Pastor's Corner

Celebrating Lives Lost Since Beginning of COVID

One of the very difficult experiences of these last 16 months has been the trauma of trying to care for loved ones in hospitals or care centers when no visitors were allowed. The heartache of separation was immense.

Even more difficult has been trying to mourn the loss of a loved one. It didn't matter whether the death was from COVID or not. With hospitals and retirement centers on lock-down, they all died alone, with only the overworked medical staff trying to give them comfort.

With mortuaries over-loaded, churches often closed, attendance restrictions everywhere, travel restrictions, self-quarantining, masks, cemeteries overwhelmed and funeral delays for weeks, and even months, our inability to honor and respect our loved ones tore our hearts open and deepened our sense of loss. This has not been easy.

It is so important for us now to take the time to honor all of those who have died since the beginning of COVID in March, 2020. On the weekend of **September 25, 26** we will remember our loved ones at all of our Masses that weekend.

Beginning now, we will create a **Wall of Remembrance** in the church to honor our parishioners, family members and friends—from anywhere in the world—who have died during the pandemic. We are asking you to e-mail



photos to us of those who have died and they will be printed and honored on our Wall of Remembrance leading up to our parish celebration.

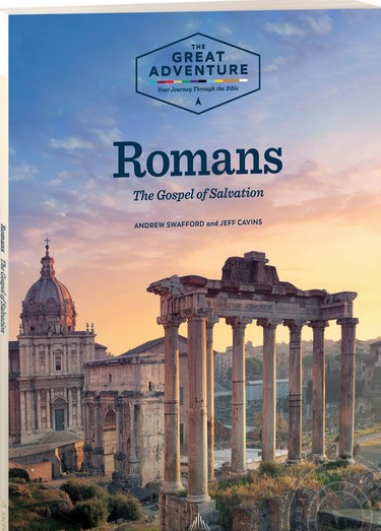

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* quotes Pope St. Paul VI on a subject related to a particular form of prayerful devotion. He called that devotion, “an epitome of the whole Gospel.” What is this devotion that embodies, typifies, exemplifies, and reaches its apotheosis in prayerful action?

A: Paul VI, pontiff during most of Vatican II, (he was canonized in 2018), was referring to the liturgical feasts dedicated to the Mother of God and to Marian Prayer, prayer such as the Rosary.

The *Catechism* marks this devotion to Mary in its section on “Christian Prayer,” highlighting the meditative forms of prayer in beautifully insightful terms:

“Meditation is above all a quest. The mind seeks to understand the why and how of Christian life. Meditation engages thought, imagination, emotion and desire. This mobilization of faculties is necessary in order to deepen our convictions of faith; above all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, as in lectio divina, or, the rosary. Pope Francis in October 2020 echoed those inspirational teachings of the *Catechism*:

“I invite you to pray the rosary, and to carry it in your hands or in your pockets. The recitation of the rosary is the most beautiful prayer we can offer to the Virgin Mary... (a) contemplation on the stages of the life of Jesus... a weapon that protects us from evils and temptations.”



Our Choir extols the spiritual connections found among those decades of the prayerful beads of the rosary, through music and the Latin text:

Salve Regina, mater misericordiae...
Hail Mary, mother and queen of tender mercy...

The rosary. A beautiful and engaging setting of meditative prayer that serves to deepen our convictions of faith.

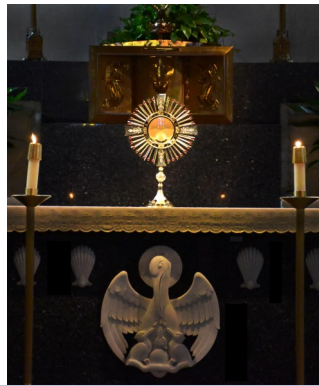

Gospel Meditation

“You cannot see the forest for the trees” is a widely known saying that can bring wisdom to our understanding of our journey. Often, our sight becomes limited to what is immediately before us. We lose touch with lessons and experiences from the past and promises and hope for the future. As human beings, we have the privilege of being able to choose things. What I like and don't like, want, and don't want can be major preoccupations of our minds and hearts. Our preferences and desires begin to define us more than the simple fact of our being. Who we are matters more than what we are or what we have. If we don't move beyond the external and superficial stuff to what really is of essence, we risk becoming very unsettled, disoriented, angry, and unhappy. We fail to see the bigger picture of hope and promise that lies ahead and the Divine Presence that has sustained and carried us before.

