

Holy Water

Question:

What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non -Catholic friends?

Answer:

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as he entrusts to the Church his saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us.

On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus.



We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are

indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ.

Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God.

Gospel Meditation

When we see God with true sincerity of heart and God passes us along our way, it is only then that we will be able to cry out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!"

We have to truly want to be healed by, and in union with, God in order for us to reach out to him. If God is only an abstract idea, theory, or someone found in the pages of a book, there is no motivation for a relationship and no desire to seek him. God needs to be real in order for faith to be real. It's all about the journey.

St. Augustine reminds us that

"to fall in love with God is the greatest romance; to seek Him the greatest adventure; to find Him the greatest human achievement."

We strive after many things and mercy is not always one of them. We think that we can find fulfillment and healing in other things only to discover that we are still short and empty.

From the moment human beings were created, God has been calling us and seeking us. He has been walking right beside the human story from the minute He first breathed life into the first human soul.

Are we able to recognize God as He walks with us?

At some point we have to realize that there is only one way to satisfy the deepest longings of the human heart and that is in relationship with our Creator.

We are called to this. However, we make the huge error of thinking that what we are hearing is coming from somewhere else. We become confused. Every human being would certainly profit with wisdom if they realized Who calls them and to Whom they belong.

Then and only then will we realize that it is only our Divine Master who can give us true vision and heal us.

Once we recognize and reach out for the merciful presence of our loving Maker, we will be able to see with our soul, understanding the true nature and depth of all things.

God's mercy is always available.

It doesn't matter how far we have strayed or how blind we become, God patiently waits to console us, guide us and heal us.

All we need to do is desire Him. Once we reach out, we also realize that there is no greater love to be found than God's, no human adventure that comes even close to the thrill of a spiritual search, and no human achievement even remotely as satisfying as union with

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: While quietly awaiting confession, the Saturday afternoon sun streamed brightly into the sanctuary. Amid a preparatory examination of conscience, reflected colors of stained glass served to further illuminate the images of the faithful departed posted in honored memoriam.

Reflected streaming light was followed by reflective thoughts, perhaps thoughts of the upcoming solemnity of All Saints Day and All Souls Day. The faces of those pictured are evocative, sometimes tearfully, of lives lived, and lives passing. Yet also palpably present among those faces is sustaining, hopeful faith. We may think about scripture:

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not your harm, to give you a future with hope."

How else does the Church place and validate All Saints Day and All Souls Day as celebrations of hope?

A: The solemnity of All Saints Day was established by the Church long before All Souls Day. The Church recognizes the lives and actions of the saints virtually daily, year-round. As exemplars of faith the Reverend Alban Butler describes the saints as being, "...on the road to perfection." The Catechism of the Catholic Church cites Paragraph 1055: "By virtue of the communion of saints the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist on their behalf." Addressing the nature of the realm of those who have

gone to their reward, the *Catechism* includes Paragraph 1054: "Those who die in God's grace and friendship imperfectly purified, although they are assured of their

eternal salvation, undergo a purification after death, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of God." The always insightful Pope Benedict XVI reflected in

2011: "As human beings, we have a natural fear of death

and we rebel against its apparent finality. Faith teaches us that the fear of death is lightened by a great hope, the

hope of eternity, which gives our lives their fullest

meaning. The God who is love offers us the promise of eternal life through the death and resurrection of His Son." Therefore: "...in Christ, death no longer appears as an abyss of emptiness, but rather a path to life which will never end." The Good News of the Gospel of John, Chapter 14, is present and reflected in the spirit of those faces along the Church walls and within the searching hearts of all

the faithful: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God, have faith also in me. In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If there were not, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? For all souls: "...to give you a future with hope." The hope of eternity...


