Confirmation in the Courtyard

Many people think of the laying on of hands, which signifies the descent of the Holy Spirit, as the central act in the sacrament of confirmation.

The essential element is the anointing of the person being confirmed with chrism.

Chrism is an aromatic oil that has been consecrated by a bishop during the Chrism Mass on Holy Thursday.

The anointing is accompanied by the words "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit"

Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends and Families of Saint James.

Sunday Masses

It was so moving last Sunday when one of our parishioners came up to me before the 10 am Mass on our St. James School field and said, "Father, I was just crying for joy this morning thinking that I was going to be able to go to Mass again and receive Communion after all these months."

It has been a labor of love for Fr. Emmanuel and me as we have done much of the work in getting the canopies up on the field because it is so important to us that our community can gather again. Deacon Bob & Patty Miller, Deacon Mark & Louise Ramirez, Rob Blee and Rick Page were all instrumental as well. Attendance was modest for the first Sunday at the 10am and Noon Masses, but very good for giving only 2 day's notice to everyone. We will be adding additional canopies on the field to accommodate the growing attendance each week.

If you're coming for the first time, please remember to bring your own beach chair, sunglasses and hat as later in the morning the sun does come out. The one common comment I hear is how much everyone enjoys the experience of being outdoors to celebrate Mass, and our young families have appreciated the open space for their children. We hope you take advantage of our new Mass Schedule on Sundays: 8 am, 10 am and Noon at St. James School, 20559 Anza (at Garnet St., Torrance)

Capital Campaign and Parish Finances

COVID paused us from completing the parish-wide pledge campaign of our \$5 million goal to help pay for the new property we purchased last year, but we thank those who are making pledges now and so many of you who are continuing to pay on your pledge commitments. When the campaign paused, we had 374 families who have pledged \$3,607,000 and to date we have received payment of \$963,000 on those 5-year pledges. I am confident that when we are able to get back to 'normal' we will reach our goal for the campaign. We have been utilizing the courtyard area of the property to celebrate our 8am Daily Mass as well as all our Baptisms, 1st Communions, Confirmations, Weddings, Funerals and Confessions.

We are just finalizing our financial report for 2019-2020. Looking at our Ordinary Income and Expenses, our income for the year was \$1,201,000 and expenses were \$1,294,000 for a loss of \$93,000. There were further costs of \$44,000 on which payment has been postponed to January, but which bring the actual deficit to \$137,000. St. James qualified for critical financial assistance from the Federal Small Business PPP Loans (Payroll Protection Plan) for \$139,500 which we received in May and which brought us even for the year.

The outlook for 2020-2021, with our reduced services and income so far looks similar to this past year, with a loss of about \$140,000. We are trying to do everything we can to limit our expenses, but with reduced support from parishioners, our loss of normal income is our biggest challenge. The parish offices continue to stay very active taking care of the ministries we have and responding to the continual changes brought about by the pandemic.

The financial challenges we face are the same for many of our families and know that you are in our prayers constantly.

Q: The Saint James Choir sings a song that embraces a spirit of thankfulness to God, a spirit of gratitude most vital these days when we may feel that in this particular year we are being "twenty-twentied" on all sides as never before.

Composer Bob Hurd's "Blessing Cup" draws on Psalm 116 where we read about gratitude to God, here in a musical setting: "...we give you thanks and bless your name."

How does our Catholic faith, expressed by scripture, communion, catechism, as well as in song highlight the direction and the grace of a thankful heart in all times and in all circumstances?

A: In scripture, Luke 17 takes us to the dusty roads between Samaria and Galilee for the cleansing of ten lepers. The lone Samaritan healed, fell at the feet of Jesus in thanks. The concordance on this passage describes the incident as testimony to faith and salvation.

Faith and salvation are taught in the catechism, along with gratitude: "Faith in God's love encompasses the call and the obligation to respond with sincere love to divine charity. Ingratitude fails or refuses to acknowledge divine charity."

Our liturgy in song: "We will take the cup of life, and call upon God's name."

May we, especially in these times of challenge and uncertainty, strive to discern that divine charity and recall with true gratitude those holy words:

"Stand up and go, your faith has saved you."
