Sunday School

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them? Would you like them to be familiar with favorite old and new testament bible stories? Would you like them to know basic Catholic prayers, but also to feel comfortable just talking to God in their own words? Do you wish there was a way for a preschool aged child to understand the message in the gospel reading?



The answer to your questions is Sunday School! Our Sunday School program helps the 3, 4, 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year old child build a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the gifts He has given us. Our developmentally appropriate lessons are based on the gospel stories for each week. Each week the lesson is sent home so that you may go over it again within the family setting. The children are provided a binder for the lesson sheets, thereby creating a bible storybook to have at home. There is also a special book about Catholic faith traditions and practices that is sent home at the end of the year.

At Sunday School, children meet other children, play games, sing songs, learn prayers and bible stories and engage in creative activities that enhance the lesson. They have a simple snack and some special celebrations. Sunday school participates in the Mass at Thanksgiving and Christmas and may also have the opportunity for small community service projects. Parents have the opportunity to participate in various ways, but can also enjoy Mass knowing their children are safe and happy engaging in a faith experience created just for them.

Sunday school begins October 1st and continues to May 6th and is held in the preschool classrooms. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty trained and 3 years old by Sept. 1st.

It's not too late to enroll; we have a limited number of spaces available 8 and 10 am.



Speaking of eternity, another theme is that we get to be with our loved ones; parents, grandparents, brothers, sisters, cousins, aunts and uncles, etc., and even children and grandchildren, etc., eventually.

But, Isaiah in 65:17-21, said, "*I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the things of the past shall not be remembered or come to mind*". How are we to understand that, do we not bring our memories with us, good and bad?

And, what are we supposed to be doing in Heaven? Maybe it's not about doing. We all seem to be consumed with the "doing" part here on Earth but maybe in Heaven it's different.

And what about sports? In sporting games here on Earth we have winners and losers. The winners feel happy and the losers do not. So, in Heaven we shouldn't have any losers, right? Do we not have games then?

Maybe we get to explore the Universe (or universes). Some scientists have said that maybe our Universe is infinite (or essentially infinite) in that part of it, and maybe the large part of it, is beyond our observation, ever!

Well maybe in Heaven we will get to explore the "infinite" universe -- that should take up the span of eternity. And what about other life in the Universe? With respect to Heaven then, I think I would like to take an introductory course when I first get there.

Gospel Reflection

"My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?"

Today's Gospel parable is unsettling in several ways. The various images of rejection, mistreatment, and violence paint an unpleasant picture. Guests refuse to come to a feast, servants are killed, troops are dispatched. The King continues to try to fill his dinner hall, and then when someone finally does show up, the King throws him out for wearing the wrong clothes. What is going on here?

The message would have been a poignant one for his Jewish listeners. As the chosen people, they were the first to receive the "invitation" to share in the kingdom of God. But the chief priests and elders were uninterested in accepting Jesus and his authority; thus they didn't show up for the feast.

But what about those who did come? Something is expected of them as well. Donning a "wedding garment" is like being properly prepared to enter God's kingdom.

Just showing up isn't enough.

Here it's important to pay attention to the details. The King first calls his poorly dressed guest "friend." The approach begins with mercy and kindness.

But the man gives no defense for himself, and displays no desire to change. It's as if he doesn't really care to be there at all.

The question this raises for us is whether or not we are "dressed" appropriately. We may hang around the banquet hall--going to church, professing to be Christian --but are we sincere guests of the King of kings?

Do we truly accept Christ's teachings and live by them, or are we just showing up?

The splendors of the invitation Christ gives us should not be taken for granted. We are called to share in a royal feast. May we all be grateful guests.


