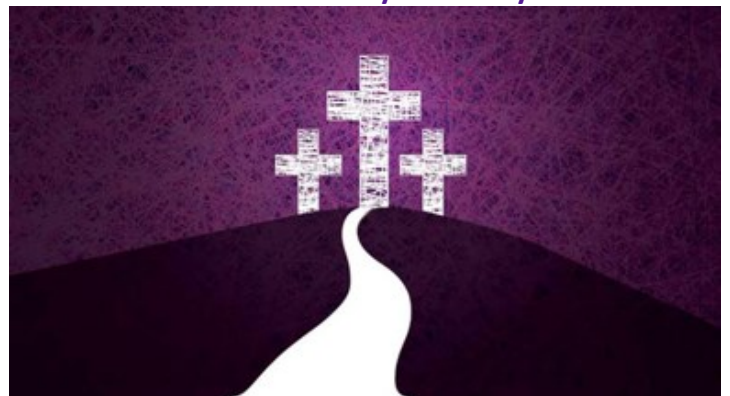

**Q:** As we know, with his Apostolic Letter *Patris Cordi*, Pope Francis proclaimed this as a celebratory “Year of Saint Joseph.”

What does the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tell us about Joseph?

**A:** In a year that seeks to honor St. Joseph, we find that the *Catechism* broadly and also specifically describes the virtues that are to be found in a family, a good spouse, and a father. Yet, the man himself, Joseph, is, in a literary sense, somehow elusive and only fleetingly glimpsed amid those pages; even his name is not listed in the index of the *Catechism*.

Pope Francis acknowledges that in the gospels, while Matthew and Luke, the two evangelists who speak most about the lowly carpenter tell us very little, still the Holy Father cites scripture which presents Joseph with that “*Patris Cordi*”, that “father’s heart.”

“*He was a just man, ever ready to carry out God’s will as revealed to him in the law and through four dreams.*”

And here perhaps is part of the pontiff’s rationale for the Year of Saint Joseph, as phrased by the *Catechism*: “*Christ chose to be born and grow up in the bosom of the holy family of Joseph and Mary.*”

The Church is nothing other than the family of God. In our own time, in a world often alien and even hostile to faith, believing families are of primary importance as centers of living, radiant faith. For this reason the Second Vatican Council, using an ancient expression, calls the family the *Ecclesia domestica*...the first heralds of the faith...”

There are many inspirational prayers consecrating St. Joseph available, yet again we find that elusive factor because while he is the head of that original familial, “domestic church”, finding specific hymns to St. Joseph isn’t easy. Our own *Choral Praise* hymnal does not have a “St. Joseph” section of songs.

Here are two verses from an old hymn composed by the Sisters of Notre Dame of Liverpool, England with sentiments relevant to today’s challenges:

*Dear St. Joseph, kind and loving,  
Stretch to us a helping hand;  
Guide us through life’s toils and sorrows  
Safely to the distant land.*

*Though hast known a pilgrim’s sorrows,  
But thy day of toil is o’er;  
Help us while we journey onward  
Lead us to the peaceful shore.*

The St. James Choir sings a lovely Richard Gillard hymn called “*The Servant Song*”, that musically expresses some of the themes applicable to the nurturing, humble spirit of St. Joseph; truly a servant, *par excellence*:

*I will hold the Christ light for you,  
In the night time of your fear,  
I will hold my hand out to you,  
Speak the peace you long to hear.*

St. Joseph. His were a pilgrim’s sorrows, out of which came a living, radiant faith.

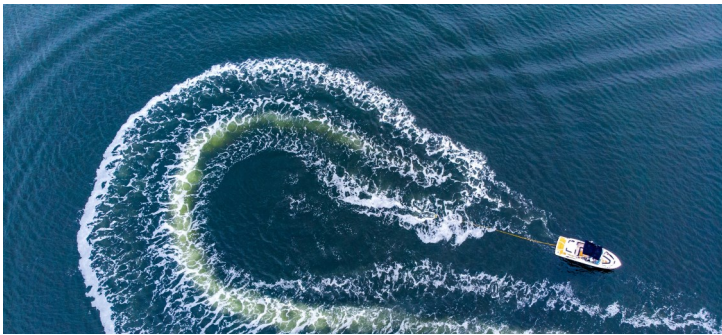

## Gospel Meditation

The Church, as a voice of the Gospel, proclaims the sacredness of all human life. Everyone created by God is fashioned in God's image and has Divine DNA at the center of their soul. God never leaves what God creates but always remains intimately bound to what he has given form. Everyone has a place and because they have received the gift of Divine Blessing, nobody deserves to feel inferior, unworthy, unwanted, unclean or marginalized. Even the most broken of souls has a place. We, the Body of Christ, have the privilege and responsibility to give voice to the voiceless. The cries of the little one in his or her mother's womb are just as sacred as the cries of one who is homeless and hungry. The migrant deserves our attention as much as the forgotten elderly and even the prisoner, with a heart hardened by anger and resentment, deserves respect and dignity.

