### **Charges Filed Against Sr. Mary Margaret**

For some time the entire community of St. James has carried the burden of the betrayal of trust and loss of funds at our school prior to 2018. This past week the investigation was completed and legal action begun by federal authorities. Below is the statement from the Archdiocese as the legal actions continue their course.

#### **Statement from the Archdiocese of Los Angeles**

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles has been informed that the U.S. Attorney has announced that a criminal plea agreement has been reached with Sister Mary Margaret Kreuper concerning charges for improper use of funds at St. James Catholic School in Torrance. The agreement acknowledges that Sister Mary Margaret will plead guilty to fraud and money laundering charges for stealing more than \$835,000 in school funds over a 10-year period.

The Archdiocese informed authorities of the matter in 2018 when financial reviews during a change in leadership showed a substantial amount of school funds had been misappropriated for personal use by Sister Mary Margaret during her 28-year tenure as school principal.

The community of faith at St. James was shocked and saddened by these actions and the parish, school and the Archdiocese reported the matter and fully cooperated with authorities in the criminal investigation. The Archdiocese and St. James Parish and School are grateful to local and federal law enforcement agencies for their work in the investigation of this matter.

We continue to offer our prayers for all impacted by this matter.

**Q:** During these days of Ordinary Time the Liturgical Calendar finds us honoring a multitude of saints; several each week. Though it won’t be until November on All Saints Day when we hear the St. James Choir sing refrains from Becker’s “Litany of the Saints”, all those holy men and women indeed pray for us each day. As we note their feast days we may ask - How does Church recognition of the extraordinary and exemplary lives of these holy intercessors highlight and enjoin their role into our own journey of faith?

**A:** In the classic, *Lives of the Saints*, the daily trials of humanity are present in full view. “A cloud of witnesses, a noble army of martyrs, teach us by their constancy to suffer wrong with patience, and strenuously to resist evil.”

**Q:** How did Pope Francis refer to this saintly cloud of witnesses and their legacy of constancy in optimistic terms?

**A:** His Holiness explained that the Saints are “the most authoritative witnesses of Christian hope because they lived it fully in their lives, amidst joys and sufferings, putting into practice the Beatitudes that Jesus preached.”

**Q:** *The Catechism* links the saints in its subject index with the word, holiness. Why?

**A:** “Being more closely United to Christ, those who dwell in heaven fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness. They do not cease to intercede with the Father for us: ...by their fraternal concern is our weakness greatly helped. We can and should ask them to intercede for us...Our communion with the saints joins us with Christ.”

**Q:** In a daily examination of the saints one finds object lessons of good over evil. We find the faithful and the heathen. There are lives of dissipation and lives of grace. One finds humility, suffering, conversion, monumental zeal, and an unwavering desire for the heavenly, over all things earthly. Equally amazing is the culmination of lives meeting the incredibly stunning reality of martyrdom. How do the scriptures so often underscore, echo, enhance and align with the lives of the saints and with the Pope’s depiction of them as witnesses of Christian hope, amid the continuing and often cataclysmic trials of daily life, then and now?

**A:** Ephesians 1:17 is just one, beautiful, example: “May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our hearts, that we may know what is the hope that belongs to his call.”

“With the eyes of our hearts.” This may be one of the best of perspectives in which to learn and to internalize a most heartfelt appreciation of the lives of the saints as each day, we move to answer his call to holiness.

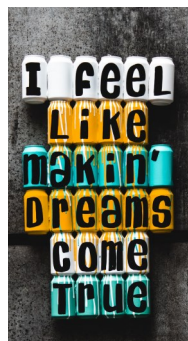

# Engaging Men is the Key to Ending Sex Trafficking

Our Outstanding Panel



**Patrick Erlandson** who hosts Father Con and leads a Southern California group "Men Standing Against Trafficking" will be our MC.

**Pastor Dan Broyles** leads an Anti-Human Trafficking Community Task Force that is engaging churches, schools, non-profits, etc.

**Justified Smith** heads up "Fathers in Hip Hop" a group that encourages fatherhood as a way to "pimp proof" our daughters

**Patrick (Doc) Nave**, with his wife Rainey, heads up Bikers Against Trafficking, an international Christian

group that mobilizes members of the motorcycle community in many projects to end sex trafficking.

**Pastor Arnold Cifax** is the director of HEMAD (Human Trafficking Educators working with Men and Boys to Stand Against the Demand). HEMAD has engaged over 45,000 men internationally to take a public stand against the sex trade and human trafficking.

**Yusef Miller** co-leads "A Bunch of Guys," where men communicate with sex buyers at the point of purchase to discourage sex buying.

**Kenny Henry** created a Life Coaching program empowering Black boys and young men on how to honor themselves and their community

**Joe Sullivan** is a Catholic deacon who created a workshop that puts Catholic men to work in the fight against human trafficking.

