## **Pastor's Corner**

Dear Friends and Families of Saint James,

#### Pentecost

This weekend we celebrate Pentecost, the great Feast which brings to a conclusion our 50-day celebration of Easter. During this time, we have had the opportunity to reflect on the presence of the Lord in our lives, to consider the reality and implications of the Resurrection, and to evaluate our personal response to God's extravagant generosity.

For the Apostles, the period between the Resurrection and Pentecost was a time of uncertainty and fear. The only life they had known was rapidly changing and they were struggling to understand the events that had transpired. They were anxious at the prospect of no longer having Jesus with them.

During the Last Supper, Jesus promised His Apostles that He would not leave them as orphans. He assured them that His Father would send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to remind them of what He had taught them. Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, fear became hope, hesitation turned into action and doubt was transformed into passionate faith. Because of this, the Apostles were able to fulfill Jesus' final commission to

"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature."

Inspired and enflamed in their faith by the Holy Spirit, that small group of unlikely disciples preached the Gospel throughout the known world, continuing the ministry and mission of Jesus.



Over the centuries the Church has seen empires rise and fall; cultures begin and end; war and peace develop and subside; yet through it all the Church has never ceased moving forward on Her pilgrim journey.

This would not be possible without the Holy Spirit's steadfast guidance. Today's feast reminds us of God's extraordinary intervention into our world which continues to touch our daily lives.

The Holy Spirit that came upon the Apostles, and the Holy Spirit that guides the Universal Church is the same Spirit that has guided us through the pandemic, giving us courage and hope. This Spirit has quickened our hearts now with the pandemic subsiding.

The opportunity to fully gather again as a community of faith draws closer.

After prayerful reflection, the Pastoral Council, Liturgy Committee and Parish Team have all recommended that our Masses should return to the Church with our full schedule of Masses beginning the weekend of June 12-13, just ahead of the governor's opening the State on June 15.

We will begin again with our Sunday 6:30 am Mass and Sunday evening 5:30 pm Mass.


In addition we will add an outdoor Mass at 8:30 am for the rest of the summer in our new property Courtyard for those who need to stay safer outdoors.


#### Parish Reopening—Survey







#### Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

**Q:** Pope Francis relates the anecdote of a priest sent to administer last rites to an elderly woman.

"Madam, do you repent of your sins?" The woman said "yes."

Then; "Do you forgive others?"

The woman, on her deathbed replied:

"No. Those people treated me so harshly."

The priest was upset.

"If you do not forgive, God will not forgive you.
Ask the Lord to give you the strength to do so."

What does the *Catechism* say about the grace and the sublime righteousness found within the spirit of forgiveness?

**A:** The *Catechism*, in many entries, emphasizes the foundational teaching of The Lord's Prayer:

"...as we forgive those who trespass against us."

We are also blessed to have many scriptural references which testify about mercy, from the Prodigal Son, to Matthew 18 and the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant, featuring monetary talents owed, and fraternal forgiveness granted.

That particular servant, (providing an object lesson), ultimately failed to heed the admonition offered by our patron, Saint James:

"Be doers of the word."

Having been commuted of his debt, the servant did not extend a measure of forgiveness to one who owed him, and was promptly shown his error by a vigorous, "throttling", as the Bible describes it.

Pope Francis in a lesson about active faith reminds that,

"... if you don't strive to forgive, you will not be forgiven; if you do not strive to love, neither will you be loved. Love attracts love; forgiveness attracts forgiveness. With a word, an embrace, a smile, we can pass on to others the most precious thing we have received: forgiveness."

The Saint James Choir, seeking to be Doers of the Word, underscore their collective merciful praise with a musical selection based on Psalm 103, entitled,

"Loving And Forgiving."
Good and gracious is the Lord,
Slow to anger, rich in love.
God remembers not our sins,
Forgiving and loving is God.

Peter asked Jesus how often he should forgive his brother. Jesus answered, "I say to you not seven times but seventy-seven times." The *Catechism* has more than seventy-seven teachings on the subject of forgiveness. May the Lord indeed give us the strength to heed his teachings.

Forgiveness. A precious thing, indeed.

#### Gospel Meditation

Begin by taking a moment to calm yourself, focus on your breathing and become aware of the life force that flows through your veins. Center yourself in the words and affections of St. Augustine's Prayer to the Holy Spirit, "Breath in me, O Holy Spirit, that my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, that my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, to defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, that I may always be holy." Sanctifying, bringing things to wholeness, blessing, restoring and creating are just some of the fruits of the presence of the Holy Spirit. Being filled with the Holy Spirit is not always about proclaiming loud cries of praise or singing alleluia from a roof top. It is about unfolding and encountering the ordinary in an extraordinary way. Being filled with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the fullness of God's life and in touch with the power and wonder of God's presence. It's about becoming holy.

It is not just for saints or people who have a religious vocation. Holiness is for the ordinary, simple run- of-the-mill person who desires to love God, others, and all of creation. When an ordinary, humble person becomes connected with life and the wondrous power of God's love, they begin to live life more deeply, a bit more reverently, desire a simple fare and find themselves relishing in ordinary beauty. Their senses become attuned to the Author of life and they realize that they are not alone. The Holy Spirit connects all of the dots of human experience and existence, bringing everyone to center on the Divine Presence. The Holy Spirit does not just breathe "on me" but "in me" and is the force behind every breath I take. Take a moment to soak that thought in. There is the Divine Presence of the Holy Spirit in me, right now. When a person becomes in touch with truth, they know that when inspired by the Holy Spirit, his or her actions are not solely their own. They realize that they are moved by Divine Grace and drawn to things not found in secular affairs.

We live in a world where it is hard to discover truth. Real truth is veiled by so many imposters that it is hard to find. especially for those who are young. It is easy to get fooled and duped and often, without full conscious awareness of doing so, we choose to walk down a path of self-absorption and destruction. It is only the Holy Spirit, through the ministry of the church most especially, who guides us to truth and shows us the way to be the graced and holy human beings God made us to be. The wonders and inspirations of today's Feast of Pentecost are necessary to share with both those we love and those who only casually cross our paths. The first disciples, touched by the Holy Spirit, brought the Gospel to the ends of the earth one step at a time. Is it unrealistic to ask that we assist in that same mission by helping people understand who they are and who God is one at a time? Ask the Holy Spirit to alleviate the fear in your heart that prevents you from doing so. **©LPi**


