Just over a year ago, a woman began attending daily Mass with us at Noon. After a few days she shared that her husband was in the hospital at Kaiser in Harbor City and asked if I could anoint him.

It was going to be a busy day already and it would take some time, but I made some changes and went to do the anointing. The Holy Spirit was doing the guiding.

The man I encountered there was not a parishioner, in fact, he lived in Orange County. Together with his family we prayed for him and I gave him the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. That encounter with Christ in his time of need brought great peace to his heart and consolation to his family. Even though his situation did not improve, they were filled with a hope and peace that remained with them even as he died a couple weeks later.

**Q:** How does the *Catechism* define the many aspects of the word, “Church”?

**A:** The *Catechism* has nearly five full pages in the topic index under the heading, “Church”, that list some 350 instructional paragraphs on this subject. The catechism presents the elemental makeup of the Church as a spiritual tapestry of faith, densely woven, with the strands of history and geography held together by the will of God.

Amid the depth and breadth of this fulsome story, Catechism paragraph #845 about the Church is beautifully succinct:

*“To reunite all his children, scattered and led astray by sin, the Father willed to call the whole of humanity together into his Son’s Church. The Church is the world reconciled.”*

Part of that world included the vast empire conquered by Alexander the Great about the year 300 B.C. Among the many states formed was Syria, and a city near the Syrian coast called Antioch, where later, the Church of Antioch became, “the metropolis of Christianity in the east.” The churchgoers there were called Christians.

Born in 344, there was a priest of Antioch, St. John Chrysostom, who’s feast day we mark in January. He later became Bishop of Constantinople. St. John talked about what a Church is in terms of the Mass:

*“We should try to understand that the most productive work in the whole day both for time and eternity is that involved in hearing the Mass.”*

Since the Council of Trent, the Catholic Church has been defined as:

*“...a union of human beings who are united by the profession of the same Christian faith.”*

The Second Vatican Council wrote about the Church:

*“They are the people of God...all who are baptized and profess their faith in Jesus Christ.”*

The Catholic Church, the people of God, the world reconciled.

As we think about our Church, we can pray as St. John Chrysostom did in his always familiar, (and all-inclusive), closing prayer of gratitude:

“Glory be to God for all things.

## Gospel Meditation

If I only knew then what I know now, how different life would be.

This sentiment, expressed in myriad ways, is found on every human being's lips at one point or another. Life may have brought us to a vulnerable place where we see some of the poor choices we made and the effects they are having. Perhaps we fell into some destructive and dysfunctional relationships or behaviors and are finding how they held us captive. Our zeal and passion for life may have drifted away and we are waking up to the reasons apathy has taken hold. Life can be hard. In fact, some would describe their lives as a drudgery. They walk through each day with an anxious unsettledness, wondering when their restlessness will cease. There is a temptation to believe that what I see is all I will get. Mortality and hopelessness await the dawn. If I could only have known what would come in the future, I could have made better choices and avoided all of this misery!

Really? While we can certainly give into weakness, sin, impulsiveness, and idiosyncrasies that cause us to stumble over ourselves, life is really a journey. If we don't make the mistake of wallowing in the mire of self-pity and realize the new life God is calling us to, then there are thrills, adventures, surprises, and soul-searching graces we can surely miss. We are not tethered to our past nor are we bound to the ills life can bring upon us. We are never hopeless or helpless. The problem is that our myopic vision only allows us to see the misery and misfortune that is before us, not the potential that can come from choosing healthier and more life-giving options. Jesus came that we might have fullness of life. We need to learn how to reach for Jesus' hand and let him help us to our feet.

We need to allow God into our pain and heal our past. We have to wrestle with our histories, agonize and search and cry out for the Divine healing we need to restore our faith, hope, and love. Job could not see how his story would end or trust the guidance of the God who called him. We live in that same blindness and suffer from the same lack of confidence. Once we allow ourselves to be touched by God's healing power, we begin to see that all of the pieces of our lives are necessary parts of a greater whole. Along the way of our lives, God uses our omissions and failures to create new things and possibilities. When doors close, others open and we can be amazed by the joyful and unexpected surprises we receive.

Once we know the power of God's creative, healing, life-giving, forgiving, and dynamic presence, it is no wonder we want to put ourselves at the service of others and show them what life can be. ©LPi

## Family Promise Volunteer Coordinator Needed

The mission of Family Promise of the South Bay is to work through local churches to change the lives of homeless families with children by offering temporary shelter, meals, and other assistance as they seek stable housing. Guests stay overnight, on-site at host congregations, such as St. James on a weekly, rotating basis, with each church hosting the families 3 to 4 weeks per year.

