Pastor's Letter

Response to the Financial Statement of the Parish

Last week we published our annual financial statement for the fiscal year beginning July 1st, 2020.

It caused some alarm for the future from parishioners because of the lower income we have had during the pandemic. Certainly we cannot continue with \$100,000+ annual deficits. We were able to reduce our expenses, but most of our expenses are fixed, such as salaries, utilities maintenance and upkeep so we can't go much lower.

The biggest change since the pandemic began is a lower Sunday contribution, caused by the partial closure of the church and people staying safer at home for most of the time. Our parishioners who use Faith Direct's automatic payments for their Sunday offertory was so important as well as parishioners who gave extraordinary gifts to help keep us functioning.

A few parishioners mentioned that it was time for them to increase their weekly offering as they had not increased it for several years. I realized that I have not increased my own weekly offering back to the parish for several years and want to make a change. God has blessed me so much and I am so grateful for his Love, my gift back to the Lord comes from a generous heart. I hope your own hearts are filled with gratitude as well—even in these difficult times.

Our attendance at Mass is slowly increasing, but still far below our pre-pandemic attendance. We take a count of Sunday Mass attendance every October, so will have those numbers to compare to 2019 in a couple of weeks.

We will continue to add photos to the Wall of Remembrance until All Souls Day, Nov. 2^{nd.} See details on how to add photos of your loved ones on the right.



Gospel Meditation

"What do you wish me to do for you?"

Whether we realize it, this is a question God is always asking. It's an important question because the answer we provide will reveal a great deal about where our hearts lie.

Our requests of God can often appear very noble and altruistic. They consist of requests for healing for someone in need of prayers, successful resolution of a personal conflict, assistance in overcoming a disease and myriad other desires for both ourselves and others. We are especially concerned about those we love and can easily find ourselves bringing their struggles to God for a hearing in our prayer.

Is that really all that prayer is about?

The woman in today's Gospel, having been put in her place by Jesus, was only looking out for the wellbeing of her sons. She was doing what mothers do, protecting and securing the livelihood of her children. But she was sadly mistaken, her request was not granted. We all make this same misguided mistake from time to time.

The goal of prayer is not to convince God of the worthiness of our agenda or to gain a hearing. Sometimes we believe that the more we multiply our prayers or discover the right combination of supplications that we will receive more of God's attention.

That's not how it works.

Even though God desires to hear, know, and be an intimate part of what is on our minds, it goes much deeper.

What we need from God is a relationship. It's a relationship that guides and immerses us in the very stuff of life and in the direction of the Gospel. This relationship sees God's kingdom and agenda, not our own, as what is most important. It builds the strength of character necessary to bring God's Gospel into a world that may not receive it with open arms. It may cause us discomfort and suffering.

We are asked to heroically journey with God through suffering, hardship, ridicule, and even death! Ultimately, our desire from God must become our desire for God.

It is only when this happens that the powerful words "thy will be done" will be found with sincerity and humility on our lips.

Whatever God wishes becomes what we wish as we see this glorious union of wills. Our humble lives will then become powerful witnesses, and what happens to us in God's eternal kingdom the result of his mercy.

We become true servants and find ourselves discovering God's definition of success. That definition has nothing at all to do with status, income, or privilege. ©LPi

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: In Shakespeare's play, Othello, the emotional main character, urged on by one of his lieutenants, lago, laments about a "vale of tears."

A vale, or valley, such as a broad plain became, in the fifteenth-century, a metaphor for the slope of life, a vale of tears with all its challenges. Reference to a vale of tears is also found among the prayers of the Rosary, within that section known as the Litany of Loreto:

"...to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears..."

This month of October, which honors the feast day of our Holy Mother Mary, is recognized as a month dedicated to contemplation and reinvigoration of the praying of the Holy Rosary.

How does the Church characterize the praying of the Rosary for the faithful, each person moving amid their individual vale of tears?

A: The Catechism of the Catholic Church emphasizes the inestimable value of the meditative prayers of the rosary:

"The Church's devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship. The liturgical feasts dedicated to the Mother of God and Marian prayer, such as the rosary, an epitome of the whole Gospel, express this devotion to the Virgin Mary."

Pope Francis writes in his book, Mother Mary: Inspiring Words from Pope Francis:

"Here I would like to emphasize the beauty of a simple, contemplative prayer, accessible to all...

It is the prayer of the Holy Rosary. Indeed, in the Rosary while we repeat the Hail Mary we meditate on the Mysteries, on the events of Christ's life, so as to know and love him better.

The Rosary is an effective means for opening ourselves to God for it helps us to overcome egotism and to bring peace to our hearts, in the family, in society, and in the world."

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops esteems and encapsulates the Rosary:

"The Rosary is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the Apostles's Creed which summarizes the great mysteries of the Catholic Faith."

This week's Gospel readings include Psalm 1:

"Blessed are they who hope in the Lord."

As part of that hope we cherish the rosary and send up our sighs, prayerfully reciting the prayers that guide, Instruct, and which help to obtain the promises of a Christian life, comforting us as we move along this vale of tears.


