Gospel Meditation

Staying awake can often be a challenge, especially when we are exhausted. Life's demands have a way of zapping every last bit of energy out of us. When we are tired it affects us not only physically, but psychologically and spiritually as well. All of our senses are dulled and diminished. We can overlook details, become disinterested, lethargic and apathetic, and detached. Getting sufficient physical rest only helps so much. We need to be rejuvenated, refreshed, and reenergized in other ways. If we are psychologically exhausted, we need to understand what is draining our emotions and taxing our relationships. If we are spiritually tired, we need to find the necessary "shot in the arm" to put us back in touch with God. Unfortunately, exhaustion is seldom limited to just one part of who we are. When we lack energy and zeal it is usually the case that everything suffers. We not only are affected physically, but psychologically and spiritually as well. In short, when we run out of gas the engine stops.

And yet, our Lord's directive is clear, "Be vigilant at all times." Even Jesus knew what "the anxieties of daily life" can do to us. One day pours into another and time guickly flies by. Any one of us can take a moment and reflect on how many wonderful, creative opportunities we miss because there is always so much "stuff" to do and so little time to do it. Usually these are missed moments of love, and if we are missing love encounters we are also missing God. Sleepwalking through life, we check the boxes next to our list of "must and have to dos" and justify it all by convincing ourselves that tomorrow is another day and there'll be more time. It may surprise us, but tomorrow is here, and time is running out. While we may like to believe that we have an "eternity" of time to do all those things that require the focus, energy, and desire we do not currently have, we don't. We're on a limited ride and time is short.

Jesus is also clear on another point. "That day [will] catch you by surprise like a trap." If we are going to be judged on love and so easily justify not having all that much time to do so, then it seems we must shift focus a bit. St. Teresa of Calcutta tells us, "We desire to be able to welcome Jesus at Christmas-time, not in a cold manger of our heart, but in a heart full of love and humility, a heart so pure, so immaculate, so warm with love for one another." Getting to this place doesn't "just happen." It requires vigilance and discipline both with a knowledge of what is really of importance and what really needs to be the focus of our energy and time. Pray, starting now and not tomorrow, that we can stay alert, be strengthened in our faith, and prepared for whatever will come. Don't miss another opportunity to love. ©LPi

Catholic Q and A

Q: St. Augustine is quoted in Latin: "Timeo lesum transeuntem" (I fear that Jesus will pass by me unnoticed). Speaking at St. Peter's Basilica, Pope Francis stated: *"It is important to remain watchful, because one great mistake in life is to get absorbed in a thousand things and not to notice God."* These quotes prompt a discussion of a season of hope that marks the beginning of the Church's liturgical year. What is this season, clothed in purple vestments; a time of preparation which begins November 28?

A: The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops clarify: "Beginning the liturgical year, Advent, (from, "advenire" in Latin or "to come to") is the season encompassing the four Sundays (and weekdays) leading up to the celebration of Christmas.

Pope Francis, able to make our liturgical practices immediate, relevant and always meaningful, advocates for active participation in Advent: "Let us make the traditional Advent prayer our own: 'Come, Lord Jesus." We can say it at the beginning of each day and repeat it often, before our meetings, our studies, and our work, before making decisions, in every important or difficult moment of our lives. Come Lord Jesus." The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in Paragraph #524: "When the Church celebrates the liturgy of Advent each year, she makes present this ancient expectancy of the Messiah, for by sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, the faithful renew their ardent desire for his second coming..."

A pastoral voice in trying times, Pope Francis admonishes: "The situation we are experiencing, marked by the pandemic, generates concern, fear and despair in many; there is the risk of falling into pessimism. How should we react to all this? Our soul awaits the Lord: He is our help and our shield. Advent is an incessant call to hope..." We are poised on the threshold of a regenerative liturgical year, marked by preparation; unwavering hope; ancient devotion; the symbol of the Advent Wreath; a modestly decorated altar; biblical messianic imagery; and the nativity.

Among the many facets of a rich Catholic faith is the artistry of sacred music which expresses what is in our watchful, yearning hearts of faith. One of many biographies of Ludwig van Beethoven finds this musical genius, reflecting, while composing an updated Opera called Fidelio 1814, which was beginning to become another masterwork of musical expression. "Good heavens, he wrote, my kingdom is in the air; like the wind, the tones whirl around me, and often in my soul." One of our Choir's selections by Daniel Schutte, not written in the Classic or Romantic period of Beethoven's years, but in the 20th century, exhibits the same sort of musically soulful reflection of our feelings about the season and imagery of Advent: "Beyond the moon and stars, as deep as night, so great our hunger, Lord, to see your light. The sparrow finds her home, beneath your wing, so may we come to rest where angels sing." It is a beautiful, Advent-Themed song with tones of music and of faith, that whirl around and through the sanctuary of our Church and within the sanctuary of our hearts. We are reminded of that prayer, part of that incessant call to hope: "Come, Lord Jesus ... "




