# Pastor's Corner

## Pandemic Restrictions for Churches

This past week the Council of Priests met with the Archbishop and one of the topics we covered was the pandemic and our stay-outside orders.

Several of the deans, myself included, shared with the Archbishop the difficulty of continuing to be outside as the weather is getting colder and the rainy season is beginning. The archbishop explained that he is frequently in contact with the County Board of Supervisors and the County Health Department trying to get the restrictions lifted so we can return into our churches.

He explains all the safety protocols we have initiated and maintain for the safety of our parishioners, but they will not listen or consider a change in policy for churches at this time. We encouraged the archbishop to continue pursuing the County for a policy change as our parishes need to return into our churches.

The County has been aggressive in pursuing churches that do meet inside, levying hefty fines for those who continue. Monday's L.A. Times featured the active battle between the County and Grace Community Church and the \$350,000 in fines they have received.

For now the Archbishop asks us to continue following the State and County guidelines, which we will.

However, as situations arise such as rain or extreme cold, please check the parish website for any last minute details for Sunday Masses. The wind that destroyed many of the canopies of our churches (and restaurants, etc.) last weekend reminded us all how much we miss being in the church and how much we miss being at home in our church.

## Gospel Meditation

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing God's greatest gift of Himself wisely, allows God's kingdom to grow and flourish. Do we have that same confidence in God?

We often go the extra mile and put in the additional effort when it comes to those concerns closest to us: our families, friends, careers, home and securities. But when it comes to things that are not as close to us, we can become lax and less conscientious. Tending to God's treasure requires a great deal of focus and persistent hard work. It demands that I see the bigger picture, God's picture, in which self-sacrifice is a given as we labor for the establishment of God's kingdom, God's vision. Fear and a lack of trust can loom large, however. We are afraid of letting go of what is "mine" and apprehensive of jeopardizing what we have in order to venture into something bigger and more promising.

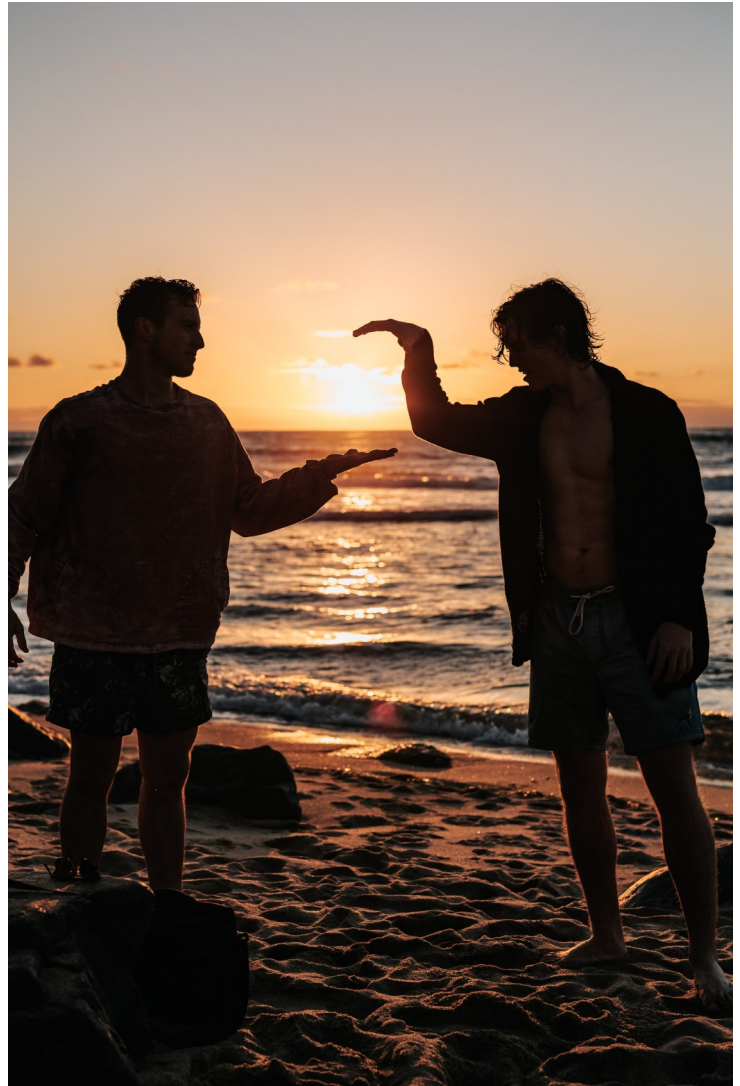
Fear and a lack of trust serve no purpose in God's kingdom. They benefit neither the person nor God. What is required is a courageous resolve that produces the fortitude necessary to stay the course and do what God is asking. Doing all in our power to cultivate the seeds of faith, hope, and love in our world, working diligently to put all of our relationships in proper order, becoming attentive to systems and ideologies that hurt and oppress people, being mindful of injustice, and laboring on behalf of the poor and the needy are at the core of what each of us is asked to do. It is how we invest God's most precious gift wisely. If persistent, alert and attentive, then life will gradually improve around us, there will be greater peace and we will experience joy.

