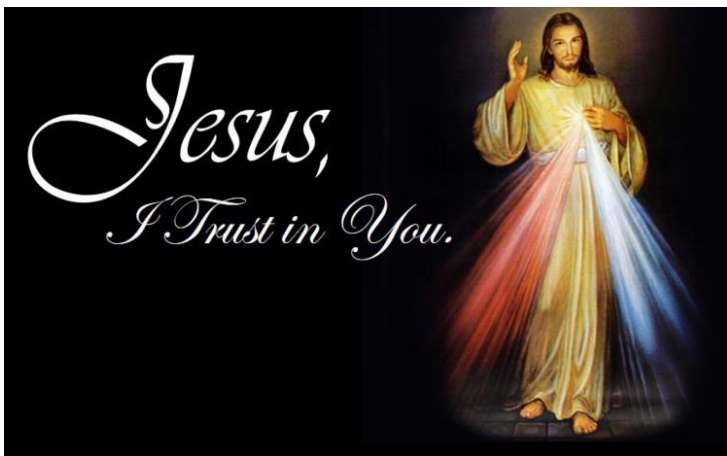

Thank you for showing your love for God by loving our neighbors with such an outpouring of generosity.

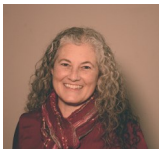
As we celebrate Easter, we also approach our parish's **First Communion** celebrations, which will be held during regular parish **Masses on April 17, 18, 24, and 25.**

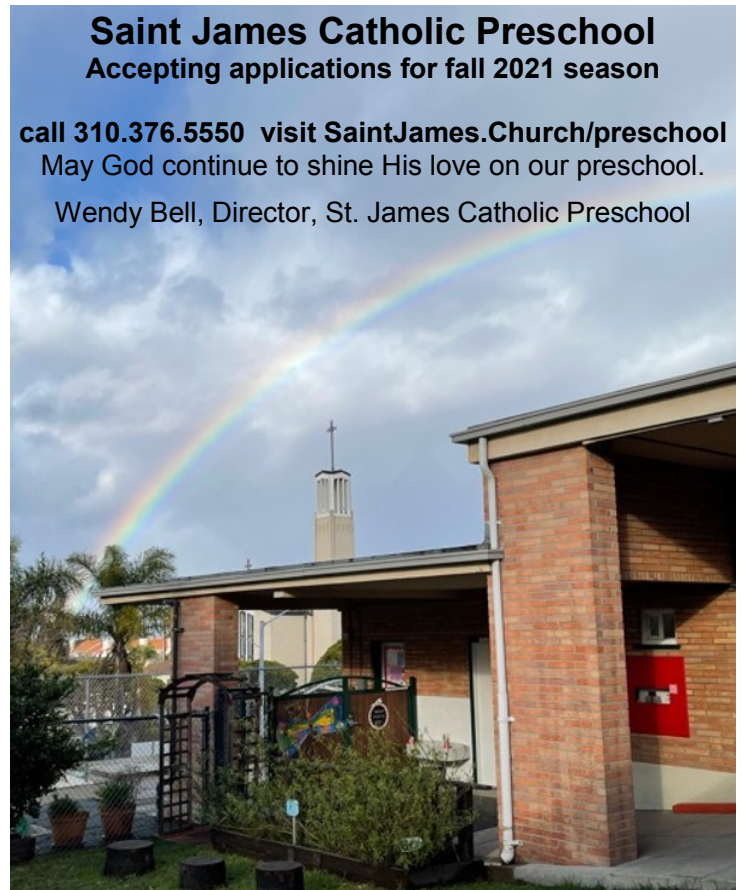

## Christ is risen! Truly He is risen!

The stone is rolled away. The tomb where Christ once laid is empty. Death did not hold Him. He conquered death and restored life. Jesus, Our Redeemer, brings us life, love, and hope won for us all through His passion, death, and resurrection.

This year, in these unprecedented times, our celebration of the Holy Triduum and Easter has certainly been far different than usual. The Coronavirus Pandemic and its effects have forced us all to adapt, sacrifice, and persevere in all things. We can all agree we've never experienced anything like this in our lifetimes. However, the same truths of our faith in the Paschal Mystery that we joyfully celebrate each year reign true today in the time of pandemic as "causes for joy."

What I find special (and encouraging!) is how all the Easter Sunday Gospels begin with disciples seeking. In each of the Gospel accounts of the empty tomb, the women, Mary Magdalene and "the other Mary" or, Mary, the mother of James and John, go to the empty tomb. "On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb" (John 20:1).

What are they seeking? Perhaps the Resurrected Christ, but they didn't all understand how the Scriptures would be fulfilled yet. Maybe they were seeking to mourn the Lord's death more or to pray for Him. Maybe they were hoping to find some comfort in praying where His body laid at rest. No matter what, they were seeking. They didn't immediately encounter the Lord either, they had to let the story continue to unfold and find Him. When they found Him, inexpressible joy was certainly the reaction!

Easter Joy, an encounter with our Risen Lord doesn't just come to us. We must seek it. All of us approximately 2,000 years later are truly blessed to know how the story unfolds. We can seek to meet the Risen Lord knowing that He comes to us and calls us to Himself. Easter Joy, the joy of the Risen Lord is indeed ours when we seek Him!

How can we seek the Lord in such difficult times?  
In such depressing, scary, difficult times?

In faith, in hope, and in charity!

Seek Him!

Believe in the power of God to transform our mourning into laughter and our fear into confidence.  
Live the truths and commandments of our faith.  
Long for the coming of God's Kingdom, fulfillment only in Jesus Christ, and eternal life with Him.  
Long for the glory of God to be revealed through these difficult times.

**Q:** *What are you discussing with each other as you walk along?*

**A:** That particular question about the events of the crucifixion and what was to follow was asked by the resurrected Jesus on that long ago dusty road near the village of Emmaus, and it remains an everlasting focal point for each of us as we move along our own spiritual road toward transformative faith. Every April we read about these events in Luke 24 in a kind of renewal and clarification of faith.

Biblical scholars note that along those seven miles between Jerusalem and Emmaus that Cleopas and his brother disciple offer a lesson that is primarily catechetical and liturgical in scope, what Pope Francis calls, "a symbol of a path of hope."

The *Catechism* contains many chords of discussion about this eye-opening and emotionally elevating experience of recognizing our savior in the breaking of the bread, an act commemorated at every Mass.

Paragraph 158 offers a quote from Thomas Aquinas, setting the tone for a profession of faith in the tradition of Emmaus:

*"In faith, the human intellect and will cooperate with divine grace..."*

Pope Francis said that Emmaus offers two paths: "In life we have two opposite directions in front of us.

One is the path of those who let themselves be paralyzed by the disappointments of the past, and the other is that of those who put Jesus and their brothers and sisters first. The Lord is alive. He walks with us. On the way to Emmaus the disciples are sad. On the return journey they are joyful."

Miraculous events like Emmaus and the sacramental grace of Holy Communion are reflected in a venerable song that has been used in Gregorian Chant and Taize ostinato, (a recurring musical theme), and as a familiar antiphon, that is, a liturgical prelude or liturgical conclusion:

*Ubi Caritas- (Where true charity is).  
"May we one day behold your glory, and see you face to face."*

The two disciples on that road who saw Jesus face to face after he rose on that fateful third day found out as the song says that, where charity and love are, that *God is there- "Deus ibi est."*

*Est Vera... It "is true"* that, by communion even though challenged by social distance that on our particular road, it remains that:

*"The love of Christ joins us together."*

Such is the work of divine grace.
