Everyday Discipleship

In *Everyday Discipleship*, Tracy Welliver describes six basic traits of disciples of Jesus: Mindful, Prayerful, Grateful, Gracious, Committed and Accountable.

We had covered being Mindful in our Nov. 27 bulletin, available on website: SaintJames.Church/members.

Today we'll look at becoming more Prayerful. "A second trait of an Everyday Disciple is being prayerful. Living as an everyday disciple is not easy, but without prayer, it is impossible. We are called to pray in many ways since a relationship has many facets. Sometimes we do the talking, sometimes we are listening. Other times we are just resting in God's presence. In prayer we petition, we give thanks, and we give glory and praise. We offer our emotions of joy, fear, sadness, anger and uncertainty. Our goal is to realize God is with us constantly and we need to be mindful we are always in the presence of the Divine.

I often suggest two daily prayers to assist us in living this way of life. In the morning, use the words of St. Francis de Sales as a start of the day: "*Call to mind that the day now beginning is given to you in order that you may work for Eternity, and make a steadfast resolution to use this day for that end.*" Take a moment to reflect on these words and then offer the day to God. Ask for the strength to make the day count for something. One of the greatest abuses of God's gifts is the wasting of time. Be open to the many moments of the day as potential callings. Be the difference in someone's life this day. Take the chance to bring someone closer to God today, for what happens today, might last for all eternity.

At night, use the words of St. Ignatius of Loyola:

Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding and my entire will, all that I have and all that I own. You have given all to me. To you, Lord, I return it. Everything is yours, do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace, that is enough for me.

Sometimes called the radical prayer, the Suspice is in many ways the ultimate stewardship prayer. It speaks beautifully of how we can give back everything to the one who created it and all that remains is the love and grace of God, which is always more than enough.

With this as an end of day reflection, we are to also pause and reflect on how we have not given all to God throughout that day. When did I miss a chance to encounter Jesus in another? Where did I fail to be the best disciple and steward I can be? The prayer then becomes a statement of resolve for the next day to come. We pray always to be better tomorrow than we are today. Gospel Meditation

"Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God." John the Baptist had an important message to impart. He was called by God to prepare the people of Israel to recognize Jesus' true identity. In a sense, he helped establish credibility for Christ by confirming that he was in fact the Messiah. Jesus didn't just have to claim it on his own; John also "testified" to the fact. We, of course, also benefit from the witness of John the Baptist recorded for us in the Gospels. And we have additional witnesses from the rest of the people throughout the Gospels who knew and recognized Jesus as the Son of God. But we also have the benefit of two thousand years of Church history! We have countless testimonies of saints and believers throughout the centuries who have known Jesus in their own lives and acted accordingly.

This raises two questions. First, are we willing to believe these testimonies from those who have gone before us? Consider how much credence we give to the experiences and the stories of our forefathers and foremothers in the faith--whether they are blood relatives or members of the larger communion of saints. Sometimes these personal accounts of coming to know the Lord are much more powerful than any "proof" or intellectual proposal about Christianity. They do require a degree of faith and trust, but they nonetheless provide us with real evidence about the impact of being close to Christ.

Secondly, let us consider whether or not we are willing to give testimony to who Christ is to us? It's one thing to believe in Jesus; it's another thing to share that faith with others. But like John the Baptist, we are called to share the truth so that others may come to believe.

Inspiration for the Week

It is important to know who we are and from where we come. Having a clear sense of identity allows us to make choices that further express and develop our ultimate purpose and goals. We are reminded today of Jesus' unique identity as God's Son and that by our baptism we are given the gift of sharing in that same intimate relationship with God. May knowledge of this make a difference in how we live our lives!



Our Sunday School program helps the **3, 4 and 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year – old child** develop a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the **gifts He has given us**.

Our **developmentally appropriate** lessons are based on bible stories. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting.

The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby **creating a bible storybook** to have at home.

At Sunday School, **children meet other children**, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson.

They have a **simple snack** and some special celebrations and participate in the mass at **Thanksgiving and Christmas**.

Parents have the opportunity to **participate** in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass and know that their **children are safe and happy** participating in a faith experience created just for them!

Sunday School is held in the **preschool classrooms**. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty-trained and **3 years old by Sept. 1st**.

We will cover the central themes of the book including how we can overcome resistance in our lives as **mothers as we guide our families to happiness**. Our next meeting will be **January 17th**.





From LA times, Jan. 12, 2017: "Heartened by the number of men who've recently entered the diocese's St. John's Seminary — enrollment hit 92 in the fall of 2013, up from 71 in 2008, an uptick ascribed in part to the popularity of Pope Francis — officials say they expect to soon be ordaining groups of 10 to 12 priests, and possibly more, each year. The Vatican announced Tuesday a new leader for the Catholic Diocese of Salt Lake City, Bishop Oscar Azarcon Solis from the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. Named by Pope Francis, Solis will be the first Filipino-American bishop to head a diocese in the United States, according to the Catholic Church. He is scheduled to be formally installed on March 7.


