Retirement Fund for Religious—Dec. 10

Across the United States, hundreds of religious communities lack financial resources sufficient to meet the retirement and health-care needs of aging members.

Currently, the average annual cost of care for women and men religious past age 70 is \$42,344 per person. Skilled care can reach more than \$63,000. The total cost of care for senior women and men religious in the United States has exceeded \$1 billion annually for each of the last nine years.

The vast majority of donations are distributed as Direct Care Assistance. This is a per capita distribution based on specified criteria, including level of need.

Religious communities may apply annually for these funds, which can be used to help meet such immediate costs as nursing care and medications and which can be saved for long-term retirement needs. Additional funding is allocated throughout the year for communities with the greatest needs and for retirement education and programming.

During the early and mid-twentieth centuries, the Church in the US experienced a surge in vocations to religious life. Care for elderly members was provided largely by younger ones. Over time, however, the number of vocations decreased while lifespans increased.

Gospel Reflection

"People of the whole Judean countryside and all the inhabitants of Jerusalem were going out to him." John the Baptist commanded quite a crowd.

What was the attraction? Was it his unusual appearance -clothed in camel's hair? Perhaps it was his bizarre eating habits-feeding on locusts and wild honey. Or maybe people were captivated by the Baptist's remarkable humility in the face of such huge popularity-"I am not worthy."

Unlike our modern fascination with standing in the presence of superstars, the crowds who flocked to John weren't looking for a thrill. They weren't lining up for autographs. They were lining up for baptism. And they were acknowledging their sins at the same time. John was proclaiming "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins." And people came because they were longing to experience the freedom of that forgiveness.

John called them to conversion. To convert means to turn, in this case to turn away from sin. And the crowds were anxious to do so in order to "prepare the way of the Lord." For these first-century Jews, the imminent approach of the Messiah came with a call for conversion and they took this call very seriously.

Now, for us, as twenty-first century Christians, the Church, like John the Baptist, calls us to prepare and repent during this season of Advent.

Will we take the call seriously? Will we examine the areas of our lives that need to change? Will we pray for God's help to overcome our habitual sin and to make choices based on generosity instead of selfishness?

Now is the time to heed the message. Now is the time to "prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."



Those timeless words beautifully evoke a giving God whose gifts are good and perfect, coming down from the father of lights from whom there is, "...no change, nor shadow of alteration." Isn't this Kelly book all about how we can change?

A: Yes, change. You and me. We know that God's ways are far above our ways, and Kelly describes his book as an attempt to fulfill our desire for connection and union with our immutable, loving, and perfect God. He says his book is about the psychology of change, the dynamics of change that we desire, but that so often eludes us.

Kelly writes in practical, relatable language with topics ranging from losing weight, to savings plans, to relationships, to progressing toward true, transformative, sustainable change in our lives. We seek to become the best versions of ourselves, to make progress toward a goal.

Kelly states that God has a dream for each of us, and that the Holy Spirit is inspiring us, each day, with good things.
