

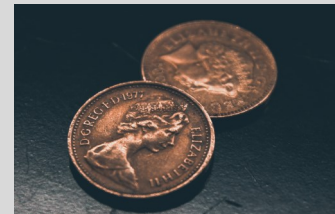

Pastor's Letter

On Receiving Eucharist from the Chalice

In my nearly 45 years of being a priest it has always been the practice that the Faithful have been able to receive Communion from the Chalice. It seems so strange in these days to be the only one to receive Communion from the chalice.

Both the history and theology of receiving the precious Body and Blood of Christ under both species of bread and wine is long and complicated. From the earliest days of the Church the faithful received Communion under both species of the bread and wine. This practice was standard in the Church until the 12th century.

Gradually, over the next few centuries, the community reception from the chalice faded until the Council of Trent, by which time the faithful were only receiving the consecrated host. The Council of Trent taught that when we receive either the host or from the chalice we are receiving the fullness of Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Receiving both species is not required to receive the fullness of the sacrament. Christ is sacramentally (and equally) present under each species, and therefore if a person receives only one species, Christ is fully present and nothing is lacking.

It was not a matter of the priest being the only one who can drink from the chalice. The practice of receiving from the chalice for the faithful had simply come to disuse and become the norm.

At the Second Vatican Council in the early 1960's the opportunity for the faithful to begin receiving from the chalice became an option again. Receiving from both species is common in the United States, but it is not yet in use in many countries of the world.

The pandemic has caused us to temporarily set the use of the Chalice aside for the health and safety of all, and it has certainly caused me to become more conscious of my reception of the Body and Blood of Christ from the chalice in the species of wine. I receive it not simply as my 'right,' but I do so in the name of each of you and of the entire community of the Church, affirming the act of Christ in His gift of His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity for the salvation of us all.

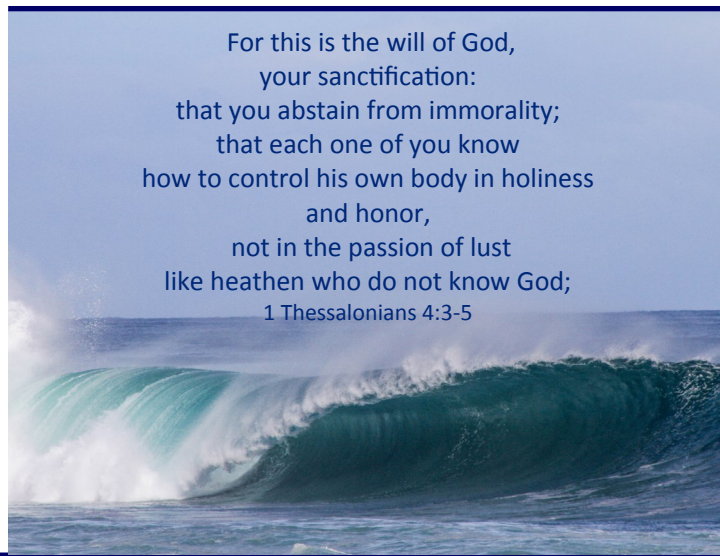

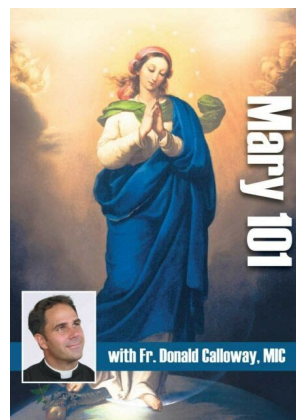

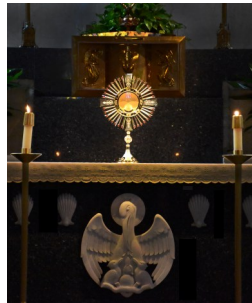

On December 10, 1979, a very petite holy woman known as Mother Teresa of Calcutta spoke these words in her Nobel Peace Prize Acceptance Speech, "But I am sure in the families and many of our homes, maybe we are not hungry for a piece of bread, but maybe there is somebody there in the family who is unwanted, unloved, uncared, forgotten, there isn't love. Love begins at home. And love to be true has to hurt. I never forget a little child who taught me a very beautiful lesson. They heard in Calcutta, the children, that Mother Teresa had no sugar for her children, and this little one, Hindu boy four years old, he went home and he told his parents: I will not eat sugar for three days, I will give my sugar to Mother Teresa. How much a little child can give. After three days they brought into our house, and there was this little one who could scarcely pronounce my name, he loved with great love, he loved until it hurt. And this is what I bring before you, to love one another until it hurts, but don't forget that there are many children, many children, many men and women who haven't got what you have. And remember to love them until it hurts."

Living authentically and walking with holiness always involves sacrifice. It has to hurt. Only actions springing from true and deep sacrifice demonstrate true integrity. Without sacrifice, even what is apparently a generous gesture can be nothing. It is no wonder that the widow who contributed from her poverty received great admiration from Jesus and the young child in our story above the interest of Mother Teresa. It is easy to make the houses of our lives look like they are in perfect order when in fact they are in shambles within. Religion can sometimes make this hypocritical masquerade easy to accomplish. We can find ourselves in all the right holy places, reciting all of the correct prayers, participating in community collections, and reciting the proper doctrines only to find ourselves empty, shallow, self-focused, and overly anxious about personal concerns.

