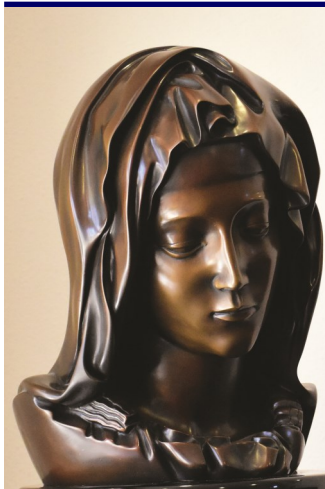
### Parish 'ReOpening'

## Gospel Meditation

“Spiraling out of control,” is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence.

In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing.

Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that “feelings” have become a “new god” and traditional structures and ideals set aside.

It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checked past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong.

It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn?

Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues.

It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God’s life.

Giving up our will to God’s can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction.

God’s commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be “human freedom.” They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived.

We would like to bring you up do date on our latest activities in the Feed The Needy Ministry.

During the Lenten Season we had the privilege of working with the **Religious Education Office** on a Lenten drive for the needy.

Thanks to **Andrea Sullivan** and her assistant, **Debora Martins**, their coordinating efforts, the generosity of our school students, teachers and moms a collection of food items and many toiletries was conducted for our ministry. We received much needed items and has made serving our homeless community very successful. Many thanks to all involved for their donations and good work.

Additionally, we want to update you on the vaccine status of our homeless community. Thanks to the work of the County Department of Health Services we were able to obtain a **MOBILE VACCINE UNIT** here at St. James Church. The Unit came April 21, 2021 consisting of four registered nurses and three assistants and set up a vaccination center in the church parking lot.

We were able to vaccinate 34 individuals who would not otherwise receive their shots.

Our ministry has been very blessed with the coordinating efforts of so many great individuals.

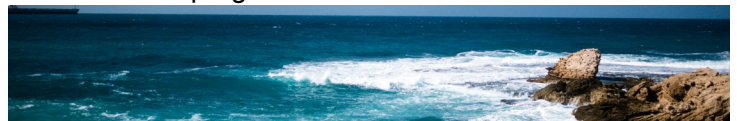
### The Power of Confession

All priests of God's holy Church have an incredible gift to give each parishioner: forgiveness of the sins if they have at least imperfect contrition for their sins, by the merits of our Lord, through the sacrament of reconciliation.

If imperfect contrition hasn't yet to be obtained, as long as there is some desire to stop the sin, this sacrament still sends fantastic grace to help move soul's to obtain the contrition needed to accept forgiveness and then into perfect contrition for the salvation of their souls. There is nothing more important than saving the souls of God's people. Everything we do is in vain if we can't prevent God's children from dying with unrepentant mortal sin on their soul. Truly loving each person is realized by showing them how to obtain the gift of eternal life.

Nothing else can be of greater importance. Even the Holy Eucharist cannot save the soul of a man who has broken his relationship with Christ. The sacrament of reconciliation is the only ordinary means to bring purification to the soul. Outside of growing into perfect contrition, this sacrament restores our souls back into sanctifying grace—even if only for a moment and sends us unspeakable grace to help us achieve and maintain a saving faith for the salvation of our souls.

**Q:** What is it that, in the words of Pope Francis, "brings together those who were distant, unites those far off"... and, "brings home those who were scattered."?

**A:** It's the Holy Spirit!

*The Catechism of the Catholic Church* in Paragraph 683 is quoted by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as they describe Pentecost and the importance of the Holy Spirit-

"Knowledge of faith is possible only in the Holy Spirit: to be in touch with Christ, we must first have been touched by the Holy Spirit.

He comes to meet us and kindle faith in us."

Helping to kindle the faith is the Saint James Choir, who each year would be found in their places to join in celebration of the "**Birthday of the Church**", fifty days after Easter, when the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles, the Choir singing:

*Come Lord Jesus,  
send us your Spirit,  
renew the face of the earth.  
Fill us with the fire of your love,  
burn in us now,  
bring us together...*

As the Choir presents this plea of renewal and reunion in prayerful harmonious praise, it is Pope Francis who marks that most central feature of Pentecost :  
*Harmony.*

"Holy Spirit, our harmony,  
you who make of us one body,  
pour forth your peace upon the Church and our world.  
Holy Spirit, make us builders of concord,  
sowers of goodness, apostles of hope."

As Saint Bonaventure said in speaking about the Holy Spirit:

*"He comes where he is loved,  
where he is invited, where he is expected."*

Here at Saint James we, ourselves, are blessed as a harmonious body of believers to most assuredly feel loved, invited, and expected.

In other words, touched by the Holy Spirit who, "brings us together."

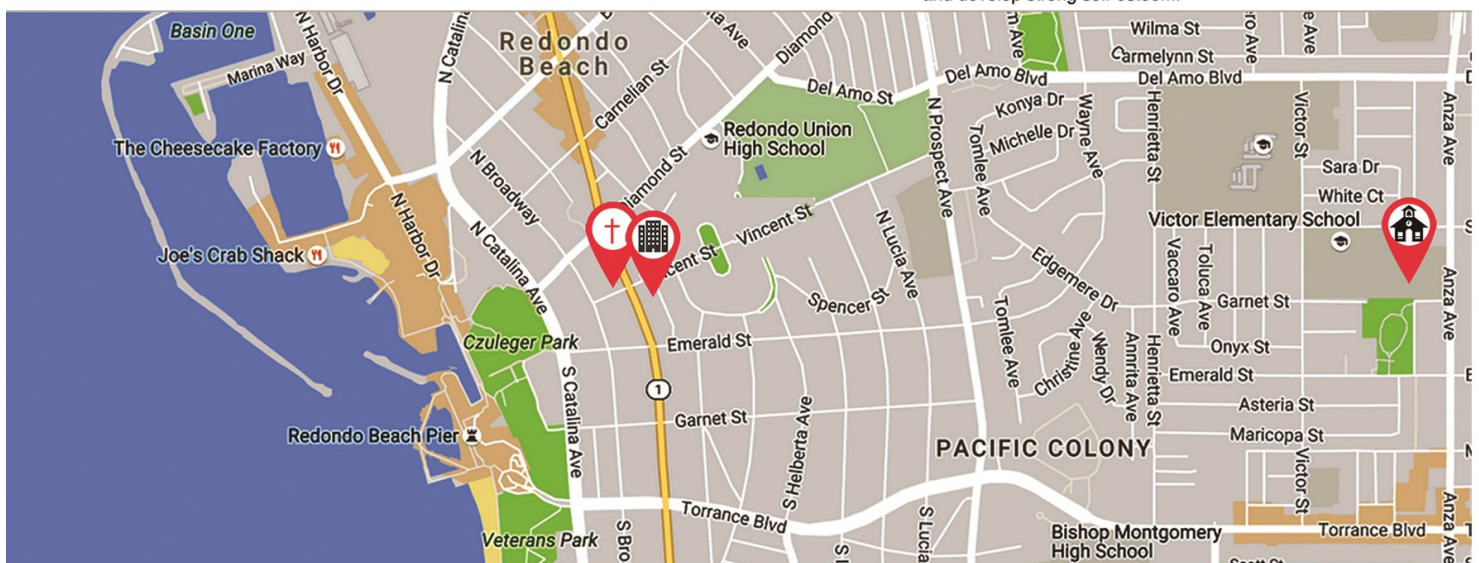