We like it when the “now” time of our lives satisfy us. Even the people who witnessed Jesus feed the five thousand got confused and distracted. It felt good when thousands of people were able to eat. They wanted to know what they could do to get this to happen again! But Jesus quickly reminds them that this is not the point of this sign. As much as the now time of our lives is of concern, it is not what is ultimately important. We need to learn the difference between being and doing, drawing more strength from who we are and who God is rather than what is happening around us and the choices we can make. Jesus is the true bread that came down from heaven. Jesus is the very incarnate presence of God who sustains life and assures us that we will not perish. This is not easy to understand and feel. We have to practice being in the presence of ourselves, others, creation, and God. We are brought to a holy place when we encounter the sacredness of being. This is real prayer.

Then, we learn to trust. It is when we cease trusting that we start to become afraid, uncertain, apprehensive, and doubtful, and overly self-concerned. We even start to grumble. God has our back. That is the essential powerful message of the living bread come down from heaven. God, who is alpha is also omega, the beginning and the end, and has everything in between in his care as well. A woman once remarked that her most powerful God moment happened when she and her husband cuddled with their new baby for a time. Without exchanging words and using only the affection communicated through sight and touch, they rested in being with each other. This brought them to the sacred, where they realized that a greater Being was with them. It was real. They knew that they were part of something bigger, intimate, and profound. When we rest in the Living Source of life, we will find that our souls are no longer hungry or thirsty.

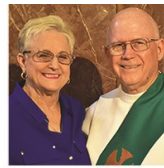

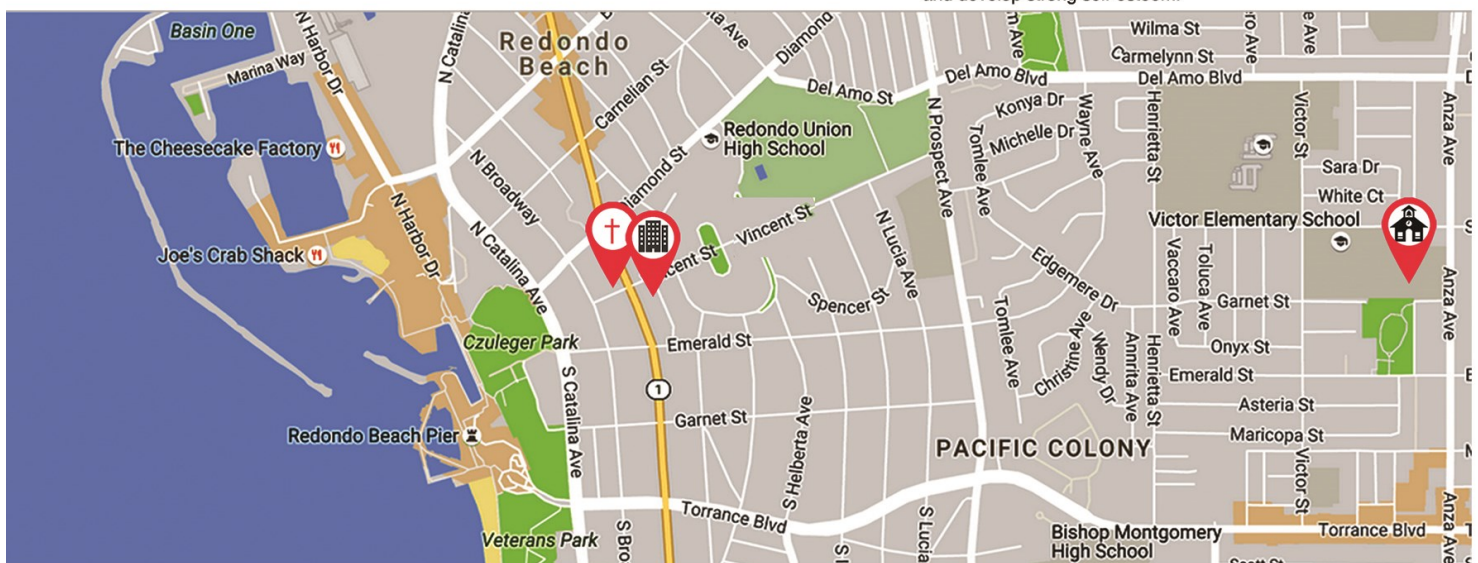