## Into the Breach



In 2015, Bishop Thomas J. Olmsted issued a challenge to the men of his diocese—to step into the breach.

His exhortation, *Into the Breach: An Apostolic Exhortation to Catholic Men*, identifies the crisis of faith facing the Church today and presents a vision of the role of Catholic men in combating it. Inspired by Bishop Olmsted's vision, the Knights of Columbus and the Diocese of Phoenix have joined together to produce a 12-episode video series, also titled *Into the Breach*. Each episode focuses on a different aspect of authentic Catholic masculinity and features interviews with well-known Catholic commentators and follows the personal story of a man whose life illuminates each theme. The series can also be used for individual reflection and a study guide is available. By joining together in brotherhood, men receive the support they need to grow in virtue and to take action to serve Christ and others.

### **Safely store & administer medications for children**

During cold and flu season, many parents give their children a fever reducer, cough syrup, and other medications. These medications can help ease your children's symptoms, but if they're administered or stored improperly, they could put your children at risk. Children are far more susceptible than adults to the effects of medication, because their bodies are smaller and still developing. Even small amounts of drugs can be difficult for them to metabolize, so it's critical to follow your doctor's instructions and to closely monitor children who are old enough to administer their own medication. Make sure medications are stored properly, out of children's reach. 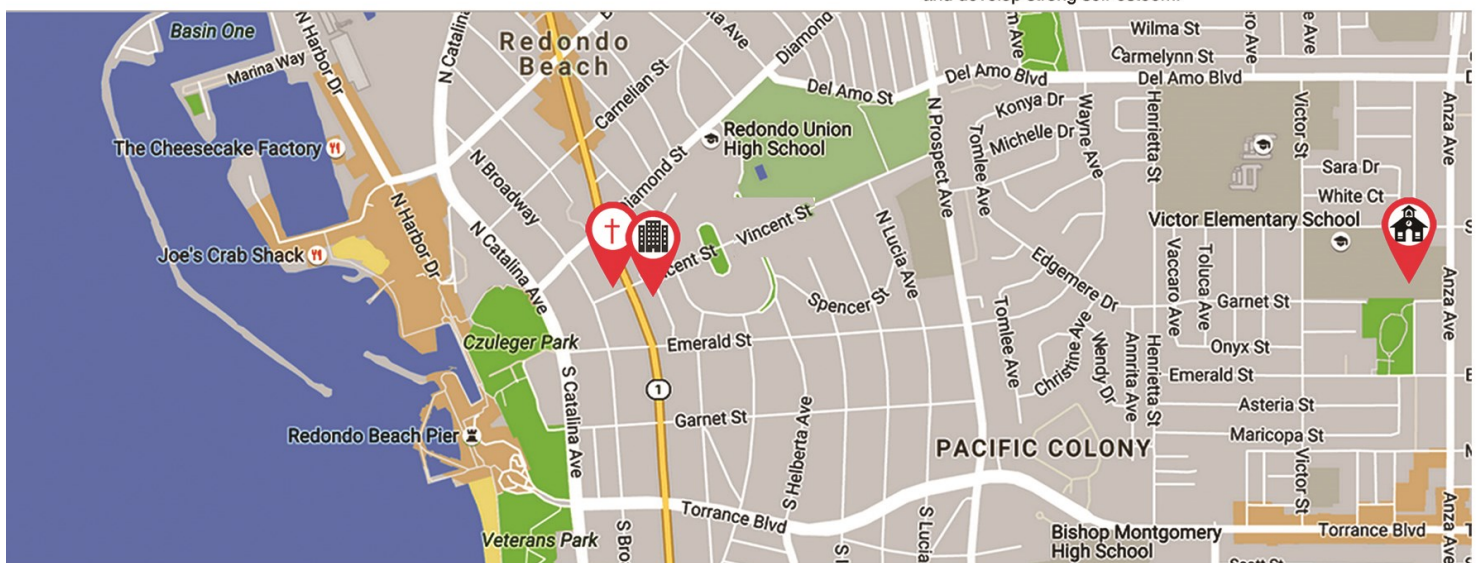
