This year, while **All Souls Day** is Monday, November 2nd, at the Noon Mass on November 1st, we will remember and pray for all of those who have died during the last year, especially the members of our parish who have been called home to the Lord. Their names are honored on the next page. It will also be a Mass for all of us to remember in prayer those members of our families and friends who have died during the last year. At this Mass you are invited to place their names in a special basket that will be presented during the Mass.

All Souls envelopes are locate on the table at the entrance of the St. James School field during the 8, 10 and noon Masses. Return them in the collection basket or bring them to the Parish office and y our deceased loved one's names will be placed on the altar and included in our All Souls' Masses throughout November.

Parish Annual Financial Report

The Annual Financial Report for the parish for 2019-2020 fiscal year is printed on page 4 of this bulletin. A major concern for us is that our ordinary income from Sundays and Holy Days and sacraments was \$96,000 less than our expenses. The loss would have been greater but the Finance Council decided to limit the amount of assistance we could give to our sister parish in Los Angeles, San Miguel Church and School and some other charities we normally support. The report also includes a footnote regarding the assistance we received from the federal PPP (Payroll Protection Plan) Loan.

For the current year, (July—September, our income is \$18,000 less than our expenses. The effect of our parish being closed during the pandemic has been a substantial reduction of our Sunday Collection. We have managed so far to reduce our expenses by 15% from our projected budget and we continue to make every effort to manage well the operations of the parish. We are so thankful for all who continue to support the parish in this difficult time.

All Souls' Day

According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go.

Purgatory is necessary so that souls can be cleansed and perfected before they enter into heaven. There is scriptural basis for this belief. The primary reference is in 2 Maccabees, 12:42 and 12:46"Turning to supplication, they prayed that the sinful deed might be fully blotted out... Thus made atonement for the dead that they might be free from sin."

Additional references are found in Zechariah, Sirach, and the Gospel of Matthew. Jewish tradition also reinforces this belief as well as the tradition and teaching of the Church, which has been affirmed throughout history.

Consistent with these teachings and traditions, Catholics believe that through the prayers of the faithful on Earth, the dead are cleansed of their sins so they may enter into heaven

The official name of the celebration in the Roman Rite liturgy of the Roman Catholic Church is "The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed".
