

Catholic Q & A



Q: Belief. *The Catechism Of The Catholic Church* is, by way of instruction ,(the word catechism means instruction), "...a complete summary of what Catholics throughout the world **believe...**" For example, the catechism states, " He who *believes* in Christ has new life in the Holy Spirit. The moral life, increased and brought to maturity in grace, is to reach its fulfillment in the glory of heaven." These words come on the page of the catechism just before the Beatitudes, which are at the heart of Jesus' preaching. "Blessed are they...". The words of the beatitudes depict our personal vocation, our *beliefs*, our aspirations drawing us to heaven. What does Matthew Kelly say about our *beliefs* in his book, *Perfectly Yourself*?

A: Chapter five in his book is called, What Do You Believe? It's an insightful section that describes the enormously vital role that beliefs play in our happiness and in our unhappiness. He asks if we are aligning our actions with our beliefs. Read Chapter Four in Kelly. Read about the Beatitudes in Part Three, Article 2 of your catechism. As the words of the Beatitudes say, "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven." Believe it?

Gospel Reflection

"Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

What a wonderful example the Magi give us in their visit to the infant Jesus. First of all, they demonstrate profound faith in God's word, spoken through the prophet Micah: "And you, Bethlehem ... from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel" (cf. 5:2). Embarking on a long and difficult journey, they trust that they will find this newborn king of the Jews in Bethlehem as the prophecy announced.

On their arrival at the home of the Holy Family, the Magi also give us an example of profound humility. These important men, to whom kings look for guidance and advice, do not hesitate to bow down, to "prostrate themselves" and give homage to a tiny babe. Putting their own position out of their minds, they reverently worship the infant Lord even as he sits on the lap of his mother.

The generosity of these three "kings" is also evident as they open their treasure boxes and give to the poor child the richest of gifts. Traditionally, we understand the gold to symbolize the earthly kingship of Christ, the frankincense to represent his divinity, and the myrrh to stand as a symbol of the anointing he will receive upon his death. Finally, the wisdom of these men is evident in their decision to return to their country "by another way." Understanding the threat that King Herod posed to Jesus, they followed a plan that would help keep the divine child safe even though it meant inconvenience to themselves.

Faith, humility, generosity, and wisdom. These gifts are the real legacy of the Three Kings. Today, let us ask God for the blessing of having these gifts in our lives.

Romans 11:33-36

How deep are the riches and the wisdom and the knowledge of God!

How inscrutable his judgments, how unsearchable his ways! For "who has known the mind of the Lord?

Or who has been his counselor? Who has given him anything so as to deserve return?" For from him and through him and for him all things are. To him be glory forever. Amen.



Dear Habitat for Humanity Home Repair,

From myself and everyone in my family: Thank You. There are simply not enough words or ways to express our full gratitude to your organization. The Home Repair Program didn't merely fix some plumbing, paint and install fixtures; no, you repaired and gave us back our home.

Next month it will be the second year anniversary of my mother, Alma Carrasco's death. She lost her nearly 8 year battle of Ovarian Cancer. My mother was nothing short of wonderful and amazing. She was a school volunteer for over 20 years. In her fight with cancer, she hated asking for help. She was always a giver and thought of others before herself. It's one of the many reasons why we didn't reach out to Habitat until things had gotten worse.

Our house has always had its problems: not enough space for a 6 member family, leaky roof, couldn't run too many appliances at once, and so on. Within the last couple of years it only got worse. We got a citation for the unpermitted back rooms of the house, the roof came down in our living room, the bathtub had cracked and so water was leaking out from underneath, and then the kitchen sink became unusable as those pipes had started to disintegrate and leak out as well. It felt like, as soon as one bad thing happened, the house would only get worse and worse. We tried to repair and restore what we could, but we simply couldn't catch up. My mother's death took an emotional, mental, physical, and financial toll on our family. I had quit my job to take care of my mother and my three younger brothers. My dad had to take off time from work and so we were struggling financially. We tried for so long to get by and work around the house problems.

But thanks to the Home Repair Program, we have our house back, a fresh start. We have a new garage door, a beautiful paint job on the house and garage, an entirely new working bathroom, a functional kitchen sink and new cabinets. Call me crazy, but I don't actually mind washing dishes now that I'm actually able to again. Sometimes people take the little things for granted, like being able to take a bath in your own home. My family and I are forever grateful. Thanks to your organization, I can take care of my family without worrying what new disaster will befall the house. That's security I wasn't sure we'd have for the longest time.


