What is the Immaculate Conception?

The Immaculate Conception is a Catholic dogma that states that Mary, whose conception was brought about the normal way, was conceived without original sin or its stain. That's what "immaculate" means: without stain.

It's important to understand what the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception is and what it is not.

Some people think the term refers to Christ's conception in Mary's womb without the intervention of a human father; but that is the Virgin Birth. Others think the Immaculate

Conception means Mary was conceived "by the power of the Holy Spirit," in the way Jesus was, but that, too, is incorrect.

The essence of original sin consists in the deprivation of sanctifying grace, and its stain is a corrupt nature.

Mary was preserved from these defects by God's grace; from the first instant of her existence she was in the state of sanctifying grace and was free from the corrupt nature original sin brings.

Join us on this Holy Day of Obligation as we celebrate that Mary was graced over the whole of her life, from conception onward. She was in a state of sanctifying grace from the first moment of her existence.

Gospel Meditation

St. Ambrose shares some wisdom on our need to prepare the way and open the door for Christ.

"You see that when the Word of God knocks hardest on your door, it is when his hair is wet with the dew of the night. In fact, he chooses to visit those who are in tribulation and trial, lest one of them be overwhelmed by distress. So, his head is covered with dew, with drops, when his body is laboring hard. It is important to keep watch so that when the Bridegroom comes, he is not shut out. If you are asleep and your heart is not keeping watch, he will go away without knocking; but if your heart is alert for his coming, he knocks and asks for the door to be opened to him."

When life gets overwhelming and difficult and we find ourselves feeling a bit downhearted and miserable, these words can bring great comfort.

We sometimes choose to remain stuck in our uncomfortable darkness and being stuck becomes our norm.

In this time of self-focus our hearts are closed to the graces and life God desires to give us. Wrapped in the robe of mourning and misery, we fail to see the mercy, justice, and love the Bridegroom wants to bring.

If we take seriously the need to prepare the way for Christ and open our hearts in preparation for his visit, we can hear God's gentle voice calling us deep within. It beckons us to seek out its source and discover the inner calm and peace that can prevail over the darkness of despair. Sometimes our darkness is so dark that it may seem unsurmountable. Trusting in the spiritual friends who journey with us, and God's promise may bring a glimmer of light even when it is most difficult to keep our hearts' doors open.

Sometimes, the only light in the darkness is found in trusting the faith of others both past and present.

We have to trust that God has already begun the accomplishment of good work in us and that humanity is on an incredible journey to something wonderful and awesome.

God is not done.

When we open the doors of our hearts, straighten the paths of our lives, and prepare the way, Jesus can come with God's simple gifts of peace, grace, and joy. Life throws a great deal at us. It is easy to get tired and confused. We have to train our hearts to keep watch, discern what is of value, and forge ahead. Not allowing ourselves to become so weighed down by things and brought out of focus is a tremendous goal to achieve this Advent season. God is knocking. Answer the door.

Catholic Q and A

J.P. Alegria

Q: The observance of the Feast of Christ the King on that last Sunday of the liturgical year once again highlighted the holy paradigm of active service within the Church, because that observance underscores what is the most perfect example of selfless service, Jesus Christ; the ultimate King of service. What else can we say about acts of service?

A: We find many entries in The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* about Christ the servant, as in Paragraph #565:

"From the beginning of his public life, at his baptism, Jesus is the "Servant", wholly consecrated to the redemptive work that he will accomplish..."

In clarifying the application of one's treasure, time and talents in service and stewardship, our own Monsignor Mike wrote in our parish website archive:

"There are many gifts among us! When we embrace Stewardship and call forth and nurture the gifts of all people, our parish thrives and becomes a living testimony to our faith."

Pope Francis, whose official title includes the moniker: "Servant of the Servants of God" adds to this discussion: "Brothers and sisters, you represent the large and varied world of voluntary workers. You are among the most precious things the Church has, you who every day, often silently and unassumingly, give shape and visibility to mercy. Your presence is the hand of Christ held out to all..."

So thank you to all who contribute time, talents, and treasure, volunteering in service to our various ministries which span varied efforts in picking up spirits, building up the body of Christ, (as our Church Mission Statement outlines), in each wonderful ministry across the service spectrum, including picking up and serving donuts, which also lifts spirits by way of hospitality, fellowship, and community.

As scripture states in Matthew 5:16: "Let your light so shine before all, that they may see your good works, and give glory to your Father who is in heaven." Volunteer efforts in service are reflective of so many scriptural references, including;

- * "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." 1 Peter 4:10
- * "Give, and it will be given to you... Luke 6:38 "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all, and servant of all." Mark 9:35


