## Pastor's Letter

### Mission Appeal Supporting Diocese of Idukki, India

Next weekend we will have our special annual Mission Co-Op appeal. Monsignor Fleming of the Archdiocese Mission Office is asking us to support the Diocese of Idukki in India. Father Soney Sebastian will be here to celebrate Mass with us and to preach at all Masses. Special Mission Co-Op envelopes will be in the pews for their financial support.

In anticipation of his visit with us, Father Soney has given me a short description of the needs of Idukki and I would like to share his letter with you. He writes:

The diocese of Idukki is situated on the eastern part of Kerala, South India covering about 1,500 sq. miles (nearly twice the size of Orange County), and it extends into the mountains of Kerala. It has a total population of about 7 million out of which 3 million are Catholics, 1 million other Christians and 3 million Hindus and Muslims. In addition, there are nearly 16,000 tribal people living within its boundaries.

Many Catholics of Idukki are the second-generation descendants of migrants from other parts of Kerala who are dependent on agriculture and farming. Though the land and climate is good for spices, they depend on seasonal rain, and often the crops fail due to poor monsoons, flooding or other natural calamites like landslides. Poverty is rampant and living conditions are meager. Transportation is difficult due to mountainous terrain and the poor condition of roads.

There are 105 parishes and 52 fast growing mission stations in the diocese. The diocese is blessed with good and hard-working priests. There are 206 priests and 121 seminarians under different stages of formation.

The unique situation of the people necessitates a total and committed pastoral service. The main thrust of the mission is evangelization through parishes, mission centers and educational institutions but the priests must undertake various apostolates of humanitarian and charitable activities because of the extreme poverty and the inability of government to provide care. The diocese has multiple institutions and organizations to improve the life of the poor.

A major part of the agricultural land is used for cardamom plantations. Unfortunately, the overuse of pesticides makes the air as well as the water polluted. The workers who daily breathe this polluted air and drink polluted water easily fall prey to cancer.

Early detection of cancer is a great need. For this we are planning to have free medical checkup camps. We are also running a program to educate people to prevent pollution of water and air by not using all the strong pesticides.

Often the cancer is diagnosed at a late stage when only a little can be done to save their lives. The high cost of treatment and medicine and the absence of a medical insurance system leads to early death. Pain Management and Palliative Care for cancer patients during their treatment is a pressing need.

Thirty-two parishes now have mobile units for pain management and palliative care. Volunteers are trained for the service and they visit people regularly who are bed-ridden at their homes. We intend to support these units by providing them travel and medical facilities . We also need to have constant training programs for the volunteers by trained medical personnel.

In the spirit of St. Theresa of Calcutta in caring for the poor, the help from this Mission Appeal will be used primarily for supporting the palliative care units with travel and medical facility, for giving ongoing formation for the volunteers and conducting seminars on environmental pollution and cancer prevention.

Our heartfelt gratitude for your generosity. May the Lord continue to bless you abundantly and keep you safe and protected.



### Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

**Q:** While enjoying the daily blessings of our lives we also try to persevere in the face of challenges, great and small; it's a familiar, venerable scenario.

This week's scripture readings from the Book of Kings take us nearly 3,000 years into the past to empathize with a challenged, frightened and frustrated Elijah, whom we find under a broom tree in a desert wilderness near the southern border of Judah. Fleeing from the evil Queen Jezebel, Elijah reaches his limit, lays down, and asks God to take his life.

Thinking momentarily that he's done, Elijah, amid his fears and uncertainty is ministered to by angels and rises from his affliction to travel an additional 40 days and nights in the desert, arriving at his destination, Mt. Horeb, and onto further prophetic accomplishments.

How can we identify with the experiences and saintly calling of Elijah?

**A:** The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops writes:

"Every Christian is called to holiness, namely to become a saint..."

We can identify with Elijah and the entire cloud of witnesses through the Good News of scripture: Psalm 34 in the readings this week says that,

"the afflicted,(like Elijah), are heard by God."

Matthew Kelly wrote, in Rediscover the Saints,

"We are capable of so much more than we think.

The saints ...inspire us to bold action."

Reverend Alban Butler in a discussion of the lives of the saints wrote:

"To honor the martyrs...we must learn their spirit and study to imitate them according to their circumstances. We must, like them, resist evil, must subdue our passions, suffer afflictions with patience and bear with others...The cross is the ladder by which we must ascend to heaven."

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches about the intercession of the saints:

"[They] fix the whole Church more firmly in holiness...
our communion with the saints joins us to Christ..."

\*Oscar Wilde, Irish poet and dramatist, wrote:

"Every Saint has a past and every sinner has a future."

Matthew Kelly put it simply:

"The saints show us what is possible."

May an appreciation of saintly possibilities find us, by the grace of God, overcoming adversity and affliction as we live out our vocation as Christians; vocation defined as "a calling to God's service."

Yes, yes, yes.