A Volunteer Coordinator is needed to manage the program for St. James as a host congregation. The Coordinator takes overall responsibility for ensuring that the host congregation's program runs smoothly.

Currently, due to COVID-19 restrictions the families are staying in a single host location and the Volunteer Coordinator is responsible for organizing and recruiting volunteers to help with grocery and gas gift cards and online donations for the week St. James participates as a remote host.

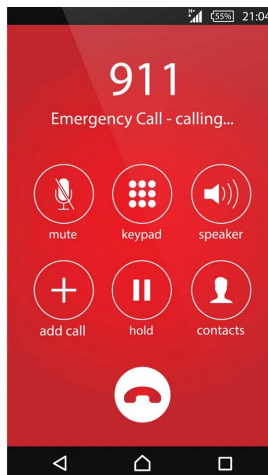

without unlocking the phone.

### Three Guidelines:

- 1. Be Silent.** Don't rattle prayers or silently review stresses. Be still exteriorly and interiorly.
- 2. Be Attentive.** It's not simply a reading hour — reading should be an entry-point to prayer.
- 3. Be Alert.** Sit, stand, or kneel respectfully. Quick tip: If you get sleepy, stand up!

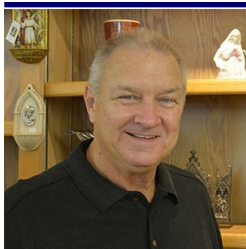

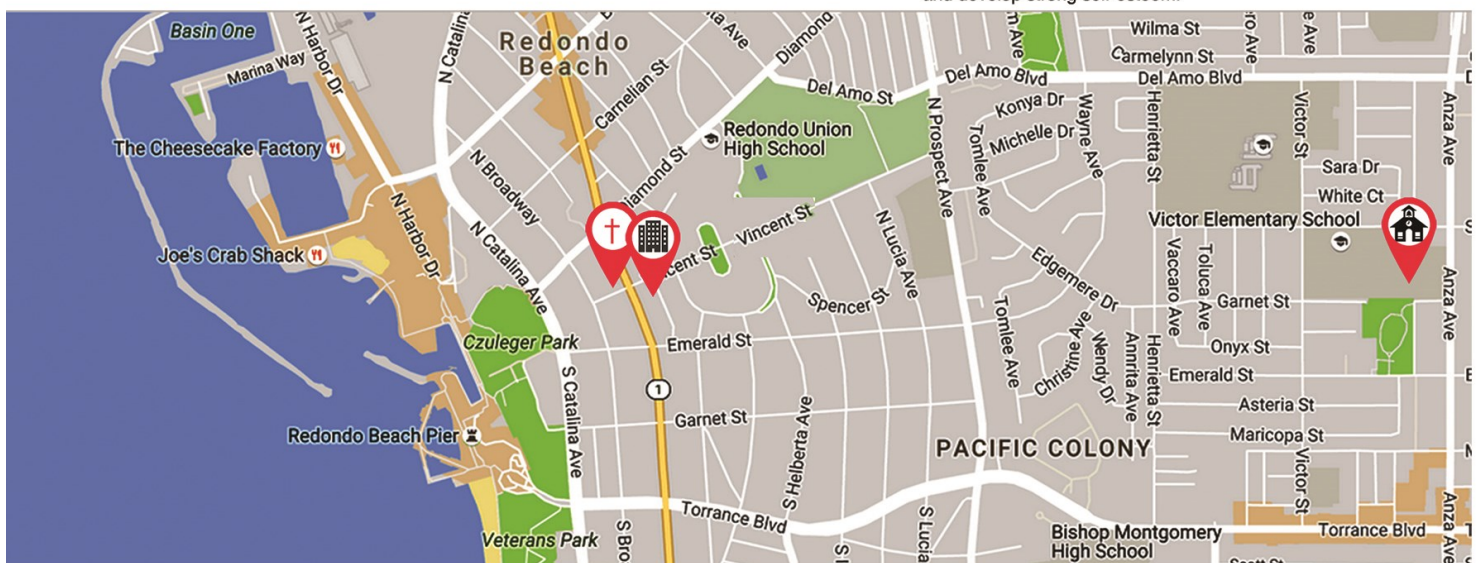
