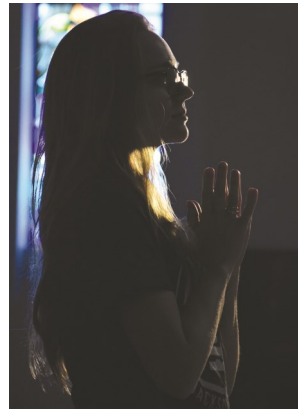

Cost Saving LED lights in Parish Office

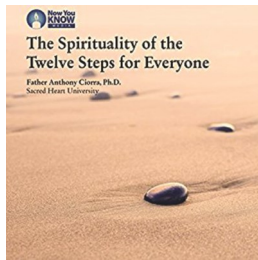

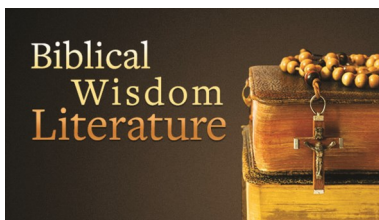

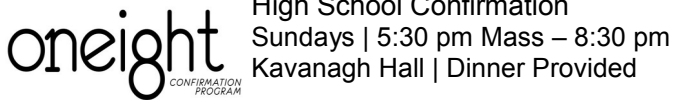

Catholic Q & A

Q On Jan.17, the Holy Father gave a speech to young people that touched on subjects that included sermons, the catechism, and the subsequent actions which our faith should bring out in each of us. The Pontiff put forth a central theme that called on each person to become a protagonist, striving to "...translate Jesus into life." How can the saving, ever-living and life-giving Sacraments spark the kind of action of mission that Pope Francis described?

A: Well, we know that our Priests and Deacon always encourage St. James Parishioners to take the message of the scriptures, the sacrifice and celebration of the Mass, the grace of the sacraments of Christ, and the example of the Trinity, beyond Sunday as we internalize, put into action, and live our faith daily. "...loving and serving one another."

Another avenue that leads to a Christ-like living faith leads us, always, to the sacraments. They seal, signify, nourish, strengthen, and express this faith just as Pope Francis encourages. He calls us to "...do what Jesus would do...wherever you are." The catechism describes the sacramental mission to baptize as a dialogue that expresses and develops the communion of faith. Our St. James Choir reminds us, in song, that the baptized have, "Put On Christ." Read about the sacraments in The Catechism Of The Catholic Church. Perhaps start with Baptism. This rich, grace-filled, saving power of faith is well represented with just over 100 paragraphs cited.

Have a faith-rich week of expressive Catholic action wherever you go, as you put on Christ.

Gospel Reflection

How are your Lenten resolutions?

By the time week two rolls around, plenty of well-meaning people have skipped, neglected, or outright forgotten their Lenten resolutions at least once. It can be easy to start excusing our Lenten commitments altogether.

Last week we saw Jesus driven into the desert. This Sunday, we see Jesus leading his disciples to an equally barren place: he "led them up a high mountain apart by themselves." But what happens there? "And he was transfigured before them and his clothes became dazzling white." Today's Gospel reminds us of the goal.



We don't enter into the desert for the sake of suffering, but for the sake of transformation.

Mountain imagery is prevalent throughout Scripture. The sacrifice of Isaac, Moses receiving the 10 Commandments, Elijah's revelation of God as a tiny whispering sound: all these occur on the mountaintop. Mountains are strenuous to hike. To assist the traveler in the ascent, trails often involve switchbacks. These lead the traveler back and forth across the mountainside, sometimes appearing as if hardly any ground is gained. Perhaps Peter, James, and John hiked a similar path as Jesus led them up the side of Mount Tabor.

A climb is difficult. A climb in a barren place leaves you thirsty, exhausted, and quite possibly frustrated or discouraged. Yet this is precisely how Jesus leads his closest disciples. Why? Because he has something to reveal to them. Practically speaking, Jesus needed to bring Peter, James and John away from the crowds for this revelation of glory to remain hidden. There are spiritual truths we will encounter only if we pass through difficulty. So let's persevere this Lent! Today's Gospel invites us to trust that, if we persevere in following Jesus, he'll lead us to something beautiful and glorious as well.

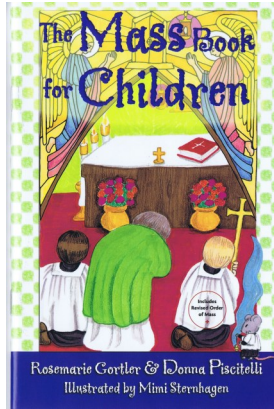

It's Not Fair

We stand at the threshold of Lent – the season on the church calendar in which we prepare to celebrate the greatest injustice in human history. Yes, you read that correctly – the crucifixion of Jesus Christ is the greatest injustice in human history. It is the only truly innocent man history has ever seen being punished for the guilt of every other person that has ever been or will ever be. Really, seriously, can you think of anything more unjust?

We live in a world consumed with justice – with trying to figure out what it is and how to obtain it. Secular definitions focus on equitable application of the law, reason and morality. Biblical studies start there, but expand the definition to include caring for the poor and otherwise limited. “Social justice warriors” of recent times warp the Biblical definition away from generosity and towards punishment of the successful and accomplished, failing to understand that justice is as much about character as it is about social structures. We all have legitimate claims to injustice – some very severe, some far less so. I know people serving life sentences for crimes that as best as I can tell they did not commit. I also know people in homes they own with multiple vehicles and huge entertainment centers that scream injustice because someone down the street has more vehicles and a bigger, better equipped home theater. They each have a claim to having been done injustice but let's be honest, we're going to listen to one of them a lot more than the other.

In this morning's *Jolt*, Jim Geraghty looks at a book about personal responsibility and says:

You have to decide how you want to change your life to get better results, and you have to stop blaming anyone else — not bosses, not parents, not “luck” or fate or God. You have to start looking at your problems as potential opportunities and you have to refocus your perspective on how you've been blessed, not how you've been cheated, hurt, shortchanged, or denied. That's incredibly powerful. Far more than you might think.

Which brings me back to that greatest of injustices. The victim thereof was not caught by surprise; He knew what was coming. As the injustice approached, He prayed that it would pass by and leave him unharmed. But He knew it could not so He prayed: *“Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done.”* In the end it was not just that Jesus suffered injustice, He submitted to it – willingly and knowingly. He focused on the good, not the bad.

This Lenten season I will not give up sweets, or booze, or something that is in the end really trivial. This Lenten season I am going to give up my grudges, my hurts, my sense of personal aggrievement. I am deeply and fully blessed – that's what I need to focus on. 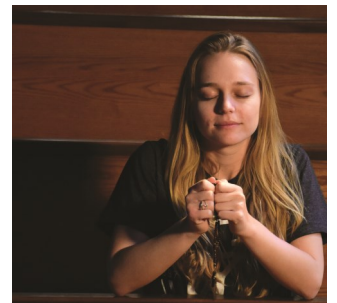
