Congratulations to Deacon César Guardado, ordained a Transitional Deacon last Saturday at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels with 7 other young men for the Archdiocese. César served at St. James for his Pastoral Intern year from the seminary during 2018-2019. The ordinations were pandemic-delayed twice: from May, then August and finally October.



César is currently completing his last year of studies at St. John's Seminary in Camarillo. The plan is that he will be ordained a Priest for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles at the end of the school year, next May.

I had an opportunity to visit with him 3 weeks ago in Camarillo. While the campus remains closed to outside visitors (even me) during the pandemic, we spent the afternoon at an extended lunch. I am so impressed with him. He is so well educated not only in theology, but in all fields of history, sociology, psychology and beyond. His heart is very pastoral and even-tempered with a real care for the Church and the Gospel.



He expressed again his appreciation for the opportunity he had to spend a year in ministry at St. James, a parish very different from other parishes he had experienced. Sunday School

Would you like your children to learn about God's love for them? Would you like them to be familiar with favorite Old and New Testament bible stories? Would you like them to know basic Catholic prayers, but also to feel comfortable just talking to God in their own words? Do you wish there was a way for a preschool aged child to understand the message in the gospel reading?

The answer to your questions is Sunday School! Our Sunday School program helps the 3, 4, 5 & 6 (kindergarten) year old child build a foundation of faith by helping them to know God through the gifts He has given us. Our developmentally appropriate lessons are based on the gospel stories for each week. Sunday school begins October 4th and continues to May 2nd. To be eligible for Sunday School, children must be potty trained and 3 years old by Sept. 1st.

For the 20-21 school year, we will be offering Sunday School virtually. Lesson content, activity pages and a link for a virtual lesson with a teacher and additional resources will be emailed to enrolled families. In the event we are able to offer traditional classes during mass at some point during the year, families will be given the option to attend in person or continue to receive lessons virtually.

Gospel Meditation

Nobody enjoys paying taxes. Despite our displeasure in being forced to do so, we also realize that the monies generated from taxes allows governments to provide essential services for its people. Corruption really gets our goat, however. When we witness malfeasance, overspending, irresponsibility, and dishonesty in governmental spending, the grave injustices make an already unpleasant and arduous task even more difficult. The inappropriate distribution and use of hard-earned monies can leave a person quite angry and disconnected. It's bad enough the government wants something from me, now God does, too?

God is not concerned necessarily with our money, although its proper use does factor into our faith life. As the payment of secular taxes speaks of our allegiance to the government, our return to God speaks of our allegiance to God. All of creation, even the entire universe, is fashioned in the image and likeness of God. What speaks to God and has meaning and relevance to him? All of creation and indeed our very selves! God delights in us and when we present ourselves back to him, he delights even more! As the payment of secular taxes is designed to secure the equitable distribution of goods and services to all people, so is our return of ourselves to God in gratitude meant to advance God's kingdom here on earth.

When our exclusive and sincere allegiance is given to God, God can use us to set things right and straight again. The wounds of sin distort our relationship and disorder our world. By giving ourselves and all of creation back to God in gratitude, we acknowledge the proper Creator and Author of life for who He is and devote our labors exclusively to God's kingdom and the justice, peace, or order God envisions. In giving back to God all that belongs to God, we set the axis of our lives correctly and put our priorities in proper order. All of our relationships, especially with God, our brothers and sisters, and all of creation are perceived more clearly as they really are. Using, accumulating, wasting, exploiting, hoarding, and self-preservation are no longer necessary.

Archbishop Gomez: Fundamental Injustices in our Society

"There are indeed 'lesser' evils. But that means there are also 'greater' evils — evils that are more serious than others and even some evils that are so grave that Christians are called to address them as a primary duty.

Among the evils and injustices in American life in 2016, abortion and euthanasia are different and stand alone. Each is a direct, personal attack on innocent and vulnerable human life. Abortion and euthanasia function in our society as what the Catechism of the Catholic Church calls 'structures of sin' or 'social sins.'

That is why any approach that essentially tolerates abortion and euthanasia, or puts these issues on a par with others, not only betrays the beautiful vision of the Church's social teaching, but also weakens the credibility of the Church's witness in our society.

So, in this culture, the Church must insist that abortion and euthanasia are grave and intrinsic evils — evils that are corrosive and corrupting, evils that are at the heart of other social injustices.

Abortion and euthanasia are 'fundamental' social issues, because if the child in the womb has no right to be born, if the sick and the old have no right to be taken care of, then there is no solid foundation to defend anyone's human rights, and no foundation for peace and justice in society."

Faithful Citizenship

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a comprehensive voter education guide entitled, **Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility from the Catholic Bishops of the United States.**

Originally adopted in 2007 by an overwhelming majority of bishops, it is updated with a new introductory letter as each national election approaches to highlight contemporary issues that warrant special attention.

In the new introductory letter that was approved by the full body of bishops at our November 2019 General Meeting, there is this key statement:

“The threat of abortion remains our preeminent priority because it directly attacks life itself...”

Faithful citizenship tells us that equally sacred are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection. We cannot dismiss or ignore other serious threats to human life and dignity such as racism, the environmental crisis, poverty and the death penalty as well as legislation regarding immigration, care for the poor, and health care reform.




