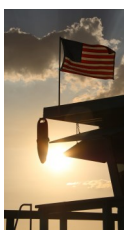

Children's Liturgy of the Word

We encourage you to worship together as a family on Sundays during our **10am Family Mass**. CLOW uses the Children's Lectionary (shorter, simplified readings tailored to little listeners!) and features a homily specifically addressed to young people. CLOW will start again on **October 3, 2021**.

About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the **10am. Masses in the Parish Hall**. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level.

Children, ages 4-8, are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word. We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful. They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

Process during Mass

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

We are currently looking for leaders and teen volunteers to help with this ministry. The leaders for the Liturgy of the Word for children receive special training and resources. We will have two adult leaders who prepare for this special ministry with children.

Each Liturgy of the Word leader must have a current Virtus[®] certificate prior to working with the children and must be fingerprinted by the Archdiocese.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered most Sundays at 10am Mass. Please check the bulletin for details.

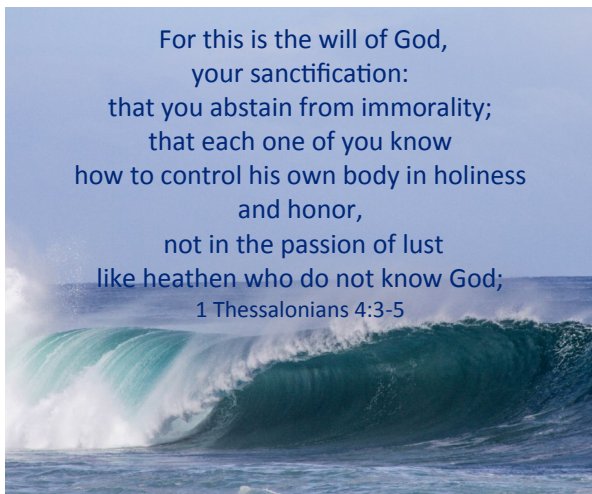

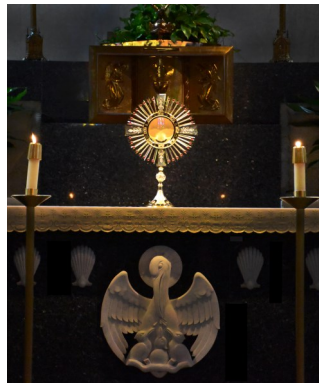

A Companion on your Journey

As we walk with others who hurt and ache, we as Stephen Ministers pray that our hearts will be warm with compassion and understanding. We are happy to be with you in your time of need. **310.541.1403**, a confidential, dedicated phone message line.

From the time we are born into this world until we die, our human radar picks up signals about how to respond to life.

What we picked up on when we were very young carries an even greater power. The messages we receive and process tell us what we are “supposed” to do with our feelings, how to understand and cope with disappointment, anxiety, failure, death, illness, and what to expect out of life. As life unfolds for us, these radar messages kick in and resonate in us at very deep levels. Sometimes what we have learned is helpful and sometimes it is not. The stories we have been told, especially when we are young, about how life is best lived and how to negotiate its pain carry a heavy weight.

Life can be challenging and frightening.

Sometimes, it really hurts to be a human being. It also can be quite unpredictable and, at times, unfair. We face our vulnerability and brokenness of all kinds: physical, emotional, and spiritual. It doesn't take much for life to quickly fall apart. What we knew to be familiar and true is gone and something we relied upon, physically, emotionally, or spiritually, can be taken away. It is hard to confront our limitations and sit with our incompleteness.

Often, life hurts us so much that we find ourselves sitting in a pool of sadness, not sure what we are supposed to do. It is particularly hard when the signals we have inherited tell us that we need to be successful in what we do, and we have to avoid life's unfairness. We can feel like a failure, wondering what precisely we did to deserve this fate, or ruminate about what we did not do correctly.

But it's really not about us. We are part of a bigger picture and a much more fascinating story!

If we cease doing battle with life's incompleteness and see ourselves, as God does, on a journey toward wholeness and completeness we can better accept our disappointments and stand firm. The prophets told us, and Jesus reassured us:

Be strong! Fear not!

Sometimes we have to update our stories and replace them with newer, more accurate ones. When we make God's story our own and tune our radar into His voice, what we hear is all about restoration, healing, and rejuvenation! This is true even when we think we have hit rock bottom and can go no further. There is always hope. Remember the words of Julian of Norwich: God made us, God loves us, and God keeps us. Now, listen to God when He says,

“be opened!”

Q: Pope Francis has designated this as the “Year of St. Joseph.”