The Gospel of Life is often hard to swallow, and we would rather keep those we consider unclean, different or unfixable in a place by themselves. It is hard to see them with us, but they deserve to be. There is far too much violence in this world and the result of that violence is the assault on human life. Many are forced to leave the place they call home in search of safer ground, finding few if any along the way who will help them. How different today's Gospel story would be if Jesus gave in to what was politically correct at that time. The leper would have been turned away and a soul, already beaten down by disease and fear, would have experienced an even deeper wound. Jesus wouldn't have captured much attention from anyone, nor would he have mirrored the Father's compassion and love.

Where do we stand with all of this? Do we at least understand that God's vision is often in conflict with the vision put forth in our world and even the one we advance ourselves? There is no doubt that it is incredibly challenging to find a place for everyone at the table. This challenge is compounded when the systems of operation and structure that are so ingrained in us affirm power and privilege rather than inclusivity and justice. Everything really goes askew when the powerful begin to control who is entitled to wholeness and inclusion, and greed becomes a driving force. Prejudice and entitlement raise their ugly heads and we find ourselves with quite a mess. It's time to admit that things have been a mess for a very long time. The mess needs to be healed, not by erasing it but by allowing God to touch it and make it whole. We need to bring God back to the center of life where God belongs. There are no easy solutions to the world's dilemmas. But, knowing that wholeness, healing, and dignity are worthy pursuits, we can more confidently labor to achieve God's vision. ©LPi

## Family Promise Volunteer Coordinator Needed

The mission of Family Promise of the South Bay is to work through local churches to change the lives of homeless families with children by offering temporary shelter, meals, and other assistance as they seek stable housing. Guests stay overnight, on-site at host congregations, such as St. James on a weekly, rotating basis, with each church hosting the families 3 to 4 weeks per year.

A Volunteer Coordinator is needed to manage the program for St. James as a host congregation. The Coordinator takes overall responsibility for ensuring that the host congregation's program runs smoothly.

Currently, due to COVID-19 restrictions the families are staying in a single host location and the Volunteer Coordinator is responsible for organizing and recruiting volunteers to help with grocery and gas gift cards and online donations for the week St. James participates as a remote host.

The coordinator position is an opportunity to form meaningful bonds, with the Family Promise guests and parishioners of St. James alike, while connecting with other participating congregations in the South Bay.

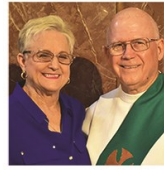

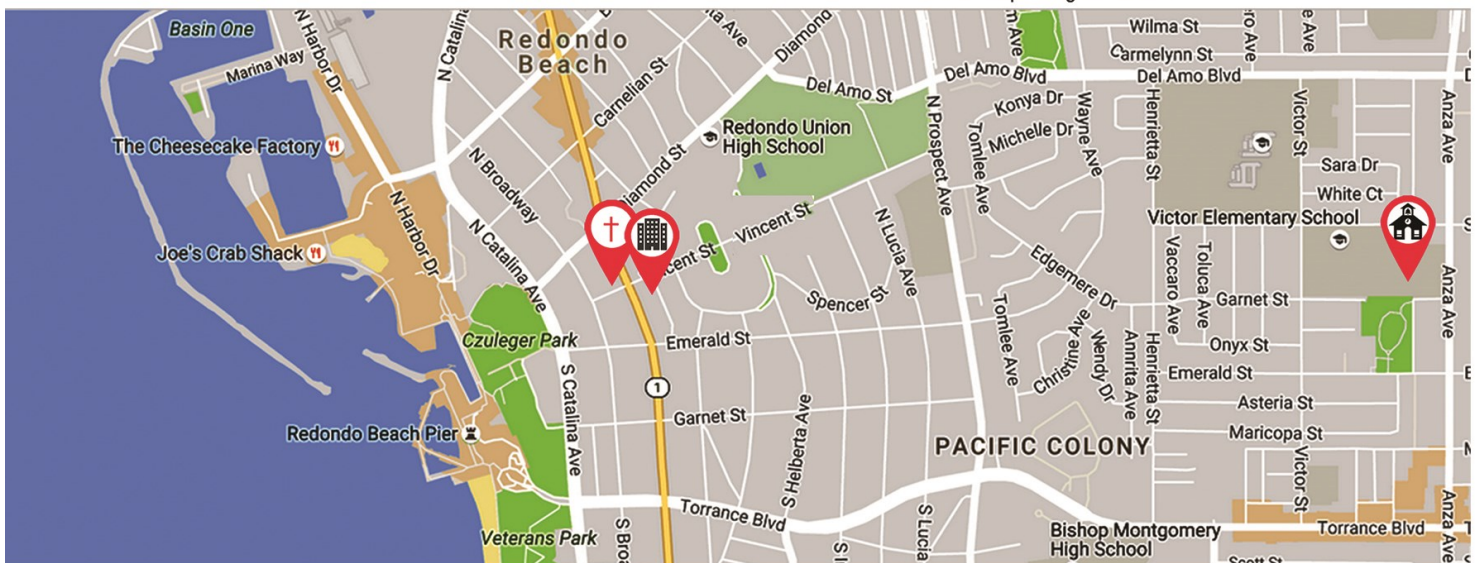
