## Pastor's Corner

### Results of Special Parishioner Meeting Hosted by the Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils

The meeting was held on Wednesday, June 7, in Kavanagh Hall where we discussed the need to replace the front doors of the Church and the option to add a protective canopy. Presentations were made by Patrick Cunningham of the Pastoral Council, Dan Young, architect, and Tom Miller representing the Parish Finance Council. Thank you to all who attended and presented.



We have been struggling with the front doors of the church for several years. They are seriously deteriorated and failing because of their constant exposure to the weather. Detailed images of the external damage to the doors were presented. The internal wood core has been weakened because of exposure to the elements and proximity to the salt air of the ocean and is no longer able to hold the weight of the doors.

The parish Pastoral Council and the Finance Council have been reviewing the situation for almost a year. They confirm the need to replace our existing doors, and recommendation to add a canopy to the front of the church. A concern for all is that the doors and canopy should complement the church and enhance the architecture and presentation of the church from the street. The image shown to the right was selected as the one that closely matches the architecture of the church.

The canopy will serve as a welcoming and gathering space for our community, protection from sun, wind and rain. It will provide a safe place to enter and exit the church.

The top landing will be replaced with new, non-slip surface material for added safety. The canopy will also prevent rain from entering the vestibule of the church during inclement weather.

The entire canopy will be supported by poles near the building of the church and the side extensions will direct collected rainwater to the planters on either side of the steps.

Note that in the drawings shown, the cover appears to be made of a solid, dark material. Actually, the top material will be a strong but lightweight, translucent covering that will provide a diffused light by day and will be lit up at night to provide added safety with the welcoming and attractive glow. The existing light fixtures on either side of the doors will be removed.

The doors will be steel with glass panels. These will allow the light of the church to be visible to those outside. It will also provide a measure of safety as you'll be able to see what is on the other side before opening the door.

Included in the plans discussed was a line item for adding handrails to the sanctuary to allow easier entry up the stairs to the altar.

The project estimate is \$225,000 including all permits, with a reserve for contingency included. Work is expected to be completed about 6 months after approvals and contract signing.

In July, we will be conducting an appeal for the Building Fund and will be providing additional information on this project. *Msgr. Mike*



#### The Origin of St. James Church

Imagine what Redondo Beach looked like in the late 1800's.

Cars were not invented and people walked, or rode a horse. The modern bicycle was just gaining popularity.

The beginnings of a small, informal community of Catholics began to come together to pray with Sunday Mass in the home of Susana Dominguez. The Dominguez family owned 75,000 acres of land, which includes most of the south bay. They financed the building of a little chapel, named the 'Dominguez Memorial Chapel.' This chapel grew into what we now know as St. James Catholic Church.



Pictured at left is the original bell from the chapel. It is located on the west side of the church.

It called people to prayer and announced Mass from 1892 until 1914.

Our church was founded the same year as the City of Redondo Beach. Our roots in the community are deep and strong.

We have been providing spiritual care, guidance and sacraments to God's people for 125 years.

Imagine the number of Baptisms, First Holy Communion, Weddings, Funerals and Confessions that have been provided over the years.

Consider the number of cars that drive by our church each day. The silent witness of our faith is a beacon of comfort and hope to the community.

We have a rich tradition; a strong foundation of serving the community. Over the years life has become more and more complicated, and the demands of living in our modern world are placing ever greater strains on our families, our children and our relationships. "Truth is beauty, beauty, truth"

**Q:** St. James Church is adorned with beautiful artistic works. What does the Catechism of the Catholic Church say about the beauty and truth of art?

**A:** In a discussion of the 8th Commandment (about not bearing false witness), the catechism elegantly moves to a broader discussion of the beauty and value of truth; extending the perspective to artistic endeavors, including the following citation: "The fine arts, but above all, sacred art, of their nature are directed toward expressing in some way the infinite beauty of God in works made by human hands."

## Gospel Reflection

### 'Be Not Afraid'

Scott Hahn Reflects on the 12th Sunday Ordinary Time

#### Our commitment to Christ will be put to the test.

We will hear whispered warnings and denunciations, as Jeremiah does in today's First Reading. Even so-called friends will try to trap and trip us up.

For His sake we will bear insults and be made outcasts—even in our own homes, we hear in today's Psalm.

As Jeremiah tells us, we must expect that God will challenge our faith in Him, and probe our minds and hearts, to test the depths of our love.

"Do not be afraid," Jesus assures us three times in today's Gospel.

Though He may permit us to suffer for our faith, our Father will never forget or abandon us. As Jesus assures us today, everything unfolds in His Providence, under His watchful gaze—even the falling of the tiniest sparrow to the ground. Each one of us is precious to Him.

Steadfast in this faith, we must resist the tactics of Satan. He is the enemy who seeks the ruin of our soul in Gehenna, or hell.

We are to seek God, as the Psalmist says. Zeal for the Lord's house, for the heavenly kingdom of the Father, should consume us, as it consumed Jesus (see [Jn 2:17](#)). As Jesus bore the insults of those who blasphemed God, so should we (see [Rom 15:3](#)).

By the gracious gift of himself, Jesus bore the transgressions of the world, Paul tells us in today's Epistle. In rising from the dead, He has shown us that God rescues the life of the poor, that He does not spurn His own when they are in distress. In His great mercy, He will turn toward us, as well. He will deliver us from the power of the wicked.

That is why we proclaim His name from the housetops, as Jesus tells us. That is why we sing praise and offer thanksgiving in every Eucharist. We are confident in Jesus' promise—that we who declare our faith in Him before others will be remembered before our heavenly Father.

If you've been attending St. James for a while you've probably heard about Family Promise, or read about it online or in the bulletin, but don't really know what it is.

The first **Family Promise** program began in 1986 in Union City, NJ, after Karen Olson noticed a need in her community and turned to places of worship to form the first Interfaith Hospitality Network. There are now more than 200 networks in 42 states across the U.S., including Family Promise of the South Bay.

The mission of **Family Promise** OSB is to work through local churches and synagogues to change the lives of homeless families with children by providing temporary shelter, meals, and life skills assistance as they seek permanent homes and sustainable independence.

**St. James** is one of these churches, providing families in the program with loving care at the Parish Center from about 6:00 pm to 6:00 am daily. We hosted several families in May and will host again during the weeks of **July 9<sup>th</sup> and Sept. 10<sup>th</sup>**.

Many volunteers are needed each hosting week to provide meals and supplies, be with the families in the evening and overnight, set up, clean up, and do laundry.

If you have already attended a **Family Promise** volunteer orientation at any time—you do not need to renew every year—we can *really* use your help! Please contact Kristi or Judy for the link to the on-line sign-up and schedule.
