Pastor's Corner

Pandemic Restrictions for Churches

This past week the Council of Priests met with the Archbishop and one of the topics we covered was the pandemic and our stay-outside orders.

Several of the deans, myself included, shared with the Archbishop the difficulty of continuing to be outside as the weather is getting colder and the rainy season is beginning. The archbishop explained that he is frequently in contact with the County Board of Supervisors and the County Health Department trying to get the restrictions lifted so we can return into our churches.

He explains all the safety protocols we have initiated and maintain for the safety of our parishioners, but they will not listen or consider a change in policy for churches at this time. We encouraged the archbishop to continue pursuing the County for a policy change as our parishes need to return into our churches.

The County has been aggressive in pursuing churches that do meet inside, levying hefty fines for those who continue. Monday's L.A. Times featured the active battle between the County and Grace Community Church and the \$350,000 in fines they have received.

For now the Archbishop asks us to continue following the State and County guidelines, which we will.

However, as situations arise such as rain or extreme cold, please check the parish website for any last minute details for Sunday Masses. The wind that destroyed many of the canopies of our churches (and restaurants, etc.) last weekend reminded us all how much we miss being in the church and how much we miss being at home in our church.



We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust serve no purpose in God's kingdom. They benefit neither the person nor God. What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, becoming attentive to systems and ideologies that hurt and oppress people, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely. If persistent, alert and attentive, then life will gradually improve around us, there will be greater peace and we will experience joy.

In 2015, Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted issued a challenge to the men of his diocese—to step into the breach.

His exhortation, Into the Breach: An Apostolic Exhortation to Catholic Men, identifies the crisis of faith facing the Church today and presents a vision of the role of Catholic men in combating it.
