Gospel Meditation

What a wonderful joy fills us today as we ponder the inexhaustible mercy of God. "Mercy is the heart of God," Pope Francis tells us. The image of a heart has been used to point to the very life source of a person as it is the organ that allows life to flow through our veins and sustain us. Mercy is the heart of God. Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. It is God's mercy that allows blood to flow through our veins. It is God's mercy that forms every atom of our being and leads us to what is true. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

"Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope," Pope Francis continues. God's all forgiving, compassionate love is with us. When we finally believe and accept that Christ's resurrected transfigured presence resides with us, we then find within us a strong confidence to accept life's imperfections and disappointments and move on. Every day is a new adventure in new life. God leaves the past behind and opens doors to the future. It doesn't matter how many mistakes we made yesterday. All that matters is what we do tomorrow and what we learn along the way. It is so easy to remain tethered and mired in the past, but there is no need to do so. God is all about tomorrow and the work God has yet to do in our lives.

Mercy gives birth to hope. Hope for the greatest of sinners and hope for the worst of disasters. There is nothing God cannot do and nothing God cannot fashion. After all, everything we know and treasure was once nothing, and look what God did with the nothing God had! The resurrected Christ stands before us with nail marks in his wrists and wounds on his body as a testament that not even injustice, suffering and death can trample over and destroy God's mercy. What have we to fear? Why do we keep ourselves from peace? Our lack of faith prevents us from going forward and fully receiving the holiness God desires to breathe upon us. 



Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

How does this last paragraph of the Gospel of Matthew, set amid the events of Eastertide, contribute to guiding the Church's vision of its continuing commission of **evangelization**?

A: In the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, the seeds of evangelization are consistently sprinkled throughout. Paragraph 2104 summarizes:

"The social duty of Christians is to respect and awaken in each man the love of the true and the good. It requires them to make known the worship of the one true religion which subsists in the Catholic and apostolic Church. Christians are called to be the light of the world."



This "social duty of religion" outlined in the catechism is reflected in our own St. James Mission Statement:

"The mission of St. James Church is to

build up the Body of Christ by evangelizing those weak in faith, healing the hurt and alienated Catholic, nourishing the faith and commitment of its active members."

Additionally, as part of this paradigm, parishioners are encouraged to be, "...in right relationship with one another."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has defined evangelization as:

"Bringing the Good News of Jesus into every human situation and seeking to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself. Evangelization must always be directly connected to the Lord Jesus Christ. Evangelization happens when the word of Jesus speaks to people's hearts and minds. The fruits of evangelization are changed lives and a changed world-holiness and justice, spirituality and peace."

The Church and the *Catechism* provide many narratives about the evangelizing spirit and related evangelizing actions. Our Choir draws from the Ministry and Mission section of its Hymnal as part of a musical call to evangelization in the familiar song,

"Take the Word of God With You"
Take the love of God with you as you go,
Take the seeds of God's love and make them grow,
Go in peace to serve the world,
in peace to serve the world,
Take the love of God with you as you go...

Speaking about the many forms of evangelization, the *Catechism* and the Bishops teach that as part of evangelism's core essence of love:

"We can only share what we have received; we can hold on to our faith only if it continues to grow. But if salt loses its taste, Jesus asked, with what can it be seasoned?

The continuing story of salvation in Christ involves each of us one by one as well as society itself. How else could it be? The Gospel must overflow from each heart until the presence of God transforms all human existence."

The *Catechism* teaches that it remains for the Church and for all who seek right relationship with one another to honor the good news of evangelization in its many forms and to continue to nourish the faith as Christians called one by one to be, "the light of the world."

History of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy

In 1935, St. Faustina received a vision of an angel sent by God to chastise a certain city. She began to pray for mercy, but her prayers were powerless. Suddenly she saw the Holy Trinity and felt the power of Jesus' grace within her. At the same time she found herself pleading with God for mercy with words she heard interiorly:

Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us. (Diary, 475)

As she continued saying this inspired prayer, the angel became helpless and could not carry out the deserved punishment (see 474). The next day, as she was entering the chapel, she again heard this interior voice, instructing her how to recite the prayer that our Lord later called "the Chaplet." This time, after "have mercy on us" were added the words "and on the whole world" (476). From then on, she recited this form of prayer almost constantly, offering it especially for the dying.

In subsequent revelations, the Lord made it clear that the Chaplet was not just for her, but for the whole world. He also attached extraordinary promises to its recitation.

Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you (1541). Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior (1541). Priests will recommend it to sinners as their last hope of salvation. Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this Chaplet

only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy (687). I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy (687). Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will. (1731)

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist, so it is especially appropriate to use it after having received Holy Communion at Holy Mass. It may be said at any time, but our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter). He then added: "By this Novena, [of Chaplets] I will grant every possible grace to souls." (796)

It is likewise appropriate to pray the Chaplet during the "Hour of Great Mercy" — three o'clock each afternoon (recalling the time of Christ's death on the cross). In His revelations to St. Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special remembrance of His Passion at that hour.
