### Catholic Daughters

The Apostleship of Sea Dinner was funded by Catholic Daughters of the Americas.

The proceeds of the dinner go directly to the Center to help defray the many extra expenses for maintaining the center and Chapel.

The Catholic Daughters supports the Apostleship of the Ship locally at the Catholic Maritime Center in San Pedro which also reaches out to the Port of Los Angeles and Port Hueneme by supplying such items as black socks, black seafarers caps, rosaries, printed religious material, magazines such as National Geographic, personal items, playing cards, note paper with envelopes, etc.

At the request of the Port Chaplain, Fr. Freddie Chua, we also supply bibles, both in English and Spanish. Coffee, tea and hot chocolate supplies along with various types of snacks and candy for the workers and the seafarers who visit the Center are also provided to the center by our Court (we check periodically to see what is needed).

In addition, we send a financial donation every quarter. This is one of the many organizations that the Catholic Daughters supports.

### Catechism Q&A

**Q:** What's our topic from the Catechism this week beginning with the letter R?

**A:** Our topic is Reverence. A parishioner inquired about the reverence that should be exhibited at Mass, especially at the celebration of the Eucharist because such reverence is truly essential and proper.

What does the catechism say? Well, try Paragraphs 1407 and 1418, which specifically address reverence in all its forms of adoration, respect, devotion, honor, and what it is to esteem the taking of Communion, calling the Eucharist, "...the heart and the summit of the Church's life; where Christ associates his Church and all her members with his sacrifice and thanksgiving..."

"Because Christ himself is present in the sacrifice of the altar, he is to be honored with the worship of adoration." The Catechism has many more spiritually transformational citations on this beautiful, mystical topic. The Catechism helps us to examine our conscience on many aspects of the Church's teachings.

Also, Kelly's, *Resisting Happiness*, has a chapter entitled, Blessed and Grateful, where he discusses authentic humility and gratitude for all the ways God has blessed us. Take your time and be grateful. Good advice.



Finally, as we look back across our Church's 125 years of worship, we can ponder the reverence that those first half dozen families of the early 1890's in Redondo had in their hearts as they struggled to hold services, even as they described themselves as, "...small in number and poor in purse."

They lacked a proper structure of worship before our first St. James Church began to take form. What they didn't lack was honor and devotion to the great holy sacrifice of the precious body and blood of our savior.

Their enduring example, and the teachings of the catechism offer timeless guides for our own frame of reference as we joyfully, humbly, and thoughtfully prepare our hearts to observe and to receive communion today.

## Everyday Stewardship

The road to Emmaus is one of my favorite Gospel stories because it shows a Jesus that is masterful at reaching people. First, when he comes upon those walking on the road, he asks them what they are talking about and then asks them to explain. How often are we too eager to just start talking at people when we feel they need to hear what we have to say? Jesus offers an invitation for them to share first. Allowing them to share first opens them up for what Jesus will do next.

Second, Jesus takes time to interpret for them the words of the prophets. He gave them their turn and now it is his. Not only wise, but a movement of respect. After a long walk, they invite Jesus stay with them and dine. Third and finally, Jesus breaks bread with them and they are able to see that he is no ordinary traveler. He is the risen One. He could have just told them who he was, but allowing them by their experience to uncover who he was had the greater impact.

Jesus demonstrated to us in these actions how to be gracious and impactful when sharing the good news. If we are to be good stewards and fruitful disciples then we must imitate him in this regard. This Easter season let us practice the following: 1) Allow others first to share what they have to say. 2) Then be willing to take the time to explain fully or to the best of our ability our faith. And 3) help others find a way to experience firsthand the message you have shared. No one can understand love without witnessing love. In this way, your words and deeds will become a pathway to Jesus for others.



## Gospel Reflection

"Jesus himself drew near and walked with them, but their eyes were prevented from recognizing him." The disciples on the road to Emmaus had already heard reports about Jesus' resurrection.

It was at the forefront of their minds, but in spite of this, they did not recognize Jesus when he stood right before them.

Why not? Perhaps because they weren't looking for him. Maybe they didn't really believe that he was alive. Or it could be that his appearance was not the same as it had been before.

Whatever the case, it's very interesting to learn that it was actually while celebrating the Eucharist that these men finally realized who was right there with them! "He was made known to them in the breaking of bread."

Living as we do some two thousand years later, it is easy to imagine that recognizing Jesus was a snap for those who walked the earth when he did.

We can run the risk of feeling sorry for ourselves that we don't get to see Jesus in person the way they did. But look here! It was through the Eucharist that Christ was made known to them, and we too have that gift right in front of us.

We celebrate every week the same "breaking of bread" at the altar during Mass. Jesus is present with us, body, blood, soul, and divinity, even if we don't recognize him! He is there, present in our midst.

If our eyes of faith are feeble, we can pray that the Lord will help us to know his presence in the Eucharist. Just as he came to comfort and accompany his first disciples, he wants to do the same for us through the Most Blessed Sacrament. We only need to be sure that we are always on the lookout to find him in our midst.
