

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them?

Would you like them to be familiar with favorite old and new testament **bible stories?**

Would you like them to know basic Catholic prayers, but also to feel comfortable **just talking to God** in their own words?

Did you know that St. James offers **Sunday School during the 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. Masses?**

Our Sunday School program helps the **3, 4 and 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year – old child** develop a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the **gifts He has given us**.

Our **developmentally appropriate** lessons are based on bible stories. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting.

The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby **creating a bible storybook** to have at home.

At Sunday School, **children meet other children**, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson.

They have a **simple snack** and some special celebrations and participate in the mass at **Thanksgiving and Christmas**.

Parents have the opportunity to **participate** in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass and know that their **children are safe and happy** participating in a faith experience created just for them!

Sunday School is held in the **preschool classrooms**. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty trained and **3 years old by Sept. 1st**.



Welcome Parents of Young Children!

Relax! God loves the wiggly little saints and we do too! Please welcome families with young children to mass with smiles and encouragement!

We understand how difficult it is to **attend Mass** with all the supplies a family with young children needs. Many of us have been through this and **understand what it's like**.

If we do what we can to **encourage families to pray together** at Mass when they are young, the seeds planted will help **them develop a deeper faith they can turn to as life becomes ever more difficult**. Want to do more to help these families? **Consider helping at Children's Liturgy of the Word**.

Bells of Christmas—Angelus

If you happen to be near the church at **6 pm** or attending Mass at **12 noon**, you may notice that the church bells will **toll a unique pattern**. The manner of ringing is the Angelus—the triple stroke repeated three times, with a pause between each set of three (a total of nine strokes), is part of the rich tradition of the Catholic Church, and a **call to prayer and to spread good-will to everyone**. Pray anytime, or when you hear the bells.

The Angelus is a Catholic devotion honoring the **incarnation of Jesus**; the moment of **God becoming both fully man and fully God in Mary's womb**.

The angel referred to in the prayer is **Gabriel**, a messenger of God who revealed to Mary that she would conceive a **child to be born the Son of God**. Lk. 1:26–38.

Prayer:

V. **The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary.**

R. **And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.**

Pray one Hail Mary

V. **Behold the handmaid of the Lord.**

R. **Be it done unto me according to thy word.**

Pray one Hail Mary.

(Common practice to bow during the next 2 lines to draws attention to the moment of the Incarnation of Christ into human flesh)

V. **And the Word was made Flesh.**

R. **And dwelt among us.**

Pray one Hail Mary

V. **Pray for us, O holy Mother of God.**

R. **That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.**

Let us pray: Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts, that we to whom the **Incarnation of Christ** Thy Son was made known by the message of an angel, may by His Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of **His Resurrection**. Through the same Christ Our Lord. Amen.

This tolling of the bell at noon and 6 pm call us to spread the **good news of eternal life** to all who believe in His Son. God's unimaginable humility and love for us is demonstrated by coming down from heaven and **becoming a helpless baby**, taking on our sins, dying and rising from the dead, to give us a gift of eternal life; if we choose to **follow Him**. This Christmas, let us realize the **unearned gift** we have been offered: life after death, **for eternity**. We have a choice: **Do our own will** as the world tempts us to do that will lead us away from God and death, **or to follow God's will** for what
