# **Pastor's Letter**

Throughout world history there has never been a set "New Year".

While the cycle of the seasons were known, and the cycles of the moon on their own pace, every king and emperor established a set day to begin their 'year'.

Some chose an equinox or solstice and others chose a moon cycle related to the sun. Every different language spoken had its own year. Today we mostly hear of the Chinese, Jewish or Muslim years, but there are still *many* more.

The Church year is set to follow the ministry of Jesus and the journey to our salvation. Shortly after Constantine ended the persecutions against the Church the date of Christmas was set in 336 to December 25<sup>th</sup>—the Roman date of the Winter Solstice.

Advent begins the journey towards Christmas and so with the beginning of Advent, 4 weeks before Christmas, the Church begins its 'Year'.

The Gospels all move toward themes of end times and judgment as Jesus travels towards Jerusalem and his final days with Passover, his death and resurrection.

This year we have followed the Gospel of Mark. As we approach the end of our Church year we are challenged to look more closely at the journey of our life and what is happening in our hearts in our relationship to God and others and the Kingdom we have been created for.

With the uncertainty and challenges of the pandemic we pray that our hearts are not bouncing around with daily controversies and politics, but continue to move closer to God and the love he has placed in our hearts and the hope of His healing grace.



This year, due to limited capacity, we will be hosting TWO Christmas concerts at our new Community Campus.


The concerts will take place on Thursday, Dec. 2<sup>nd</sup> and Friday, Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup>, both at 7pm.



## **Gospel Meditation**

"And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory."

Take a moment to ponder these words from today's Gospel. How does this image make you feel?

For people to truly understand the significance of this message, something profound has to happen within. If we find ourselves reacting with a sense of dread or fear, we have to step back and ask why. Our answer will reveal a great deal about our relationship with God.

It's hard to fall in love with a God of whom we are afraid. God does not want us to be afraid. Nor does He want us to align our wills to His in order to avoid some kind of horrendous eternal consequence. That sounds like too much of a superficial power play on the part of God who continues to seek out His children in love.

In order for these words to carry any type of significant meaning for us, they have to resonate with and touch us on a deeper level. They have to be able to connect some dots and have meaning for us in order for this promise to change our lives.

Sometimes we get preoccupied with the uncertainty of our deaths. Not knowing when or how we will eventually die can be unsettling. But, more so than needing an answer to the "when" of death, the "what" of death answer we provide has more significance. What happens to us when we die? Whether we die during the natural course of our lives or when Christ comes again, the experience is the same. If we believe that we are meant to live in union with God eternally and that death completes and does not diminish us, then it is worth our time and effort to wait in vigilant hope of the Lord's coming in glory.

Our journey back to God is something beautiful to be desired, not dreaded or feared.

Sadly, many folks believe that life is no more than a random occurrence without any purposeful direction or meaning.

Death is simply death and nothing more. For them, the Second Coming of Christ and God's eternal promise have no meaning. When we understand the truth about who we are, it changes things up.

We then can see ourselves as works in progress who have the choice to either resist the inspirations of the Divine Artist or give into the wonderful creativity of His will. Life awaiting the fullness of Christ to come becomes an unfolding of Divine surprises and abundant joy.

God is eternally merciful, forgiving, and welcoming.

It is only when we directly reject this gift and turn our backs on Love itself that we have anything to fear. ©LPi

## Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

**Q:** Amid this world-wide pandemic, one of the many emergent challenges is the evolving concept of labor and the nature of the work in which we are engaged. Work has been marked by a "sea-change", an expression that denotes a "substantial change in perspective, especially one which affects a society." It's also said that we are, as a result of the pandemic, at an "inflection point." In math an inflection point is "a point of a curve at which a change in direction of curvature occurs," In business, (and in general terms), an inflection point marks a time of "significant change in a situation; a turning point." We're there. As many engage in virtual, modified levels of labor, or other turning points of work along our various curvature points, we find solace in the familiar words of Jesus in Matthew 11: "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened..."

How does the immutability of the Catholic faith continue to provide divine perspective and guidance regarding the nature of work as part of our faith journey?

**A:** The Catechism of the Catholic Church serves to center us, teaching that in any age: "Work is duty. Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from him. It can also be redemptive. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross daily in the work he is called to accomplish."

Pope Francis: "We collaborate with the creative work of God when, through our work, we participate in the spirit of Jesus, in his redemptive mission..."

Our Choir sings that by our faith, we are the "Eyes and Hands of Christ." St. Ambrose declared "...every worker is the hand of Christ who continues to create and to do good."

Author Matthew Kelly writes about the work of building relationships, staying on the mission, and the realities of dissatisfaction by those who still seek the right sort of job situation. He encourages us to ask, "What does God want?" Here is a brief summary statement from a chapter in his book, Perfectly Yourself: "One way or another, whether it is forty hours a week or three hours a week, find what you love and do it."

A retired teacher, armed with that love of teaching that Kelly describes, recalls sharing with students that many people reported each day to a job that they did not like. This educator wanted those students to know that their teacher wouldn't want to be anywhere else but working with them in that classroom, a mission which no inflection point could substantially alter. The students broke into spontaneous applause in appreciation of that particular work/learning environment.

We labor on in this vineyard of the Lord, seeking to elevate, in all of our ways, our work, our relationships, and our place within the mission of the Church in the spirit of Jesus that Pope Francis discussed. As Jesus the carpenter went about his work and his mission, we, in the face of a pandemic, continue to strive, as the *Catechism* states: "to fulfill our potential."

"Come to me all you who labor and are burdened...and I will give you rest."
