Warren leads the Welcome Ministry, friendly volunteers who warmly greet church members before Mass


begins. Warren has also assisted in the Annual Men’s Cornerstone Retreat, which allows men to become more actively involved in their spiritual development.



## Sunday School

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them? Would you like them to be familiar with favorite old and new testament bible stories? Would you like them to know basic Catholic prayers, but also to feel comfortable just talking to God in their own words? Do you wish there was a way for a preschool aged child to understand the message in the gospel reading?



The answer to your questions is Sunday School! Our Sunday School program helps the 3, 4, 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year old child build a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the gifts He has given us. Our developmentally appropriate lessons are based on the gospel stories for each week. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting. The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby creating a bible storybook to have at home. There is also a special book about Catholic faith traditions and practices that is sent home at the end of the year.


At Sunday School, children meet other children, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson. They have a simple snack and some special celebrations. Sunday school participates in the Mass at Thanksgiving and Christmas and may also have the opportunity for small community service projects. Parents have the opportunity to participate in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass knowing their children are safe and happy engaging in a faith experience created just for them.

Sunday school begins October 1<sup>st</sup> and continues to May 6<sup>th</sup> and is held in the preschool classrooms. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty trained and 3 years old by Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>.

## Gospel Reflection

"Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you."

Ouch.



This had to sting. Jesus spoke these shocking words not just to anybody. He spoke them to "the chief priests and elders of the people." The ones who were professional law-keepers. The ones who were religious leaders

and teachers. The ones who were, in truth, self-righteous, pompous, and presumptuous. Jesus must have known how offensive it would be to his audience to share this unpleasant fact. But he said it anyway because he knew they needed to hear it.

But the point wasn't to offend. The point was to amend. Jesus was urging them to change their lives for the better, to come to God with a humble, contrite heart, seeking forgiveness and mercy. These unrepentant upper-crust leaders were plagued by an inability to see their own sins. They were far too focused on identifying where others were going wrong. And, as was his style, Jesus' preaching was adapted according to his audience. These guys needed to get knocked out of their complacency. So Jesus did what he had to do.

It's important to realize, by the way, that the reason tax collectors and prostitutes were leading the line to heaven wasn't because of their sins. It was because of their sorrow. The people Jesus had in mind when he mentioned this - like Zacchaeus and Mary Magdalene perhaps - had repented from their sinful behavior and begun anew. This is why he praises them. And this is what the Lord longs to see everyone doing, including us. Either we need to acknowledge and repent of our sins, or we are placing ourselves in the same category as the pharisaical priests and elders. And that's definitely not the place to be.

**Catholic Q & A**

**Q:** What did Pope John Paul II highlight in his writings regarding the evolution of the Church's ongoing mission, from the Second Vatican Council to its 20th anniversary assembly of Bishops that produced the Catechism Of The Catholic Church?

**A:** In Fidei Depositum, (The Deposit Of Faith), the Holy Father wrote: "The principal task entrusted to the Council was to guard and present better the precious deposit of Christian doctrine in order to make it more accessible to the Christian faithful and to all people of good will."

The Bishops who gathered at the 20th Anniversary stated: "Very many have expressed the desire that a catechism, or compendium, of all catholic doctrine regarding both faith and morals be composed, that it might be a point of reference; a catechesis renewed at the living sources of faith."

The Pope, now Saint John Paul II, (John XXIII of Vatican II has also been canonized), essentially blessed the catechism: May the light of the true faith free humanity from the ignorance and slavery of sin in order to lead it to the only freedom worthy of the name, Jesus Christ.

We at St. James, as well as Catholics worldwide, are heirs to this compendium of a faith, this precious deposit, carefully and inspirationally presented as our spiritual map; our catechism. J P Alegria