## Gospel Meditation

A favorite motto of St. Teresa of Calcutta was, “do small things with great love.”

This is how it works in the kingdom of God. God can do tremendous things with the smallest gesture, especially when it is done in love. We can clearly see that our world is suffering greatly. People are struggling to find peace, navigate through conflicts, earn a sustainable living, find security and enough food to eat, and work through political tensions and conflicts.

In the light of the magnitude of the difficulties that exist around us and even within us, we can find ourselves floundering to discover practical, effective solutions. How can something so large be helped by someone as small and seemingly insignificant as me? While whole systems and structures may be out of the league of our personal influence, are we really that helpless in the midst of all of the turmoil, sadness, and suffering?

If we believe that God is with us and that God is still working to bring about the glory of God’s kingdom, then the answer is no. We are never helpless or without hope.

Armed with a strong life of prayer, we can always flee to God and ask for inspiration, wisdom, and especially love.

We are all blessed with unique gifts and talents and it often seems that considering all that the world lacks, love and charity remain at the top of the list. Life can easily become a battleground of hostility. Because life is challenging and difficult, anger is not far away. We see it on people’s faces and hear it in their voices. There is a measure of frustration that permeates all avenues of life. It is even felt in the air.

As people of faith, we know that what we see here is not the end but only a part of something far greater to come.

We know that God’s kingdom is where we are ultimately meant to be, and the Gospel is the way to get there.

If love and charity can prevail in us, then God will be able to do what God does best. God will use us to scatter the seeds of his kingdom. Through our small gestures, those seeds can receive the nurturing attention that is necessary for them to bear great fruit.

We cannot fall victim to the strife that is around us.

We have to keep ourselves refreshed and focused so that even in small ways, we can become part of the solution, not the problem.

Love and charity, which come from God, can help to heal the ills of the world.

May we bring these simple gifts to the everyday simple tasks of our lives!

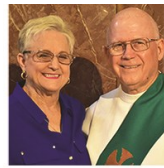

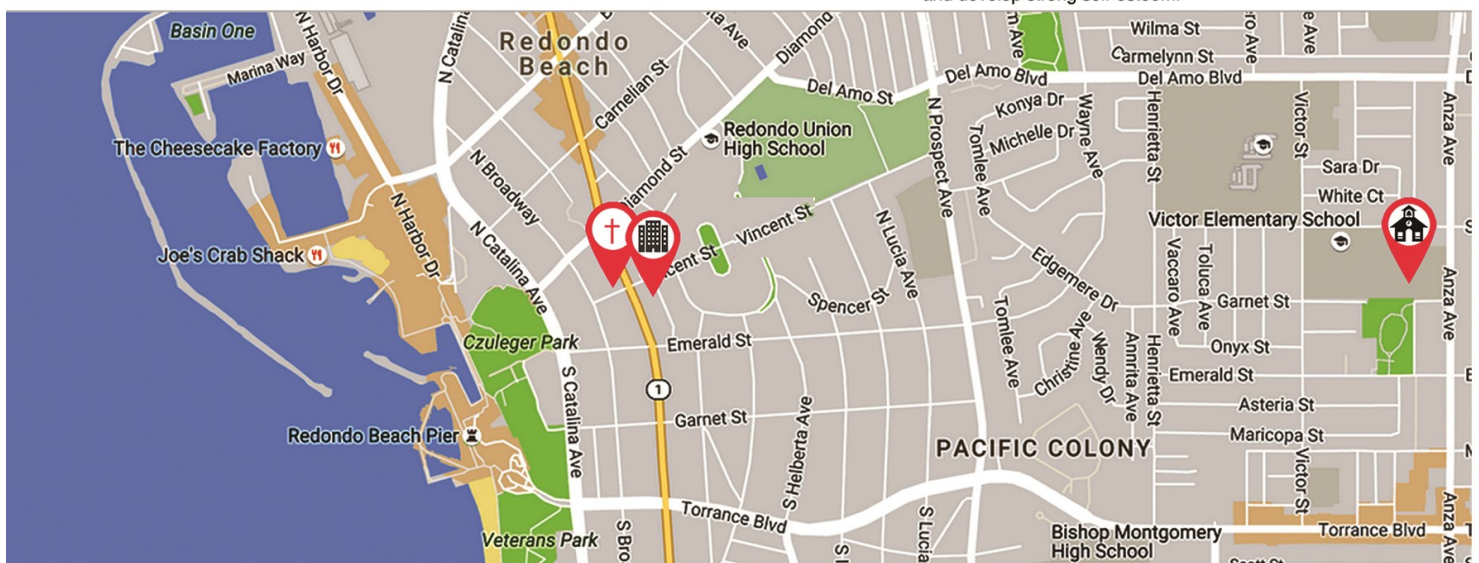
