
Anointing of the Sick






Since its doors opened on September 10, 1918, three Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet arrived at the invitation of the bishop to teach seventy children

Gospel Reflection

"For they preach but they do not practice."

The scribes and Pharisees may be the ones Jesus was speaking about in today's Gospel, but we must be careful not to dismiss his words when it comes to our own actions.

Jesus offered a difficult challenge to those honor-seekers that we must also heed when he said, "The greatest among you must be your servant." This is not the way the world usually works. Generally speaking, the idea of being a servant is considered inferior to being someone who has risen to high levels of leadership or status. But Jesus wants people in positions of authority to selflessly serve those over whom they have influence. And he insists that the leaders who establish laws, rules, and guidelines do not excuse themselves from following their own directives!

"Practice what you preach," as the saying goes.

Whether or not we have extensive public influence, almost all of us at certain points are in a position to exercise leadership--with our children and families, with classmates, coworkers, neighbors, friends, and sometimes strangers. When these moments arise, we are called to step into this role without being hypocrites. It's important to be sure we don't issue unrealistic demands on others that we ourselves would find it burdensome or even impossible to fulfill. This requires the virtue of humility. Instead of reveling in the authority we may have at any given moment, instead of creating "heavy burdens hard to carry and lay[ing] them on people's shoulders," we need to be ready and willing to walk a mile in their shoes, and lead accordingly. And Jesus tells us clearly that this servant leadership will be rewarded, for "whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

The Rite of Acolyte—Mark and Louise



As a deacon couple in formation, we continue to discern God's call for us as we progress towards ordination. Louise and I are in our 4th year of formation and as we are formed, the men advance through several rites. On October 21st, I was instituted as an Acolyte

during a Mass presided by Bishop Joseph Sartoris at the Holy Spirit Retreat Center located in Encino.

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, "The acolyte is instituted to serve at the altar and to assist the priest and deacon. In particular, it is the responsibility to prepare the altar and the sacred vessels, and when necessary, as an extraordinary minister, to distribute the Eucharist to the faithful." Many of you know us as Sacristans at 10 am Sunday mass.

At St. James, sacristans already assist with many of these duties. But as a deacon candidate, "A dominant characteristic of the Acolyte is love for the Eucharist and a craving to understand the deep spiritual meaning of the Eucharistic Liturgy and the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist... in a new way, to be near the sacred table of the Lord, responding to the call to be very near to the risen Jesus Christ himself!"

Catholic Q & A

"Eternal destiny, Grace and Purgatory"

Q: What awaits us at the end of our earthly life and how does the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC) explain purgatory?

A: Those who die in God's grace and friendship and are **perfectly** purified live forever with Christ. Heaven is described in the Catechism as, "the ultimate end and fulfillment of the deepest human longings, the state of supreme, definitive happiness." The perfect life with the Holy Trinity, Mary, the angels, and all the blessed, face to face with Christ.

He who does not love remains in death. Separated from God, in a death of mortal sin, the state of definitive self-exclusion from communion with God and the blessed is called "*hell*." *Gehenna*, the unquenchable fire, is where the separation from God is eternal. God predestines no one to go to hell. We have freedom of choice in repentance, or to choose a willful turning away from God.

Purgatory is a place where atonement, almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance are undertaken on behalf of the dead. Prayers for the deliverance of the dead are made so that, "...thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God."

"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo a purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

May we live for and pray to the Lord, that we find ourselves in a "dwelling place rooted in love."
