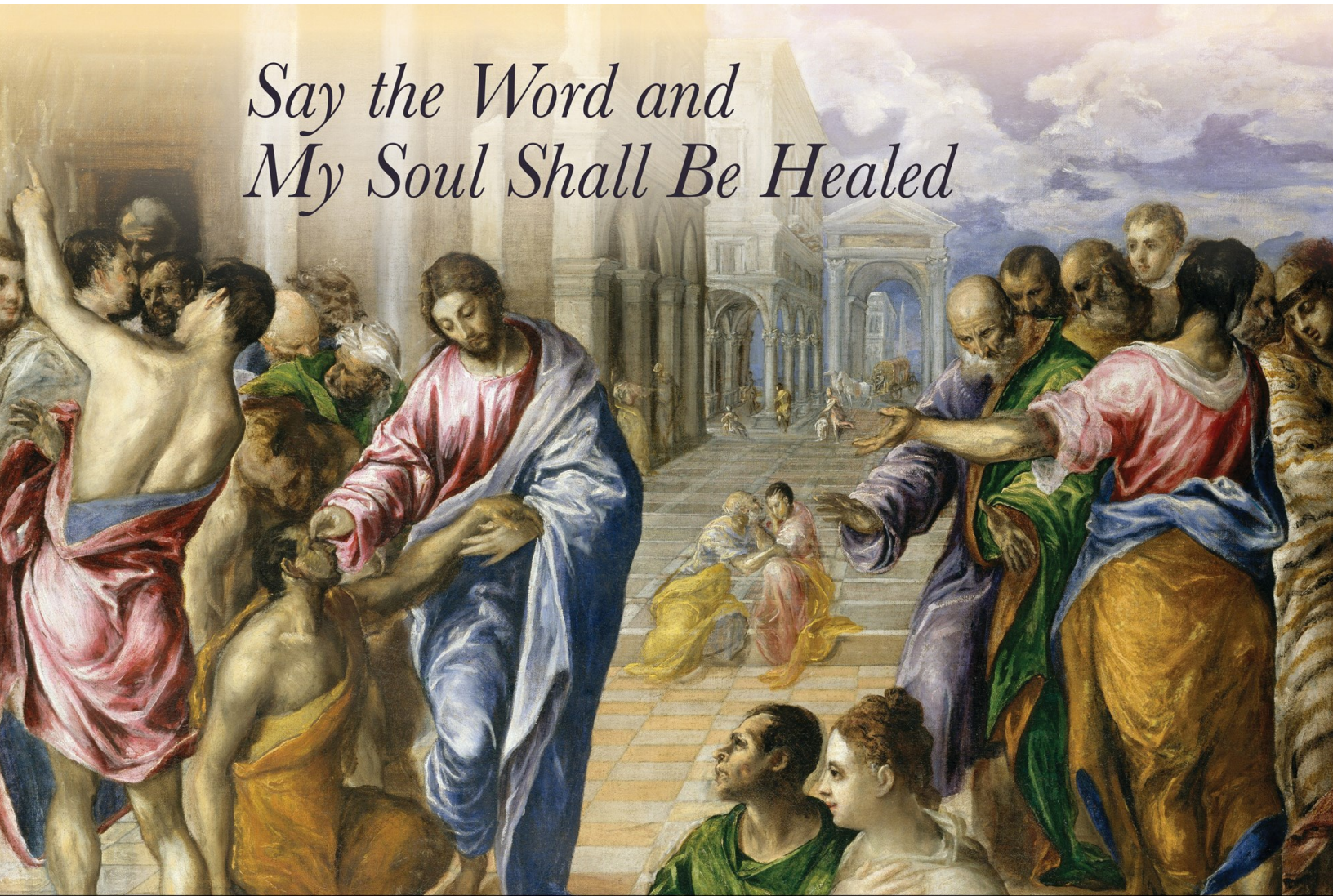
On this day, catechists are formally commissioned for ministry to the community.

So many people have been touched by the first phase of our Wall of Remembrance and we know that as it grows it will become of source of prayer and healing for us all.

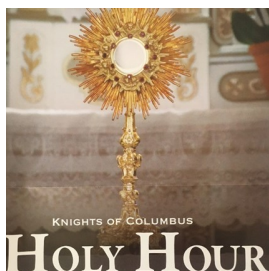
This wall of photos honors all our parishioners, family members and friends from around the world who have died since the beginning of COVID in March, 2020 to today. Some had COVID, but most did not.

