Pastor's Corner

Weekday Masses Give a Great Opportunity for Eucharist

So many of us continue to stay safer at home and don't want to enter into the crowds because of the pandemic. What I'm hearing from them is that they are suffering because it has been almost a year since they have been able to attend Mass and receive the Eucharist.

Even with our outdoor Masses at our School Field on Anza which provide an open air opportunity under the canopies to celebrate Mass each Sunday there is still concern about being in closer contact with others. (The Noon Mass is the absolute safest with a nice ocean breeze refreshing the air.)

With the continuing dispensation from attending Sunday Mass, a great option now during the pandemic is to consider attending one of our Masses during the weekdays at 8 am. Mass is in the Church and attendance is usually about 50 people. In a church that seats almost 1,000 people, that means that we are at 5% of capacity, making it the safest public place in the city. What a wonderful way to stay connected to God's Word and love and to be able to receive the Eucharist in a safe environment.

We are now 10 days into Lent, so what are you doing to open your hearts and lives more to the Lord?

One great option is to pick up the Matthew Kelly book, "*I Heard God Laugh*", we gave as a gift at Christmas. (Copies of this book are available at the Parish office)

Don't rush through it. Take it slowly and let the book guide you into a better understanding of building a good relationship with God and learning how to pray.

Bundle Sunday—March 7th

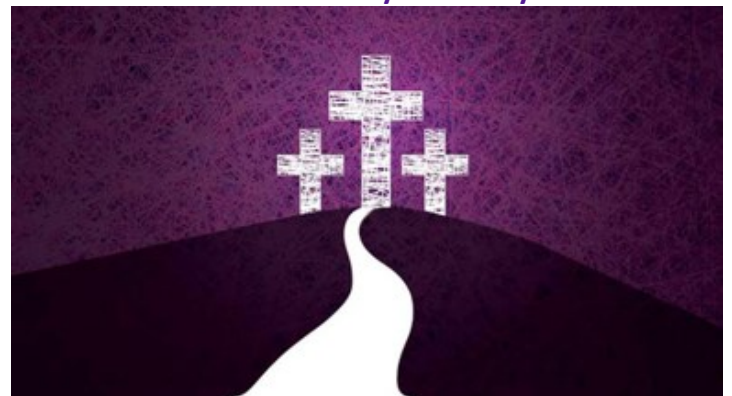

Q: Standing in a Covid -emptied St. Peter’s Basilica while commemorating the resurrection at Easter Vigil last year, Pope Francis preached a “Gospel of Hope” to those living life under the fear of the coronavirus pandemic. Later, at a live-streamed general audience in the library of the Apostolic Palace, it was reported that Pope Francis continued his cycle of catechesis on prayer, stating that prayer opens the door of hope, and that throughout history, prayer had helped people to see beyond their suffering.” What other doors of prayerful hope stand ready to be recognized and opened?

A: The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* presents many such doors, offered in virtuously beautiful and elevating terms:

“Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.”

That which is true, expressed in *Catechism* Paragraph 1820:

“Rejoice in your hope, be patient in tribulation.”
That which is just, also from Paragraph 1820:

“Christian hope unfolds from the beginning of Jesus’ preaching. The beatitudes raise our hope toward heaven. Hope is the sure and steadfast anchor of the soul.”

That which is pure, found in that same paragraph:

“Hope is also a weapon that protects us in the struggle...It affords us joy even under trial.”

Pope Francis reminds us that while it seems this darkness will never end, that we should allow the Lord to teach us what it means to hope. *“We must not let hope abandon us, because God, with his love, walks with us.”*

Among the prayerful readings during Lent, we can appreciate Responsorial Psalm 34:

“From all their distress God rescues the just. I sought the Lord, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears.”

And so it is that, in seeking the Lord, we find that the catechism, scripture, prayer, and steadfast faith combine to offer that hopeful, true, *“anchor of the soul.”*

Gospel Meditation

A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend.

Her friend exclaimed, "You are absolutely beaming!"

The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat.

A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new "digs," received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really "into it" this year and something transformational is happening.

For many, it's only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic.

The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.

Family Promise Volunteer Coordinator Needed

The mission of Family Promise of the South Bay is to work through local churches to change the lives of homeless families with children by offering temporary shelter, meals, and other assistance as they seek stable housing. Guests stay overnight, on-site at host congregations, such as St. James on a weekly, rotating basis, with each church hosting the families 3 to 4 weeks per year.

A Volunteer Coordinator is needed to manage the program for St. James as a host congregation. The Coordinator takes overall responsibility for ensuring that the host congregation's program runs smoothly.

Currently, due to COVID-19 restrictions the families are staying in a single host location and the Volunteer Coordinator is responsible for organizing and recruiting volunteers to help with grocery and gas gift cards and online donations for the week St. James participates as a remote host.

The coordinator position is an opportunity to form meaningful bonds, with the Family Promise guests and parishioners of St. James alike, while connecting with other participating congregations in the South Bay.
