Everyday Discipleship

You know how the story goes. Your son or daughter swears that while you were gone he or she only invited two friends over to watch a movie and eat popcorn. How those other twenty-five people got there with beer is still a mystery. They were not invited but your young host felt pretty uncomfortable just kicking them out. You did teach them about good hospitality after all.

That sure is a twisted view of hospitality, perhaps, but it does make me reflect on those I am willing to welcome into my home and those I am not. Who is my neighbor? Would I extend hospitality to the person that is alone? I have done so for holidays. But I have known them well. Would I invite someone into my home that I did not know? It could be unsafe. But what if I found myself alone somewhere without any connections. Where would I turn? Who could I trust?

There are no simple answers here but I wonder if we should really have the luxury of not asking the question. If the Christian will not invite in the lost and forsaken, who will? In the coming days, I suggest we all reflect on those in our midst who seem to be alone. Who can we invite into our lives who need something much more important than a party? Who is out there who simply need friends? They may not need a physical shelter but they do need the warmth of Christian hospitality and the kindness of others.

Sunday School

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them? Would you like them to be familiar with favorite old and new testament bible stories? Would you like them to know basic Catholic prayers, but also to feel comfortable just talking to God in their own words? Do you wish there was a way for a preschool aged child to understand the message in the gospel reading?



The answer to your questions is Sunday School! Our Sunday School program helps the 3, 4, 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year old child build a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the gifts He has given us. Our developmentally appropriate lessons are based on the gospel stories for each week. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting. The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby creating a bible storybook to have at home. There is also a special book about Catholic faith traditions and practices that is sent home at the end of the year.

At Sunday School, children meet other children, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson. They have a simple snack and some special celebrations. Sunday school participates in the Mass at Thanksgiving and Christmas and may also have the opportunity for small community service projects. Parents have the opportunity to participate in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass knowing their children are safe and happy engaging in a faith experience created just for them.

Sunday school begins October 1st and continues to May 6th and is held in the preschool classrooms. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty trained and 3 years old by Sept. 1st.

It's not too late to enroll; we have a limited number of spaces available 8 and 10 am.



Catholic Q & A

Q: The **Holy Spirit**. How does the *Catechism Of The Catholic Church* present the mission, the name, the titles, the symbols, and God's promise of the Holy Spirit?

A: The Catechism, in Part One, called "The Profession of Faith" gives us, in this particular section of 14 pages, one of the richest, most concentrated gifts of catechesis to be found.

The catechism refers to the *Theophanies*, which are manifestations of God. Here are a few:

- The Holy Spirit is God's gift of love.
- We gain our inheritance of first fruits, the Trinity, by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- The Holy Spirit, we know, gifts us with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.
- Galatians and Matthew remind us that, "We live by the Spirit, ...we walk by the Spirit."
- The Holy Spirit was poured out on the apostles and the Church.
- "I believe in the Holy Spirit..."
- The word, *spirit*, translates from the Hebrew, *ruah*, meaning breath, air, wind.
- The Holy Spirit is the Paraclete, the consoler.
- Symbols Of the Holy Spirit include, water, fire, cloud, light and shadow, the hand of Jesus, the finger of God, and the dove.

Ponder the grace and divinity of the Holy Spirit in your catechism.

"Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

The chief priests and elders listening to Jesus must have been furious. After telling the parable about the tenants who abused the owner's property and killed his son, Jesus had a tough lesson to teach. He compared the Jewish leaders to these terrible tenants. They, like the selfish workers in the vineyard, were guilty of not respecting proper authority and of trying to seize control --not of grapes, in this case, but of religious matters. In short, they were not bearing fruit for God's kingdom, but only for their own prestige and privilege.

Before we spend too much time criticizing them, however, we would do well to examine ourselves. If Jesus were standing in our midst right now, would he have a similar warning for us? We may not be religious leaders, but we are like those tenants in many ways because we have been made stewards of the gifts of God. We receive his help and grace through the sacraments, for example. Are we good stewards of this grace, or do we take it for granted and fail to nourish it to produce good fruit?

And what about the personal gifts that God has entrusted to each of us? We all have certain skills, talents, experiences, and opportunities thanks to God's work in our lives. Do we make the most of these things or do we settle for the easy road? Do we thank God for them or consider them to be our own?

God has trusted us with a place in the world, HIS world. He is the ultimate authority here and all things we enjoy come from his hands. May we have the humility and gratitude to use his gifts for his glory and not just our own.