He is Patron of the Universal Church. *The Catechism* acknowledges that people are sometimes troubled by the silence of the Gospels and Epistles regarding the formative circumstances of Jesus' early life. We do know that Joseph is celebrated as a model of obedience, humility, and duty, performed amid the background of a largely hidden, silent life of devotion. Looking at the offerings of a continuum of faith, we could ask:

Do the components of a 21st century ongoing pandemic have rather specific spiritual connectivity across the ages, back to a 1st century husband and carpenter who lived in Nazareth?

A: Yes, that connectivity is there! The Church, through its *Catechism*, scripture, sacred music, and spiritual writings serves to illuminate those connections and related lessons of divinity and humanity which are ever-present in good times, and even more blessedly, in times of uncertainty and extraordinary challenges. The Jesuit review *America* writes:

“Joseph's example and patronage come at a perfect time. At a time when a global pandemic has forced millions to live hidden away, isolated and alone, we can see Joseph as a model of the hidden life...we can see him as our patron, too, praying for us as he understands our struggles with illness.”

The spiritual writings also point out that, “...the sadness that surrounded the early death of Joseph is similar to the sadness of these many months that surrounds the deaths and grief, often in isolation, of so many from COVID.”

Composer Michael Card wrote a hymn, “St. Joseph's Song”, that reaches across millennia and back to touch our searching hearts with lyrics projecting potentially similar emotions felt by the husband of Mary as he sought to do the will of God:

“How could it be? Father show me where I fit into this plan of yours...How can it be?”

Joseph is there for us, steady as ever, hidden yet at the same time visible, a model of selfless love; the kind of love that Pope Francis reflected upon in his apostolic letter, “*Patris Corde*”, “with a Father's heart.”

It's a heart with sustaining love and devotion, reaching each of us across the vicissitudes of time.

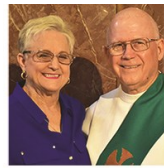

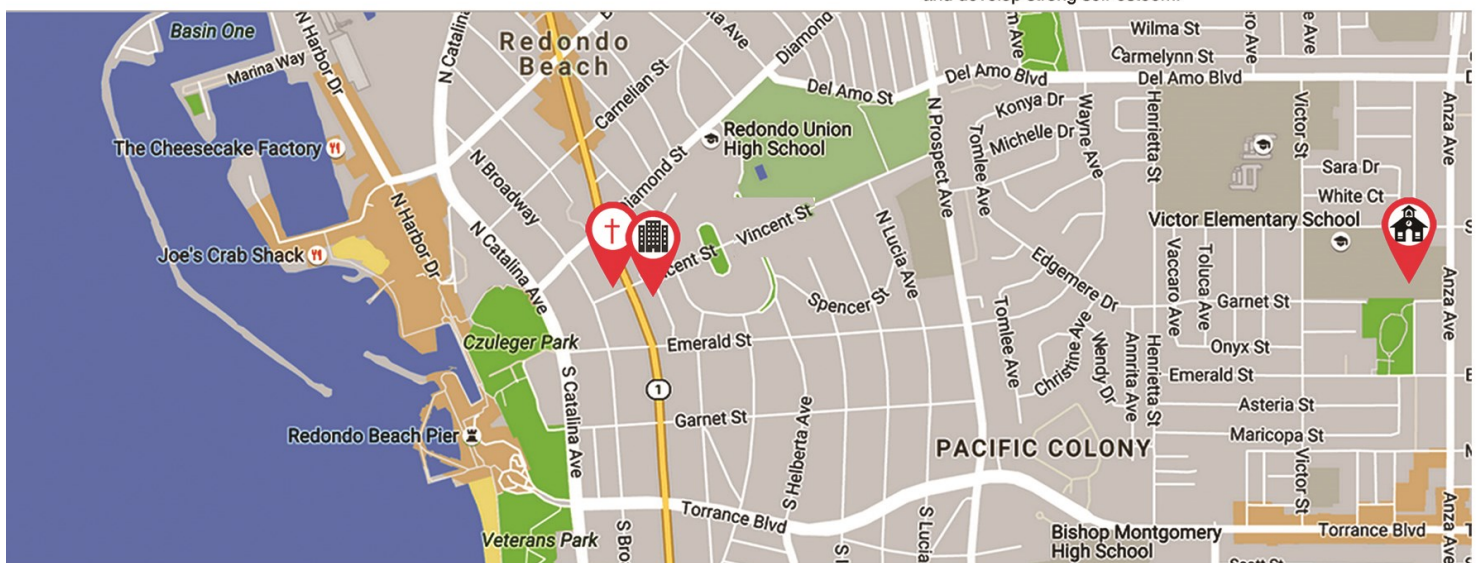
