Catholic Q and A

Benedict XVI, Pope Emeritus, is an accomplished pianist with a passion for music.

Pope Francis, though not musically trained, is an aficionado of the music and dance of his native Argentina.

His Holiness has had much to say about the role of liturgical music, pre and post-pandemic:

Q: What does Pope Francis say, in general, about the role of liturgical music?

A: In a video message to a conference on liturgical music organized by the Vatican's culture ministry, it is reported that the pontiff recalled the importance of music to the life of the Church.

Q: The *Catechism* has, among other entries on this topic, a discussion of the importance of songs and music, and their function within the liturgy. How does Pope Francis reflect such discussion?

A: The Holy Father said that he hoped that once the pandemic passes, that the Church's musical life can be reborn "and we can resume singing and playing and enjoying together, music and song."

He offered encouragement to musicians who have been silenced as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, acknowledging many have lost work and the ability to practice together.

Q: Among the scriptural readings of the week, we find in Psalm 149: "Sing to the Lord a new song of praise in the assembly of the faithful."

How does the Pope echo the psalmist?

A: "Liturgical musicians have the unique calling to interpret God's will and love through song and praise. Every Christian, in fact, is an interpreter of the will of God in his or her own life, and by his or her life sings a joyful hymn of praise and thanksgiving to God."

Q: The *Catechism* has a section which refers to liturgical music as the Church's "treasure." How does Pope Francis value and encapsulate this particular Church teaching about music in a practical setting?

A: The Pope puts it in terms very much as a Psalm of his own:

"The artist, the interpreter, and -in the case of music- the listener, all have the same desire.

To understand what beauty, music and art allow us to know of God's grandeur. Now perhaps more than ever, men and women have need of this.

Interpreting that reality is essential for today's world."

Here at St. James we pray that the assembly of the faithful may be witness to a renaissance of the musical life of the Church, with songs of praise, reborn.

Engaging Men is the Key to Ending Sex Trafficking

June 12th 8-10am Our Outstanding Panel



Patrick Erlandson who hosts Father Con and leads a Southern California group "Men Standing Against Trafficking" will be our MC.

Pastor Dan Broyles leads an Anti-Human Trafficking Community Task Force that is engaging churches, schools, non-profits, etc.

Justified Smith heads up "Fathers in Hip Hop" a group that encourages fatherhood as a way to "pimp proof" our daughters

Patrick (Doc) Nave, with his wife Rainey, heads up Bikers Against Trafficking, an international Christian

group that mobilizes members of the motorcycle community in many projects to end sex trafficking.

Pastor Arnold Cifax is the director of HEMAD (Human Trafficking Educators working with Men and Boys to Stand Against the Demand). HEMAD has engaged over 45,000 men internationally to take a public stand against the sex trade and human trafficking.

Yusef Miller co-leads "A Bunch of Guys," where men communicate with sex buyers at the point of purchase to discourage sex buying.

Kenny Henry created a Life Coaching program empowering Black boys and young men on how to honor themselves and their community

Joe Sullivan is a Catholic deacon who created a workshop that puts Catholic men to work in the fight against human trafficking.

Gospel Meditation

As our world faces so much turmoil and change, it is now more important than ever to remember who God is. who we are and where we are going. It is easy to get distracted and lose focus, especially when we are being pulled in so many directions. We can not only lose sight of God but one another. Maintaining our well developed and mature relationships with God and one another is essential to continuing to live, healthy, happy, and focused lives. In a message to young people, Pope Benedict XVI said, "the happiness you are seeking, the happiness you have a right to enjoy has a name and a face: it is Jesus of Nazareth, hidden in the Eucharist." What is true for those who are younger is even truer for those who are older. Regardless of how the particulars of life change over time, human beings are still hard-wired to seek the fullness of life and happiness. How we embark on this journey and what we choose along the way will indicate whether we meet success.

There is so much brokenness and pain in our world. Many people are lost, feeling lonely, anxious, marginalized, victimized, isolated, oppressed, and abused. Every time we receive the Body of Christ, we have an opportunity to become what we eat. The power and presence of Christ in the Eucharist becomes present in us and effects change in ourselves and in the lives of those we meet. We are given the grace to become temples of justice and peace, carrying God's sacred Presence within us wherever we go. Our faith community is ignited with the fire of God's love and stands out as a beacon of hope in a world that is lost. This is the only way we can discover peace-filled resolutions to violence and create innovative solutions to what is fueling its need in the first place. True happiness, for the young and old alike, becomes an obtainable goal.

St. John Maria Vianney says it so well.

"There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, he would have given it to us."

Only the Eucharist has the ability to connect, sustain, strengthen, and properly orient us, not only on the road of this life but the road to life eternal. Knowing this, when life gets challenging, unsettling, and difficult, we can rely on and cling to this gift we have in the Real Presence of Christ. This actual encounter with God celebrates God's unconditional love for us and grounds us to the truth of who we are in a way nothing else is able to do. Because through the Eucharist we really do become the Body of Christ, we are also bonded together in a most perfect way to one another as that Body. Nourished, united, and strengthened by the Eucharist, let us individually and collectively, bring this wonderful gift to all we meet, especially the poor with whom we have a special connection.
