send a luminous star where he wants it, when he wants it? Why shouldn't he reveal his plan through the things that he created in the first place?

The beauty of today's feast is found, in part, in the fact that the Magi were able to recognize this sign from God. They waited for it, they saw it, and they rejoiced in it: "They were overjoyed at seeing the star." We too should be overjoyed in this season of God's special revelation to us. We may need the eyes to recognize it, but truly we have waited for a Savior, we have seen his appearance at Christmas, and now it is time to celebrate! God is at work in our physical world. He has come here, now to save us. This is cause for rejoicing!



Pay attention to and address risky behavior

It is **possible** for children to abuse other children, and that when it happens, the effects can be devastating for the child who has been abused. As caregivers, make sure to **notice any young people** who are exhibiting behaviors **that are troublesome or inappropriate**.

Be there to step in **when high-risk behavior** is present. Support the youth, and give him/her the opportunity to **get professional help**, to go to **counseling** with a therapist that is trained in this issue, and to talk with you about the challenges they are facing so that together you **can find solutions**.

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them?

Did you know that St. James offers **Sunday School during the 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. Masses**?

Our Sunday School program helps the **3, 4 and 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year – old child** develop a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the **gifts He has given us**.

Our **developmentally appropriate** lessons are based on bible stories. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting.

The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby **creating a bible storybook** to have at home.

At Sunday School, **children meet other children**, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson.

They have a **simple snack** and some special celebrations and participate in the mass at **Thanksgiving and Christmas**.

Parents have the opportunity to **participate** in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass and know that their **children are safe and happy** participating in a faith experience created just for them!

Sunday School is held in the **preschool classrooms**. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty-trained and **3 years old by Sept. 1st**.




How do I become Catholic?

Recognize God in Ordinary Moments

The story of the **Wise Men** bringing gifts to Jesus, the newborn King, is a great one, isn't it?

They had a great big star in the sky to lead the way.



I am no Boy Scout, so I am not sure how well I would do following a star like that. But the important point here is that **God led them** to the manger. The manger was a place that unless God specifically showed you this was where the Christ Child was born you wouldn't have believed it. You would have passed on by.

In our lives, **there are no big stars in the sky leading us** where we need to go. It isn't so easy sometimes discerning where God is leading us. We may seek to use our gifts wisely, but in what manner and **to what end is not always clear.**

This is where **prayer can make a huge difference.** If we seek to cultivate a prayer life where we are mindful of the presence of God throughout our day, then the call is **easier to discern.**

We can help the process by intentionally offering to God in the morning the **entirety of the day** to come: all our actions, all our time, and all our decisions.

In the evening, we can examine the past hours of the day and **reflect on when we responded well** to Christ's call and when we fell short. Then we resolve to begin again tomorrow, inviting Christ to be with us every step of the way.

God may not offer a star in the sky to lead us, but if we invite us on our journey each day, **the path will be much clearer.**


