

Catholic Q & A

Q: The Gospel of the Lord. The Good News. Each Sunday at Mass and throughout the week we hear and read the word of God. Can you give me a sample of what the catechism, our clergy, and writer Matthew Kelly say regarding the 46 books of the Old Testament and the 27 books of the New Testament and our faith in general?

A: The catechism says: "The Gospels are the heart of all the Scriptures because they are our principal source for the life and teaching of the Incarnate Word, our Savior." "Therefore, the study of the sacred page should be the very soul of sacred theology."

Our St. James clergy: With pastoral care and by way of homiletics, our priests and Deacon elucidate the meaning and application of the inspirational, saving plan that is the redemptive word of God. Father John Callanan at a recent 8am Mass offered this: "Linger over the word of God..." He encouraged us to dwell in meditative contemplation of what the good news is saying to us and what it can mean for us in a spirit of hope and saving grace.

Matthew Kelly: In Chapter 12 of *Resisting Happiness*, Kelly refers to the universal call to holiness, and the devotion to taking his faith seriously. "It was the central idea that connected the ordinary events of my life with the epic story of Catholicism." Holy Scripture. The Good News. Epic.

Fr. Augustine coming to St. James

Saturday, August 26 at 3:30
Kavanagh Hall
Mass at 5:30pm

Join us for a special talk by Fr. Augustine a Dominican Friar as he speaks about St. Dominic and the Dominican charism for the laity.

During the Mass **four of our parishioners will be joining the Lay Dominican order.**

Fr. Augustine was born in Orange County into a non-Catholic household. He entered Thomas Aquinas College in 1995, saw the beauty of the Catholic faith from his studies, and experienced the Christian witness there. He was baptized in 1997 and after discernment, entered the Dominican Order in the Jubilee Year 2000.

He was ordained in 2008 after obtaining his Masters in Divinity and has served in Eugene, Oregon as a chaplain at the University of Oregon and in Anchorage, Alaska at the Cathedral and at St. Raymond in Menlo Park and as the Promoter of the Holy Name Society in the Western Dominican Province since January 2015. He is currently at St. Dominic in San Francisco. Fr Augustine went on a tour of the lands of St. Dominic in 2016.

Gospel Reflection

"Peter got out of the boat and began to walk on the water toward Jesus. But when he saw how strong the wind was, he became frightened."

How can we describe Peter?

At once faithful and fearful, his jumbled responses remind us that he was no spiritual superman, well intentioned though he may have been. Peter wanted to believe, and in fact showed a great deal of confidence in Christ, but the temptation to doubt was strong enough to knock him off his feet, literally.

"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?" Jesus reprimanded Peter. The words seem harsh. After all, Peter was the only one who had enough faith to even try something as ludicrous as stepping out of the boat onto the water in the first place. But perhaps Jesus wanted to emphasize that our faith needs to be strong enough to weather the storm, so to speak.

If we only believe in Jesus when the wind is calm and the waves are gone, is that truly having faith in him? Is that actually trusting in his supreme power over the forces of the universe?

Peter began to sink as soon as a challenge appeared. Jesus called him, and he calls us, to stay on our feet even when the winds begin to blow.

So, what are the winds that threaten our faith? What kinds of gusts are blowing today? Whatever it might be--health problems, financial concerns, relational struggles--none of it is too much for Jesus to handle.

But we must step out in faith and trust him! And we need to keep our eyes on him as we do so, instead of getting distracted by the force of the challenges we face. Jesus is bigger than any problem.


We have nothing to fear as long as we are walking towards him.