The one who learns to discover their inner poverty, their spiritual poverty, is the only one who can truly place him or herself at the mercy of God. It is only when we allow ourselves to be empty that we realize Who we actually need to fill us. This is the real meaning of trust. Many of us are afraid to take the plunge. We allow ourselves to detach from only so much, always keeping a watchful eye on the protection of our securities. We understand the value of poverty, but we do not want to become too poor. As long as we are able to recognize this tension, our reluctance to let go and our struggle, we can continue our journey of humbly learning how to love so deeply that it hurts. God understands and waits.

Q: A sustaining and ever-persistent question of faith reaches and finds us from across the ages. It is a question that goes to the eternal truths of mercy, and at its heart is the essence of the grace of a pastoral and loving God. The question reflects and echoes the ministry of Jesus as he walked the dusty byways of long-ago Judea and Jerusalem.

In Matthew's Gospel it was a rich young man who looked to the savior and asked the question:

"Teacher, what good must I do to gain eternal life?"
In the Gospel of Luke, it is a wealthy, older Pharisee who reformulates the question:

"Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

The answer to this question, (for young and old,) comes in various gradations and has engendered, over time, a wide range of responses, from the most zealous form to a more familiar response.

A: Here is one of the more animated responses to the question:

"We are ready to die rather than to transgress the laws of God!"

These ringing words were shouted by one descended from the priestly family of the Machabees, (or Maccabees), meaning hammerer or hammer-like, whose traditions are associated with righteous rebellion and martyrdom. The words echo across the ages and are recorded among the lives of the Saints.

One saint, Saint Marcellus, was a Roman Centurion in the legion of Trajan, who boldly declared that he was a soldier of Jesus Christ. Prepared to inherit eternal life, and refusing to transgress the laws of God resulted in his martyrdom.

Biblical authorities have interpreted the motives of the questioners in the gospels as seeking to lay claim to God's favor by their own merit rather than by God's grace.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that Jesus answered the questioning, saying, in Matthew 19:

"If you would enter into life, keep the commandments."

The Catechism has a wonderful discussion of a life in Christ, and a clarifying answer to the question of gaining eternal life, summarized in Paragraphs 2064:and 2067:

"In fidelity to Scripture and in conformity with the example of Jesus, the tradition of the Church has acknowledged the primordial importance and significance of the Decalogue. The Ten Commandments state what is required in the love of God and love of neighbor. The first three concern love of God, and the other seven love of neighbor."

What must I do? Keep the commandments. Not by our own merit, but by the grace of God.

Or as Galatians 4 puts it:

"For in Christ Jesus the only thing that counts is faith working through love."

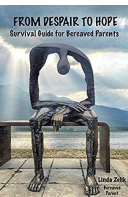

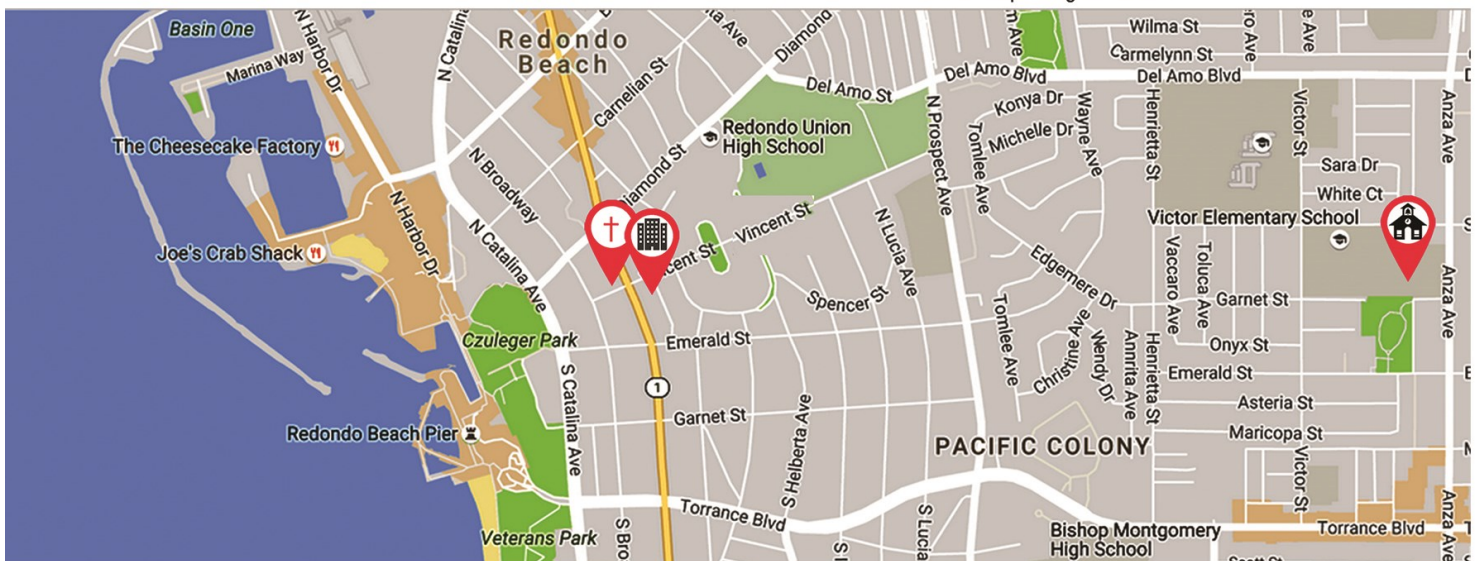
