the company of the saints in heaven.



Children's Liturgy of the Word

We encourage you to worship together as a family on Sundays during our **10am Family Mass**. CLOW uses the Children's Lectionary (shorter, simplified readings tailored to little listeners!) and features a homily specifically addressed to young people. CLOW will start again on **October 3, 2021**.

About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the **10am. Masses in the Parish Hall**. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level.

Children, ages 4-8, are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word. We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful. They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

Process during Mass

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

We are currently looking for leaders and teen volunteers to help with this ministry. The leaders for the Liturgy of the Word for children receive special training and resources. We will have two adult leaders who prepare for this special ministry with children.

Each Liturgy of the Word leader must have a current Virtus® certificate prior to working with the children and must be fingerprinted by the Archdiocese.

Children's Liturgy of the Word is offered most Sundays at 10am Mass. Please check the bulletin for details.



A Companion on your Journey

As we walk with others who hurt and ache, we as Stephen Ministers pray that our hearts will be warm with compassion and understanding. We are happy to be with you in your time of need. **310.541.1403**, a confidential, dedicated phone message line.

Archbishop Fulton Sheen said, "It takes three to make love, not two: you, your spouse, and God."

Apart from the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ, nothing speaks better of God's incarnate love than marriage. God designed it this way. We place great value on love and rightly so. What we fail to realize, however, is that love, its very presence and place in our lives, is not simply part of the human package deal.

Love comes from God. It is one of God's greatest gifts to human beings. When we begin to realize that our very ability to love is sacred, it changes up how we see the essence of life, and purpose and sanctity of marriage.

God is love. It stands to reason then that if we follow the path of unconditional, self-emptying love we will then stumble upon God. It is precisely this intimate wedding of God with love that gives such eloquence and honor to the love between husband and wife. As a living sign of Christ's love for the Church and for humanity, husbands and wives speak volumes of God's unconditional incarnate love for all of his children! The Divine power that brings unity and life to marriage is so strong that once joined, it really cannot be separated.

Admittedly, marriage covenants can be extremely difficult



to negotiate and, at times, very painful to experience. God's perfect divinity always meets our broken and

imperfect humanity. God is okay with this setup as he created it this way. Our loving is never as unconditional as God's and often tainted by our own imperfections, needs, memories, hurts, sinfulness, and weakness.

All of this baggage negatively impacts even the most well-intentioned marriages, causing them to be hurtful and empty. We are love works in progress. God can succeed in perfecting our love only if we keep our eyes fixed on him as the source of that love. That's why marriage is always about three and not just two.

The Divine intimacy at the heart of marriage is what can make them celebrations of great union and happiness. Couples who are still madly in love with each other after many years, still looking at each other with that timeless twinkle in their eyes, best tell the story of God's oneness with humanity. Honor, celebrate, and support those who have accepted a vocation to marriage. Living in a world that easily pulls relationships apart, may they find hope and inspiration from their faith companions who are on the same journey!

Q: Part of our Church Mission statement includes a motivating spirit of evangelization of the body of Christ, his Church. In the section of our hymnal entitled "Unity" we find a Marty Haugen song, "*We Are Many Parts.*" Our choir beautifully interprets the lyrics of this powerful musical composition; words that authentically link key thematic elements of scripture-based ecumenism, evangelization, and an organically unified Church being true to its mission:

"We are many parts, we are all one body, and the gifts we have we are given to share. May the Spirit of love make us one indeed; one, the love that we share, one our hope in despair, one the cross that we bear."

On this topic of Christian unity, the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* Subject Index reads:

"Unity, Christian: see Ecumenism"

What does the Church say about unity and the love and hope that we share?

A: The Vatican writes that Christian unity can be achieved, "...only as a fruit of prayer." The United States Conference Of Catholic Bishops writes: "Ecumenism, from the Greek word "oikoumene," meaning "the whole inhabited world," is the promotion of cooperation and unity among Christians. Jesus Christ founded one Church."

St. Paul, writing to the Corinthians: "...I appeal to you ...that you be united in the same purpose." Saint Pope John Paul II wrote: "...the way of ecumenism, (the movement promoting Christian unity), is the "way of the Church."

Pope Francis adds:

"One thing is certain, Unity is not chiefly the result of our activity, but a gift of the Holy Spirit."

In related comments, Pope Francis is quoted:

"It is possible to overcome the pandemic...but we will succeed if we are united."

In a Catechesis, the Holy Father said:

"Our prayer for unity is thus a humble but trusting participation in the prayer of the Lord."

At this point we ask ourselves: Do I pray for unity?" The *Catechism* is a foundational guide for navigating this topic of Christian unity, a unity in Christ found in prayer and in the Eucharist: "Christ bestowed unity on his Church from the beginning. This is why Jesus himself prayed at the hour of his Passion, and does not cease praying to his Father, for the unity of his disciples, that they may all be one."

As the Choir confirms with a Jesuit Father John Foley song, One Bread, One Body, in the Hymns section designated as "Communion" :

"One bread, one body, one Lord of all..."Unity...in a spirit of love. We are our mission.