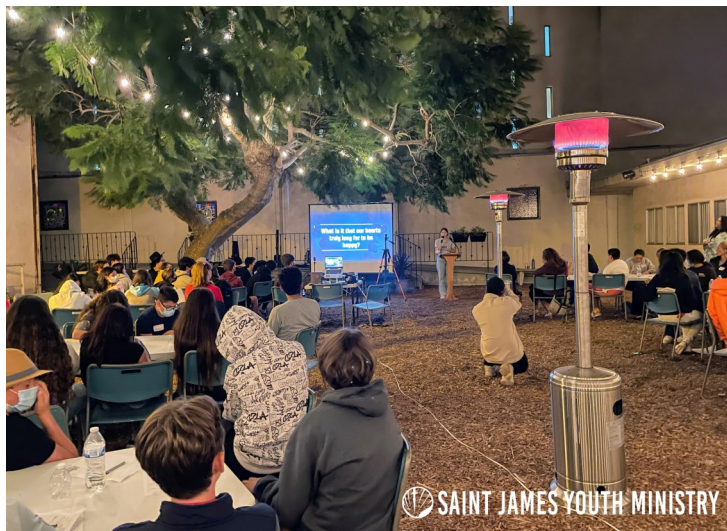

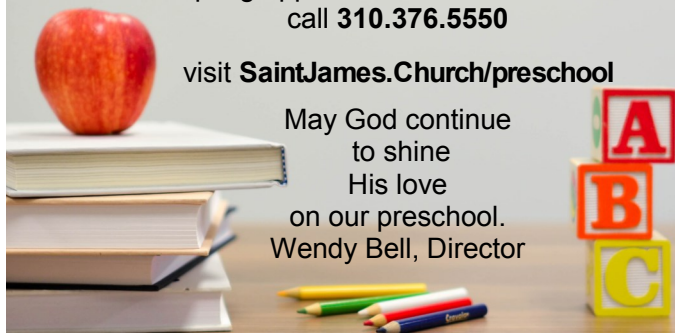

Children's Liturgy of the Word

We encourage you to worship together as a family on Sundays during our **10am Family Mass**. CLOW uses the Children's Lectionary (shorter, simplified readings tailored to little listeners!) and features a homily specifically addressed to young people. CLOW will start again on **October 3, 2021**.

About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the **10am. Masses in the Parish Hall**. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level.

Children, ages 4-8, are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word. We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful. They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

Process during Mass

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

We are currently looking for leaders and teen volunteers to help with this ministry. The leaders for the Liturgy of the Word for children receive special training and resources. We will have two adult leaders who prepare for this special ministry with children.

Each Liturgy of the Word leader must have a current Virtus[®] certificate prior to working with the children and must be fingerprinted by the Archdiocese.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered most Sundays at 10am Mass. Please check the bulletin for details.

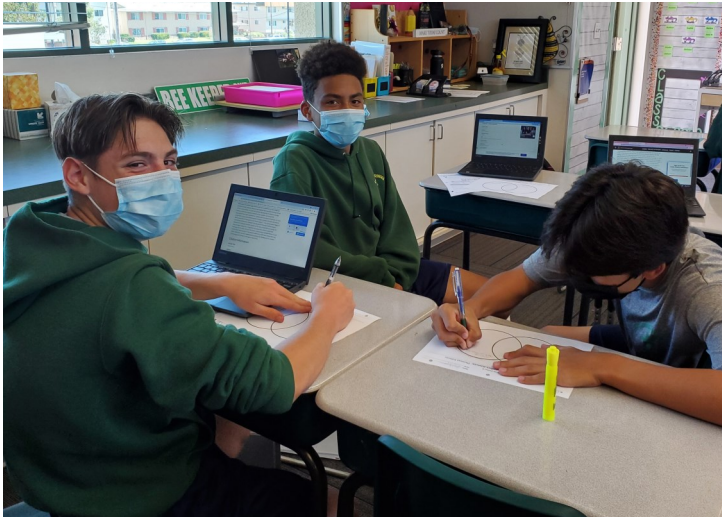

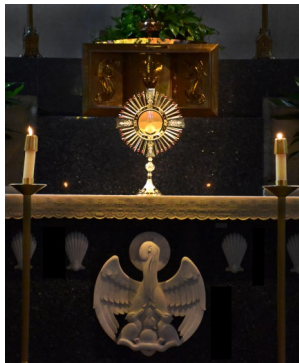

There is something about being first.

Whether it be first in line, first to be picked for the team, or the first one to finish their work, great satisfaction is achieved. Our egos love being first. It somehow sets us apart from everyone else, gives us a sense of pride and positions us to feel better than others. When we are first, we can glory in our efforts, skills, and achievements.

Isn't that what really matters?

After all, we are taught from a very young age to be proficient, stay on top, be the best at what we do, and win the praise and esteem of others. This is the stuff that makes us successful and provides us with a comfortable, satisfying life.

Jesus wants none of it. All of the details we anguish over mean little to the kingdom of God. You want to be first?

Then, be a servant and welcome a child. All of this is the opposite of our often vehement pursuits. If we are serious about following Jesus and living the Gospel, then we must put the needs of others before our own. If we continue to listen only to the noise of the world, we are going to continue to believe the illusions we inherit. Those illusions come in many forms, but all have things in common: me before you, being on top and not the bottom, us versus them, personal security over universal harmony and peace.

When are we going to learn that always striving to be the best and first is an empty pursuit in our struggle for happiness?

While satisfying our ego with this momentary boost of esteem may feel good for a moment, is it what we really desire?

If we can break from the world's noise and create a space of sacred silence in our lives, we can begin to listen and see that we are being called in another direction. What we really desire is not the bolstering of our egos but the innocence we lost somewhere along the way. When we can be playful, joyful, and even somewhat carefree, life is good. We want our relationships to work, a place to call home, and to live peaceful lives with our sisters and brothers. Only a servant can do this.

