They have stepped up to the challenge now to continue our high standards of learning with the mandated options for students of either In-Person classroom learning or At-Home distance learning creating a hybrid education opportunity that includes both groups in this shared model of school.

Our teachers are real heroes in meeting the challenge of a new education system during the pandemic. We also thank our school principal, **Mrs. Noreen Maricich** for her wonderful leadership of our school families.

Our school parents and families have been great this past year as they have had to make all the adjustments and sacrifices to support the school curriculum for their children at home.

We expect the beginning of **sports at school** to begin with the Red Tier, which will be a welcome opportunity for our children. All of this is such a great sign of the beginnings of normalcy returning to our community and the return of **'life' at school is a real blessing.**

Registration for new students is now underway for next year and we are getting more new families registering than we normally see. Catholic Q and A

Q: The *Catechism,* as part of a larger discussion, characterizes prayer as:

" The raising of one's heart and mind to God."

What are some of the other aspects of prayer that offer insightful, comforting guidance?

A: In our *Choral Praise* songbook there is a section called "Petition & Prayer" where we find humbly inspirational songs of worship and spiritual longing. These are beautiful songs that offer searching hearts the notes to sing as they seek a greater awareness of the nearness of Christ. This music engenders the kind of virtuous hope that lifts souls to, *"see God's face in places we've never known."*

Composer David Haas contributes with the hymn, "Jesus, Come To Us."

"Jesus, come to us, lead us to your light. Jesus, be with us, for we need you." Lord we come before you, listen to our prayer, Fill us all with hope and your love."

The Almanac for Pastoral Liturgy Sourcebook, referring to the Lenten Season of prayer reminds us:

"During Lent the whole Church responds to the call of the Lord to be reconciled with each other and with Christ Jesus. The practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving offer opportunities to all the faithful to make Jesus' call to repentance a personal journey in these forty days."



Our pastoral leader, Monsignor Mike, continues to shepherd St. James Parishioners along the ways of the holy efficacy and righteousness of prayer. One way our Pastor leads in this area is by offering the kind of spiritual reading that the Church encourages as proper and necessary personal enrichment. His latest gift to us is Matthew Kelly's book, *I Heard God Laugh*.

Kelly's book describes the daily habit of prayer that helps us, *"to develop a deep unwavering peace about who we are, where we are, and what we are doing."* It's a book that offers both common sense and wondrous insight.

Prayer, as Kelly says, "brings our lives into focus." Thank you, Monsignor, for this book and for the continued insight into matters of spirituality that truly contributes to the kind of petition and prayer that helps to "raise our hearts and minds to God."

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.



Gospel Meditation

Is there something to Lent that goes beyond our own spiritual house cleaning and spiritual refinement?

Yes, there is!

It has to do with listening and learning so that we can take up the task of the Gospel with greater clarity and fortitude. While the spiritual refocusing of Lent is necessary, the fruit of this Lenten conversion has much more to do with learning how we can be a better Church than it does about our eternal salvation. Salvation is a gift that flows out of God's unconditional Mercy and cannot be merited. The spiritual maturity we can experience as a result of our Lenten disciplines serves to reduce the anxiety and apprehension we may experience as messengers of good, but very challenging, and unsettling, news.

St. Oscar Romero said that, "a church that doesn't provoke any crises, a gospel that doesn't unsettle, a word of God that doesn't get under anyone's skin, a word of God that doesn't touch the real sin of the society in which it is being proclaimed, what gospel is that?"

When we listen to those descriptive and provocative words, do they resonate with anything in our experience? As messengers of the Gospel, we are called to bring an unsettling message to the world. If our main concern is protecting our self-interests, then we are missing something huge!

Many really struggle with being rejected, dismissed, or perceived as someone who is speaking out of turn. There is a counter cultural message that must be preached that clearly sides with the poor, marginalized, victimized, oppressed, neglected, disregarded, and lost souls throughout the world. There is a widespread misery among the peoples that is all too often allowed to fester with no one coming forward to offer a change or resolution.

The Church can speak to the needed structural changes that will allow people to earn just wages, feed their families and share abundantly and equally in the gifts of God's good earth. Such a vision is not some optimistic fairy tale, but the vision of the Creator himself. Lent reminds us, as St. Oscar Romero also states, that, *"we are workers, not master builder, ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own."*

We are not called to labor simply for the benefit of the here and now but of the "what is to come." Our myopic vision can be replaced by a more far reaching Lenten vision that is much greater and deeper in scope. As long as we are carrying the right blueprints with us and our thoughts extend beyond ourselves, then even the little things we do and the simplest prayer we utter go a long way. They give witness to our preference for the light of Christ and not the darkness of error and sin. ©LPi


