Pastor's Corner

Celebrating Lives Lost Since Beginning of COVID

One of the very difficult experiences of these last 16 months has been the trauma of trying to care for loved ones in hospitals or care centers when no visitors were allowed. The heartache of separation was immense.

Even more difficult has been trying to mourn the loss of a loved one. It didn't matter whether the death was from COVID or not. With hospitals and retirement centers on lock-down, they all died alone, with only the overworked medical staff trying to give them comfort.

With mortuaries over-loaded, churches often closed, attendance restrictions everywhere, travel restrictions, self-quarantining, masks, cemeteries overwhelmed and funeral delays for weeks, and even months, our inability to honor and respect our loved ones tore our hearts open and deepened our sense of loss. This has not been easy.

It is so important for us now to take the time to honor all of those who have died since the beginning of COVID in March, 2020. On the weekend of **September 25, 26** we will remember our loved ones at all of our Masses that weekend.

Beginning now, we will create a **Wall of Remembrance** in the church to honor our parishioners, family members and friends—from anywhere in the world—who have died during the pandemic. We are asking you to e-mail



photos to us of those who have died and they will be printed and honored on our Wall of Remembrance leading up to our parish celebration.

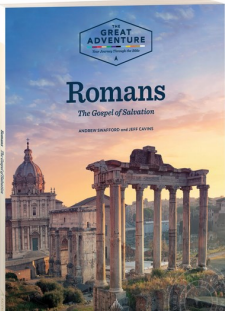

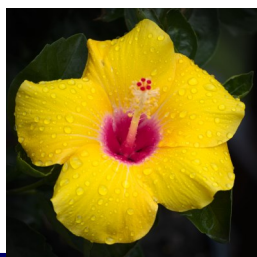

Q: In his sprawling novel of the French Revolution, *A Tale of Two Cities*, Charles Dickens writes about the events of an uncertain and tumultuous age, beginning with that familiar opening syllogism:

“It was the best of times, it was the worst of times, ... it was the spring of hope, it was the winter of despair...”

In these current, sometimes uncertain and tumultuous times, what does the Catholic Church offer in terms of a steadfast and authentically anchoring profession of faith and trust?

A: The *Catechism* looks to scripture for clarity and guidance, citing in Paragraph 346 the words of Hebrews and Jeremiah,

“In creation God laid a foundation and established laws that remain firm on which the believer can rely with confidence, for they are the sign and pledge of the unshakable faithfulness of God’s covenant.”

In this week’s readings we find Paul’s bottom line of essential reassurance for those in troubled times as he writes to the Romans:

“Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. Do what is good...there is no authority except from God. Instead, (as our Choir often sings), put on the Lord Jesus Christ.”

In the Lives of the Saints we review a case study of anxious times in Bethany when Lazarus was sick. Martha and Mary, each strong in faith, faced the uncertainty of outcomes in somewhat separate auras of faith. Practical Martha, (whose feast day falls this week), faced the uncertainty with busy, lavish service. Her sister Mary acted through silent waiting and adoration; each on their own terms, each faithful in service.

Our hymnal, in the section aptly called “Trust” gives us a song drawn from that anchoring profession of faith, here drawn from Isaiah and Luke. The words of **“Be Not Afraid”** address the most extreme challenges of uncertain times:

“If you stand before the power of hell and death is at your side, know that I am with you through it all.”

He truly is with us in the best of times and the worst of times.

Unshakable faith in the “spring” of hope.

Put on Christ, be not afraid.

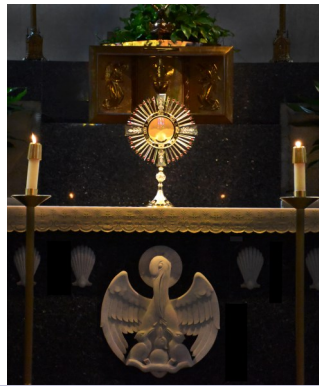

Gospel Meditation

The lens through which we view life makes a difference.



It also determines who we choose to learn from and what we allow to shape our thoughts and feelings. For many, life is simply what it appears to be, a given that either through evolution or some other means just came to be.

There is no apparent rhyme or reason to things and things can be dissected and understood only in terms of what they empirically present. To the person using this lens, a tree is a tree and a flower is a flower. Their composition and existence can be understood only to the extent that current human knowledge allows. Through this lens, what gives life purpose and meaning? This lens has an essentially unknown beginning and definite end. Once those are accepted, the middle becomes some kind of pursuit of happiness, with values and principles being things that are self-created and found acceptable.

But there is a Divine lens that also exists and deserves mention. It is found when one stumbles upon faith and begins to see things differently. This lens is of God and reveals a Divine Energy and Life that flows through and in all things. Faith then shows us that all that lives come from this one Source of Love. This is the only true lens that can give human beings the purpose and meaning they desperately need. From this perspective, all of life is much more than what is immediately apparent! It now tells and reveals a story about God generous, creative, and unconditional love! The unfolding of the human story is the unfolding of God's story. What meaning our lives have when they are viewed as a part of God's love affair with humanity! We are indeed special.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have? ©LPi

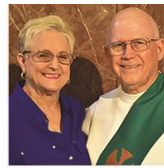
