About Children's Liturgy of the Word

Children's Liturgy of the Word will be available at the **10am. Masses in the Parish Hall**. This important ministry invites children to participate in Sunday worship and hear a reflection at an age appropriate level. **Children, ages 4-8,** are invited to attend. Children's Liturgy of the Word is considered "church" even though the children are dismissed from the larger congregation for the Liturgy of the Word. We provide sacred space for them to worship together with their peers. The children learn how to walk in a procession, sit quietly to listen to the Gospel story, prayerfully reflect on God's Holy Word with the adult leader, and then offer their own Prayers of the Faithful. They, then process back into church to sit with their family for the rest of the Mass.

After the opening prayer at Mass, the Presider will invite the children to the front of the church for a blessing. The children process from Mass to Kavanagh Hall. Parents are always welcome to attend with their children.

Leaders

Gospel Meditation

If we are truly in love with God, then the basics are not going to be enough. That love is going to want to be expressed in going above and beyond, in leaving the comfortable and familiar, in stretching and growing, and in following a voice other than our own. St. Teresa of Calcutta rightly instructs us that for "love to be real, it must cost, it must hurt, it must empty us of self." Being in love with God requires more than just checking the boxes of the commandments. It requires a sincere and unconditional self-investment. Desiring God with our whole heart, mind, and soul means that I must also desire a relationship with my neighbor with that same degree of fervor.

Biases and prejudices usually occur when people are kept at a distance and treated as objects. We cannot truly know our neighbors, especially if they are different than us, if we keep them in boxes and do not listen to their stories. When we open ourselves to listen to another person's story, we begin to realize more how similar we are than dissimilar. Being overly attached to our possessions, ideologies, agendas, lifestyles, and personal needs are absolute barriers to achieving the type of personal investment love demands. This is why following Christ can be difficult. It is less a matter of intellect and more a matter of heart and soul. It requires that we transfer our treasure from an investment in tangible secular things and move it into the Kingdom of God. It is only the gift of wisdom and discernment that can help us decide what to do and how to do it.

Contemporaries of Jesus would know that a camel could not enter through the portal of a city weighed down with the baggage it was carrying. In order to enter, the baggage must be removed so that the animal could fit through the entry way. The same is true for us. We carry a lot of excessive baggage around with us that keeps us tethered to our past histories, wounds, myopic world views, prejudices, fears, and suspicions. To invest ourselves in the Kingdom of God, do God's work and live out our love relationship with God, we need to shed the extra weight. While it may seem that a lot of that stuff is necessary, it really is not. We are much more than the things that we think define us and more secure than we think. The more there is to hold on to and the more that we carry with us, the harder it will be to leave it all behind. Many choose not to and walk away sad because they are not ready to trust.

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: In these unique times when even smiling to one another has literally been masked and often replaced by an emphasis on a gesture of "eyes-ing", more so than smiling, there is no masking of the many examples of the multiple levels of Catholic life in action as found in our faith and compiled in our *Catechism*. These examples can be big or small in nature and scope.

For example, as students return to school, they may be reminded of the value of the yearly "clean slate." It's that wonderful fresh start that the new school year always affords. A student's previous year's challenges, perhaps ineffective study habits or a previous term's results falling short of highest proficiency may be largely overcome as part of a renewed effort that results in academic conversion toward excellence. This isn't the highest order of active faith along the lines of spiritual conversion, but it's representative of a continuum that *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* outlines.

On other levels, and even within the materials and the books we read, there are countless examples of conversion and contrition. In the enduring literary classic, Robinson Crusoe, the title character undergoes a kind of epiphany in experiencing a newly discovered spirit of faith, an ethos in which this solitary and stranded 17th century outcast considers his fate, after years of a dissolute, rebellious life: "These reflections made me very sensible of the goodness of Providence to me, that God had yet mercy in store for me." His newly-found outlook and brand of conversion led to prayer and a redemptive love of God.

How does the *Catechism* order, present, and distill a discussion of conversion and contrition?

A: The *Catechism* contains many interesting sections examining the topics that touch the lives of Christians in personally relevant terms intellectually and viscerally, on a daily, real-world basis. The sections on Contrition and Conversion find us thinking about being more confident in God's grace.

Among the aspects of conversion and contrition listed in the catechism are: acts of the penitent; hope for God's mercy; the work of God; turning from evil; turning toward God; the call to conversion; continuing task of the individual and the Church; almsgiving, fasting and prayer; interior conversion; and perfect contrition. The Catechism is known as," a positive, coherent and contemporary map for our spiritual journey toward transformation." That mariner, Robinson Crusoe, created in a work of fiction in the year 1719, could have used such a map, a map that Pope John Paul II called, "a special gift."

From a clean slate to a discerning appreciation of the glory of God in our daily lives, the maturing conversion of our faith journey finds clarity in the guidance of the *Catechism*


