

### Need to Replace Doors of the Church and add a Protective Canopy

We have been struggling with the front doors of the church for several years. They are seriously deteriorated and ready to fail because of their constant exposure to the weather.

The parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Council have both been reviewing the situation for almost a year. Their recommendation is to replace our existing doors, and add a canopy to the front of the church. A concern for all is that the doors and canopy should compliment the church and enhance the architecture and presentation of the church from the street.

On June 7<sup>th</sup>, the parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Council are hosting a special Open Parishioner Meeting to present the situation and recommendation for the project. It is more costly than we would like, but we believe it is the best for our stewardship of the parish.

We invite you to this informative and important meeting to understand and discuss the problems and options available for us so that we can move forward together as a faith community as we have brought Christ to the South Bay for the last 125 years.

## Sacrament of Confirmation

This sacrament is called *Confirmation* because the faith given in Baptism is now confirmed and made strong.

Confirmation means accepting responsibility for your faith and destiny. Childhood is a time when you're told what to do, and you react positively to reward and negatively to punishment.

Adulthood, even young adulthood, means that you must do what's right on your own, not for the recognition or reward but merely because it's the right thing to do.

The focus is on the Holy Spirit, who confirmed the apostles on Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4) and gave them courage to practice their faith. Catholics believe that the same Holy Spirit confirms Catholics during the Sacrament of Confirmation and gives them the same gifts and fruits.

The twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit are **charity, generosity, joy, gentleness, peace, faithfulness, patience, modesty, kindness, self-control, goodness, and chastity**. These are human qualities that can be activated by the Holy Spirit.

The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are **wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord**. These gifts are supernatural graces given to the soul.

The individuals named below have spent two years in preparation for receiving this sacrament.

Please join us in celebration as we honor their commitment to the Catholic faith. May we assist them and pray for them as they deepen their understanding of God's unimaginable love for us.

### Catechism Q&A

**Q:** The Catechism of the Catholic Church draws on the Bible, the Mass, the Sacraments, Church tradition and teaching, and the lives of the saints. On this solid foundation of faith, the Catechism offers a positive, coherent, contemporary map for our own spiritual catholic journey. We're at letter **U** in this series of alphabetically generated topics in the catechism. What subjects, if any, are listed beginning with letter U?

**A:** There are two subjects beginning with letter U; Unity and Understanding. Let's stand united and go with the subject imparted as one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit: The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. Map out your harmonious possibilities amid this realm of virtuous understanding in your catechism.

For Matthew Kelly, the problem of resistance in *Resisting Happiness* is that it is an enemy, an obstacle standing between you and the person God created you to be. In Chapter 1, called "Resistance", Kelly starts off by proposing a better understanding of the dynamics of resistance by naming it, analyzing it in its many forms, and presenting ways to conquer it.

## Gospel Reflection

"Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ."

The Easter season is resplendent with the joy of eternal life. Jesus conquered death through his resurrection and promises all believers a share in this miraculous triumph.

The gates of heaven have been opened for us by the great sacrifice of our Savior. All good things lie in wait for us who know "the only true God" and his Son, Jesus Christ.

When we gather together in our communities of faith, it's easy to remember all of this. We share common beliefs and practices with those friends, family members, and neighbors who attend our church.

But carrying the joy of Easter with us out into the "world" can be more of a challenge. Once we step outside the safe confines of our parish or home, we encounter those who do not know the true God. We work with, study with, encounter, or gather with many people who have forgotten, abandoned, or never even known Jesus.

Sometimes this can make us hesitant to share our joy, or even apologetic for our beliefs. But of course we are called to be witnesses of what we believe, not cowards who hide it from public view.

So let us take courage from today's Gospel. Jesus himself offered prayers on behalf of his followers. "I pray for them. I do not pray for the world, but for the ones you have given me."

As the followers of Christ, we have the benefit of his own desire to help us, to strengthen us even amidst the challenges that we face. He knows that we "are in the world" even though he is not here in the same way. And he has asked God the Father to share his divine blessings with us even as we make our way in this world.

## Everyday Stewardship

I don't think I am giving away anything to say that Knights of Columbus are supposed to always carry with them a rosary. Even before I became a Knight, often I would carry a rosary with me. Like most good habits, at times I would slowly become oblivious and forget to have it with me.

Many weeks and months of carrying it in my pocket would give way to a couple weeks of wondering where it went. To stick with any practice you have to be intentional and mindful of what you are doing.

A good prayer life requires commitment. Carrying a rosary isn't really prayer, because the prayers are not being said. However, a rosary or other religious article does serve as a reminder of who we are and to whom we belong. A prayer life should not be one where we simply seek to recite words, but one where we walk in the presence of God at all times. Prayer is about presence.

An everyday steward will find success in cultivating a prayer life by inviting God into all aspects and moments of the day. Recited prayer throughout the day serves as the formal ritual part of our relationship with God.

In all relationships we have standard things we say to each other about love, our needs, and our hopes for that person. It is what takes place between the words that sometimes makes the difference.
