#### **HOLY WEEK**

As we prepare now for Holy Week and Easter, we are reminded by the readings of God's merciful **forgiveness** and his desire to create us anew in his love. Part of the process of opening our lives to the healing presence of God is our desire and willingness to step away from where we have been.

A powerful part of the process is the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. To acknowledge our weaknesses, our sins, and give voice to them and to hear God's love expressed in forgiveness can be life transforming. We have dedicated this next week to be available to pray with you and share in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. On **Monday through Thursday evenings from 7 pm** until we are done, our priests will be in the church hearing confessions. This past year with the pandemic, we are all off-balance and struggling and we encourage you to take advantage of this gift of God's healing love in your life.

Please see the whole schedule of services in this bulletin for all of the services from now through Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter. Please note that some services are in the Church and others are outdoors at our school on Anza in Torrance, so **check the schedule carefully**. **On Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday all our morning Masses will be at the school** where we have plenty of room for everyone to gather without concern for the 25% occupancy limit for the church. Bring your own chair and dress comfortably as we celebrate these most holy days together.

#### Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

**Q:** Saint John Paul II called *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, "a special gift."

The word "catechism" means "instruction" and among the holy and instructive elements echoing throughout this catechetical map of a spiritual journey, we can mark lessons from the Bible, the sacraments, Church tradition, and the lives of the saints. For all who seek to persevere in hope, faith, and prayer, with a loving, zealous spirit, how does the catechism gift us with insightful guidance for the challenges of today and tomorrow as reflected in the exemplary lives of the saints?

**A:** St. Paul is quoted in the Catechism: "Pray at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance making supplication for all the saints. Pray without ceasing."

The *Catechism* goes on to reference 2 Corinthians, about walking by faith and not by sight, yet observing that sometimes our life experiences seem to contradict the Good News, thereby possibly shaking one's faith.

One avenue of *Catechism* guidance is presented here: "It is then we must turn to the witnesses of faith...to "so great a cloud of witnesses."

#### Amid that cloud:

St.Thomas Aquinas-"The principle act of courage is to endure and withstand dangers."

St. Catherine of Siena- "Nothing great is ever achieved without much enduring."

St. Padre Pio- "Pray with perseverance...calmness, and serenity."

Is such faith, as exemplified by the saints, possible for those who may be wearied by the often challenging vicissitudes of life?

Pope Francis gives us this perspective:

"To be a Saint is not a privilege for the few, but a vocation for everyone."

Augmenting the *Catechism* in this area is Reverend Alban Butler in *Lives of the Saints*:

"Beg of God, through the intercession of these holy martyrs, the gift of perseverance. Their example will supply you with an admirable rule for obtaining this crowning gift. Do not hesitate; do not look back; do not listen to suggestions against faith or virtue, but advance, day by day, along the road which you have chosen to God ..."

Or as St. John Paul II advised: "Become a saint, and do so quickly."

As we look to withstand our own present dangers, may we find that calmness and serenity so often exhibited by such an amazing litany of Catholic saints, adding ourselves to the catalog of those who persevere, as part of an enduring effort to finish the race; to fight the good fight; to keep the faith. A saintly vocation, indeed.

He was not Irish! He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. He often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message.

He wrote "The Breastplate," Patrick's poem of faith and trust in God: "Christ be within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ inquired, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger."

# **Gospel Meditation**

Any good teacher or parent will tell you that once a lesson is really learned it doesn't need to be taught again.

When we internalize things we have learned, they become a part of who we are and influence how we perceive and interact with our world. The same is true for the law God has written upon our hearts. Once humanity learns this lesson, we will simply know it to be true and act accordingly. Sometimes, it is hard to get people to learn the lessons they need to learn. They are often distracted, disinterested, conflicted, misdirected, or just too stubborn and unable or unwilling to see what is right before their eyes. Understanding that God is in a loving and committed relationship with those fashioned and formed in God's own image, seems like such a simple lesson to learn. But history and experience has proven that it is not.

We struggle with faith, especially when that faith asks us to learn something very particular about ourselves. We must, like a grain of wheat, fall to the ground and die. Because God's DNA is at the very core of who we are, there are specific pearls of wisdom that must be acquired before we can live a full life. One very powerful lesson is that it is not the task of the world to tell us who we are and what has meaning, but God. For many, death is not an opportunity for greater life but a permanent ending to the life they have known. Jesus knew every dimension to what it means to be fully human because he was! He knows the joys, limitations, sorrows, frustrations, wonders, suffering, opportunities, and joys of the human experience. Jesus can teach us a wealth of knowledge and life's lessons from his example, especially obedience.

When we accept the law God has placed in our hearts and gain wisdom from it, then when we suffer we learn to listen more attentively to the Voice behind that law. We naturally flee to our Creator for inspiration, consolation, hope, direction, and comfort as we navigate through this time of darkness. We will not need to run from it, subdue it, fight it, or be overcome by it because we will know, having internalized this profound lesson before, that God will bring new life. God's law is love and love never fails. Even in the moments of Jesus' deepest despair, he glorified the name of his Father. What he learned allowed him to put everything in perspective and be obedient to the tender, loving Voice that echoed within.


As Lent quickly winds down, may we learn the same!

#### The Power of Confession

All priests of God's holy Church have an incredible gift to give each parishioner: forgiveness of the sins if they have at least imperfection contrition for their sins, by the merits of our Lord, through the sacrament of reconciliation. If imperfect contrition hasn't yet to be obtained, as long as there is some desire to stop the sin, this sacrament still sends fantastic grace to help move soul's to obtain the contrition needed to accept forgiveness and then into perfect contrition for the salvation of their souls. There is nothing more important than saving the souls of God's people. Everything we do is in vain if we can't prevent God's children from dying with unrepentant mortal sin on their soul. Truly loving each person is realized by showing them how to obtain the gift of eternal life. Nothing else can be of greater importance. Even the Holy Eucharist cannot save the soul of a man who has broken his relationship with Christ. The sacrament of reconciliation is the only ordinary means to bring purification to the soul. Outside of growing into perfect contrition, this sacrament restores our souls back into sanctifying grace-even if only for a moment and sends us unspeakable grace to help us achieve and maintain a saving faith for the salvation of our souls. www.sacramentofreconciliation.com/john-paulreconciliation-program/
