Los Angeles Archdiocese Celebrates 250 Years

This week the Archdiocese of Los Angeles will launch the "Forward in Mission" Jubilee Year in honor of the 250th anniversary of the founding of Mission San Gabriel Arcángel, the birthplace of Christian faith in Los Angeles.

During this year of Jubilee, September 11, 2021 through September 10, 2022, all are invited to commemorate this historic occasion by praying for spiritual renewal in our local Church. Our focus will be: To revive the life of faith in the Archdiocese of Los Angeles through the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the raising up of a new generation of missionary disciples.

The Jubilee Opening Mass with the Rite of the Opening of the Holy Doors of the Cathedral happened this Saturday at 11 am. In addition, 22 churches have been designated as Pilgrimage sites throughout the archdiocese.

There will be activities and prayer throughout the Jubilee Year and we invite you to open your hearts to celebrate with us as we give thanks for the proclamation of the Gospel in Los Angeles with the beginning of the Franciscan mission churches in California.



Children's Liturgy of the Word

We encourage you to worship together as a family on Sundays during our **10am Family Mass**. CLOW uses the Children's Lectionary (shorter, simplified readings tailored to little listeners!) and features a homily specifically addressed to young people. CLOW will start again on **October 3, 2021**.

About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the **10am. Masses in the Parish Hall**. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level. **Children, ages 4-8,** are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word. We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful. They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

Process during Mass

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

We are currently looking for leaders and teen volunteers to help with this ministry. The leaders for the Liturgy of the Word for children receive special training and resources. We will have two adult leaders who prepare for this special ministry with children.

Each Liturgy of the Word leader must have a current Virtus® certificate prior to working with the children and must be fingerprinted by the Archdiocese.

Gospel Meditation

We need to get our bearings straight and properly lay life's cornerstone.

Otherwise, the rest of our journey will be skewed, and our judgment clouded. We can recall Jesus' famous rebuke of Peter,

"You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

Even he, as one of Jesus' closest friends struggles with understanding things and grasping the big picture.

Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) a renowned and learned French Jesuit priest often has these words attributed to him:

"We are not human beings having a spiritual experience."

We are spiritual beings having a human experience."

Whether they were actually from his lips, they certainly mimic his thought. These wise words orient us and capture the essence of who we really are.

Many people consider spirituality an option.

It is no wonder that they come to this conclusion when they predominantly define themselves using human terms and concepts. Immersed in this world view, they struggle finding any semblance of God because God does not work according to human expectations!

This is especially true when suffering and death enter life's picture.

If we are only human beings having a spiritual experience, then we wrongly expect our spirituality to serve us as we desire. The human expectation is that my spiritual life is something that is useful in avoiding pain, hardship, and death, not something that gives the courage to live through it!

So, when we protest and get upset with God because our journey is becoming difficult, painful, treacherous, disappointing, and even pointing us toward death, Jesus rebukes us as he did Peter and gently reminds us how to see.

It is God who inspires and opens hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, the true meaning of things is understood, and we receive a depth of insight and understanding that is not found following purely human paths.

It is not our task to understand God, as God is beyond human understanding. Ours is the joyful privilege of simply resting in God's presence simply because God is God and we are who we are. As spiritual beings having an exciting and adventurous human experience, it is in our DNA to do so.

Through prayer we can let go and let be.

This is how we lose our lives but then save them.

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: In an early Sunday morning homily, Father Thaddeus was bringing the pages of the Bible to life for our edification and application.

He spoke about being aware of some impediments and distractions along our road of repentance and faith which may serve to challenge our journey to God.

Father preached about some long ago examples of Jesus' ministry in Galilee, highlighting three who did not divert their commitment of faith, as we read in sacred scripture:

The faithful woman who, amid surging crowds, focused on a cure by touching the cloak of Jesus; the deaf man with a speech impediment whom Jesus healed after pulling him away from the impedimentary nature of a crowd in the district of the Decapolis near the Sea of Galilee; and Zacchaeus, the tax man who acted as a result of his personal impediment of short stature by climbing a sycamore tree, undistracted, to connect with the savior.

What else does the Church say about what the Apostle Paul proclaimed back in the first century, proclaiming the grace of scripture, or as he referred to the gospel, "the good news?"

A: In Paragraph 104 the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says, "In Sacred Scripture, the Church constantly finds her nourishment and her strength...In the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them."

Pope John Paul II wrote about reading the Bible:

"From the word of Jesus we learn the very nature of God..."

"From the word of Jesus we know our eternal destiny..."

"From the word of Jesus we learn true dignity..."

"From the word of Jesus we learn how we must behave..."

"From the word of Jesus we know his presence..."

As Father Thaddeus was reminding parishioners in his homily, and as St. Paul is quoted in Colossians Chapter 1:

"Persevere in the faith, firmly grounded, stable, and not shifting from the hope of the Gospel."
