Everyday Stewardship

So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God. Eph. 5:1-2.

"Have you ever heard of Wolfgang Beltracchi? For decades he created forgeries of works from the most famous painter in history and he made millions doing it. He was so talented in creating them that many of his creations were hanging, and may even hang to this day, in museums and art galleries around the globe. Experts cannot even tell the difference, and this has led to an inability to verify and then appraise pieces of art all over the world. The risk of the appraiser is too high since they might get it wrong. Beltracchi claims to have made one mistake, using the wrong paint on a painting, which then led to his arrest and conviction. After serving eighteen months of a six-year jail sentence, he continues to create original art and write books in order to help pay for all the lawsuits currently against him.

There is no question about the immorality of lying and cheating in this manner. However, can you even imagine being able to create an imitation of something so close to the original that no one could tell the difference? Someone not familiar with the original could easily be fooled. But to fool so-called experts would be quite amazing.

Saint Paul wrote to the Ephesians and encouraged them to be imitators of Jesus Christ, by living in love and sacrificing their very selves. Can you imagine imitating Jesus so closely that people only see Him when they look at you? The term Christian means to put on Christ. We are to be Jesus Christ to the world, leaving Mass where we have consumed Him in the Eucharist so we can be more like Him. Everyday Stewards are called to give more like Christ, share more like Christ, and love more like Christ. It is no crime to imitate Jesus Christ, but instead, a sin not to try."

It is quite a big reality to swallow. But for the believer, it is a reality that inspires us to the point where we find ourselves constantly sharing the Gospel with everyone we meet! Right?

By acknowledging the gifts you have been given, cultivating those so they grow to an increase, and then sharing them fully with God and with others in God's name will give testimony to your belief that Jesus is alive and seeking a relationship with each of his people.

If more of us won't live our lives in this manner, then non-believers and non-intentional disciples will ask the question, "What difference does Easter make anyway?"

Visit the Preschool Children Easter Display at Mass

The preschool has shared some of our butterfly habitats with St. James Church in celebration of Easter. Look for the milkweed plants in the Church, Kavanagh Hall, and the O'Gorman



Center to observe the miracle of life for yourself!

The children are observing and learning about the lifecycle of the butterfly. Our garden is home to several milkweed plants, which are the preferred habitat for the monarch butterflies. The butterflies land on the plants and lay many eggs each time they visit. When the outside temperatures are warm, like in the springtime, the eggs hatch and the caterpillars feast on the plant's leaves. After about two weeks of feasting, the caterpillars find a safe spot and build their chrysalis to metamorphosize into a butterfly! The entire process is about a month in duration.

The children have also created caterpillar and butterfly art for you to enjoy during your visit to St. James Church. We wish you a joyous Easter.



Gospel Reflection

"Then they went away quickly from the tomb, fearful yet overjoyed."

The two Marys were in for a surprise. They had come, as usual, to do the ritual anointing of their dead friend's body. But on their arrival, not only was there an earthquake, there was also an angel whose "appearance was like lightning" and whose "clothing was white as snow."

The brave guards were so scared they "became like dead men," but the women managed to stay on their feet and hear the words of the angel. Guess what!

Jesus isn't here.
He's been raised from the dead.
Now go share the good news!

No wonder these women were feeling a mixture of emotions! They were frightened by these incredible supernatural events, but overjoyed that Jesus was alive again. Just imagine their joy when "Jesus met them on their way," and they were able to embrace him and worship him. What a day!

Now, we too join in the celebration of this day of all days. Every Easter, we recall these glorious events, but we do more than just remember. We also rejoice that our Lord is alive right now, that death and sin have been conquered forever, that the gates of heaven are open for us. The joy of Easter is not a nostalgic kind of happiness that only looks backwards. It is instead a call to rejoice in the gifts that we can enjoy today and in eternity.

We may not have seen the angel, felt the earthquake, or kissed the feet of the risen Lord, but we are nonetheless the beneficiaries of this momentous event. We are an Easter people, a people in the hands of a loving God whose power can overcome all the terrible threats and trials of existence with the amazing gift of eternal life.

Catechism Q&A

Q: As Catholics, we at St. James seek to know and enrich our knowledge of the faith. The Catechism Of The Catholic Church has been called a coherent, contemporary map for our spiritual journey; what John Paul II called, "A sure norm for teaching the faith." This particular journey of ours continues its alphabetical tour of selected topics from the catechism. We've arrived at Letter "P". What's the topic this week?

A: The topic is Prayer! The index of the catechism on prayer contains about 100 citations on the various forms, features, saving grace and beauty of prayer. On a relative plane, see Matthew Kelly and Resisting Happiness. His Chapter 9 features God, prayer, spiritual vitality, and the establishment of a daily habit of prayer. The Catechism and Kelly.
