Special Women's Guild Meeting

Eighty-four children were rescued and 120 suspected traffickers were arrested in October by the FBI as part of a nationwide effort to clamp down on the sex trafficking of minors.

Fifty-five FBI field offices and partners in Canada, the United Kingdom, Thailand, Cambodia and the Philippines were involved.

The average age of the victims was fifteen; a three month old and five yr. old were being sold for \$600.

"Child sex trafficking is happening in every community across America," said John Clark, president and CEO of the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, and local police agree. This includes Southern California and the South Bay. Most victims are U.S. citizens.

What are people of faith and good conscience to do about this crisis against our youth?

The first step is to become informed. Come to the **Women's Guild meeting on Wed., Jan. 10th at 7 pm.** Susan Patterson will be speaking in Kavanagh Hall about Human Trafficking, including the scope of the problem, what parishes can do to fight trafficking and other vital information. Susan wrote *How You Can Fight Human Trafficking: Over 100 Ways to Make a Difference*, and comes recommended by the Los Angeles Archdiocese Office of Life, Justice and Peace.

empty. I write, but my words sound cliché. I ask God questions, but I don't hear answers. I could try to act like I am always so spiritually refreshed and thriving in my relationship with God. But that wouldn't be honest. That wouldn't be me.

Does your faith journey ever have these desert seasons? I think one of the greatest challenges in actively living out a relationship with Christ on earth is to avoid the trap of simply going through the motions. I know what a "Christian" should say. I know how to act. I know how to put up a spiritual front, even if I'm not passionately seeking God.

That's why I wrote this song. I was frustrated and tired of that constant settling for a stale faith. God is a God of passion. His true plan for our lives is anything but boring. Every day, the God of adventure beckons his sons and daughters to quit going through the motions and walk into a life filled with passion and wonder.

The last line of the chorus strikes me every time I sing it:

*I don't wanna spend my whole life asking
What if I had given everything
Instead of going through the motions?*

My surgery and silence really brought this song to life for me. Trials force movement. Pain makes you feel. I'm thankful for the difficult time I had to go through, because God used it to remind me that going through the motions is not really living.



Gospel Reflection

"But the man who received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and buried his master's money."

This servant was scared. He didn't want to take any risks and just wanted to play everything safe. As he confesses to his master, "Out of fear I went off and buried your talent in the ground." And the master was not pleased. The other servants who invested the money he gave them were richly rewarded for their efforts to produce more. But this servant was punished for letting his fear rule the day.

What factors are keeping us from making a return on God's investment in us? He has given us all life, and each of us also has a special collection of "talents" to make use of. We have certain gifts, skills, experiences, resources, and abilities that (though we may not often think about it) come from God. He calls us to make the most of these things, not just to take them for granted or bury them in the ground, so to speak.

Our gifts are meant not just for our own enjoyment, but to help others, to spread truth and goodness and beauty to the world around us.

Sometimes, however, we fail to really capitalize on our potential. Laziness, distraction, or self-pity can get in the way if we are unwilling to put in the hard work to improve our natural gifts, if we allow ourselves to zone out with entertainment or frivolous pastimes instead of making good use of the time entrusted to us, or if we wallow in negativity by focusing on what we don't have instead of embracing what we do.

Each moment is a gift from God. May we seize every opportunity to multiply the investment God has made in us so that we may be worthy to hear God tell us, "Well done, my good and faithful servant."