The servant's prayer seeks to detach from self-concern in order to be used by God. Rather than worrying about being first and coming out on top, we can be inspired, guided, empowered, and led to do good works. Stop worrying about being first and put greater energy into feeling joy.

Q: In the classic Dickens novel, *Great Expectations*, the protagonist is a boy called Pip, who is marked early on as one who will meet and exceed the standards of secular society to the highest levels. His journey is replete with perils, emotional extremes, treacherous betrayal, regrets, reformation and a measure of redemption, all the while largely falling short of some of those great expectations.

That fictional scenario reminds us that great, (and extraordinary), expectations are placed upon each of us as part of our universal spiritual journey. As we move toward that plane of realization of purpose, what does the Church include as some of the essential elements necessary for fulfillment of those greater spiritual expectations?

A: Among the teachings of the Church on this subject concerning what is expected of us, we find in Paragraphs #1273, 1274, and 1276 of *The Catechism of The Catholic Church*, beautifully clarifying summary paragraphs of guidance that our hero, Pip, would have done well to follow:

"Incorporated into the Church by Baptism, the faithful have received the sacramental character that consecrates them for Christian religious worship. The baptismal seal enables and commits Christians to serve God by a vital participation in the holy liturgy of the Church and to exercise their baptismal priesthood by the witnesses of holy lives and practical charity...The faithful Christian who has "kept the seal", until the end, remaining faithful to the demands of his baptism will be able to depart this life with the sign of faith...in expectation of the blessed vision of God...in the hope of resurrection."

Further expectations are found in Matthew 28, in the words of Jesus: "...observe all that I have commanded you."

Composer Tom Kendzia adds to this matrix, or formative element of expectations, with movingly spiritual lyrics: "By name we are called, from water we are sent: to become the eyes and hands of Christ."

To serve God and to seek resurrection by the witness of a holy life, in expectation of the blessed vision of God; these are truly some of the great expectations and commitments of our faith.

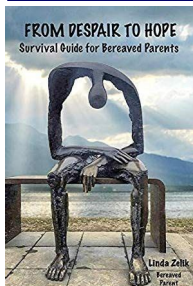

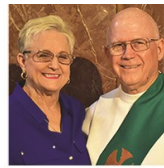

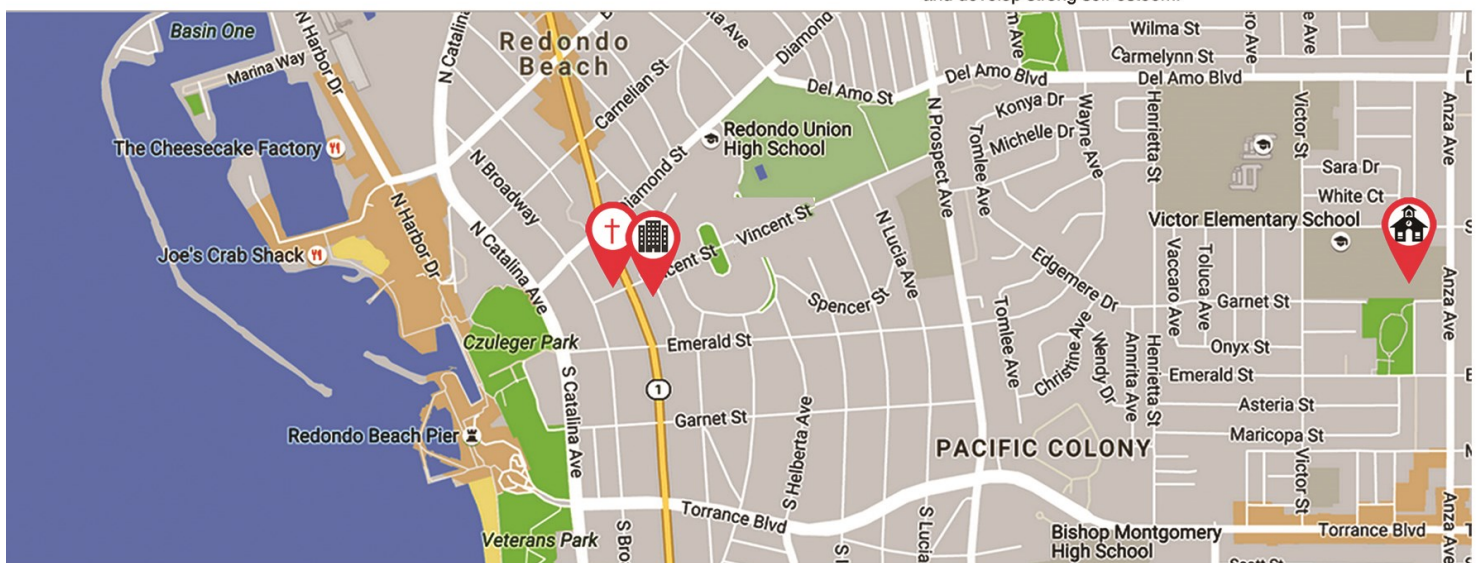
