Pastor's Letter

Blessing of Our Wall of Remembrance

We are so thankful that the COVID numbers are going down and for so many of our parishioners who have received the vaccine to help everyone stay safe.

Only a very few have contacted us regarding a 'religious exemption' from getting the vaccine, but with Pope Francis calling upon all Catholics of the world to get vaccinated and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and our own Archbishop Gomez encouraging all to get vaccinated, it is obvious that there is no 'religious exemption'. In fact, it has become a 'moral imperative' for all to get vaccinated—not just for themselves, but more for the protection of their family, co-workers, friends and neighbors and everyone any of them may come in contact with, whose lives are put in danger by someone not being vaccinated.

May our prayer for them bring them more fully into the arms of our loving Father and may we find consolation and help in God's tender compassion for us all.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

We encourage you to worship together as a family on Sundays during our **10am Family Mass.** CLOW uses the Children's Lectionary (shorter, simplified readings tailored to little listeners!) and features a homily specifically addressed to young people. CLOW will start again on **October 3, 2021.**

About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the **10am. Masses in the Parish Hall**. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level. **Children, ages 4-8**, are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word. We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful. They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

Process during Mass

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

We are currently looking for leaders and teen volunteers to help with this ministry. The leaders for the Liturgy of the Word for children receive special training and resources. We will have two adult leaders who prepare for this special ministry with children.

Each Liturgy of the Word leader must have a current Virtus[®] certificate prior to working with the children and must be fingerprinted by the Archdiocese.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered most Sundays at 10am Mass. Please check the bulletin for details.

Gospel Meditation

What are the little ones?

They are the poor, the marginalized, the women and men at the well, the Zacchaeus' looking for Jesus from a tree, those mired in sin, the blind who want to see, and the lame who want to walk. They are the lepers and the different ones who have been told that they are unclean, and the ones who suffer from abuse and grave injustices and oppression. They are children who want nothing more than to be loved and enjoy celebrating their innocence. These are all the little ones and they are all vulnerable. Life already brings them burdens, we don't need to add to them.

St. Oscar Romero said, "When the church hears the cry of the oppressed it cannot but denounce the social structures that give rise to and perpetuate the misery from which the cry arises." Why are so many people still so gravely hurting? We have the resources and the means to make things better. We choose not to. There are still those things called greed, pride, lust, apathy, jealously, gluttony, and anger that prevent us from seeing each other and people to be loved and not objects to be used. Is this how God intended things to be?

God loves what is good and upright. It doesn't matter who did it or where it came from. In God's eyes, the end result is always faith, hope, and love. Those will always unite a person with God. We fill our lives with many things that are not good either for ourselves or for others. All of us have to work to discover what it is, exactly, that leads to the world's brokenness. There are people, systems, and ideologies in place that foster oppression and injustice rather than equity and fairness. Sadly, our complacency can be the greatest evil. Turning a blind eye, ignoring the truth, and believing that we are helpless to fix so great a problem, does little to move us closer to the kingdom of God. As members of the Body of Christ, we cannot condone anything that keeps people in misery.

As it is said, charity begins at home. Perhaps a good place to start is with our own households and making sure their foundations are properly laid.

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: "And when we cried unto the Lord, he heard our voice, and sent an angel..." That scriptural excerpt from a verse in Numbers 20 refers to the bringing forth of a people out of Egypt. Part of that deliverance was of an angelic nature. How does the Church teach and celebrate these celestial beings called angels?

A: *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* provides many entries on the Church's teachings about Angels:

"The existence of spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls "angels" is a truth of faith."

" Angels are spiritual creatures who glorify God without ceasing and who serve his saving plans..."

"The Church venerates the angels who help her on her earthly pilgrimage and protect every human being." Catholic related readings also attest that since the 4th century, nine "choirs" or types of angels are identified in the Bible: The "seraphim" angels or "burning ones" have the most intense "flaming" love for God. The "cherubim" are related to "fullness of wisdom." The "thrones" order of angels symbolize divine justice and judicial power in contemplation of God's power and justice. The "dominions" type of angels evoke authority and govern

the lesser choirs of angels. Sacred scripture identifies by name three angels, whom we celebrate in our liturgical calendar on September 29 in the Feast of the Archangels. Archangels are the great messengers of God:

St. Michael, mentioned in the Apocalypse as the leader of the heavenly host. St. Gabriel, the bearer of the Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Sr. Raphael, the angel who healed Tobit of his blindness. Many more spiritually inspirational deeds of these and other angels are to be found in the Church reference literature.

The readings also point out that we are conscious of the angels in the liturgy: At Mass before the Eucharistic prayer we join with all the angels and saints to sing the hymn of praise, "Holy, holy, holy..." In Eucharistic Prayer I, the priest prays, "Almighty God, we pray that your angel may take this sacrifice to your altar in heaven." In the Funeral Liturgy, the priest prays, "May the angels lead you into paradise..."

In the catechism we find St. Thomas Aquinas: "The angels work together for the benefit of us all." St. Augustine notes: "Angel is the name of their office, not of their nature...they are spirit...servants and messengers of God; the whole life of the Church benefits from the mysterious and powerful help of angels." That help includes announcing salvation; their song of praise at the birth of Christ; guarding the gates of paradise; or staying Abraham's hand from harming Isaac. Angels are further described in the catechism as evangelical beings, proclaiming the Good News of Christ's Incarnation and Resurrection. "In Paradisum deducant te angeli..."




