

## The 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent

In today's Gospel, we hear of two pregnancies. We hear in the second reading: "you... prepared a body for me... here I am; I have come to do your will, O God."

There is no doubt why Jesus was conceived either. This infant Jesus was conceived not for saving one life, but for saving millions of his brothers and sisters by showing them how to live, what it means to be fully human and fully alive.

We may tend our sorrows, silently and in private, but good news aches to be shared with one who will rejoice with us. Jesus is good news, and Mary hastens to share her good news with her cousin, Elizabeth.

Elizabeth responds in a way that surely exceeded Mary's expectation. Before Mary says hello, Elizabeth asks, "Who am that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" There are few words recorded from this meeting. Those who look for scripture sources speaking against abortion often cite Elizabeth's calling Mary "mother of my Lord" so soon after the annunciation. Both Elizabeth and Mary recognize each other's place in God's plan of salvation and together they share the joy that comes from that knowledge.

Before we celebrate Christmas, we need to stop and remind ourselves who this baby is:

• Truly human - fragile flesh that develops understanding as he increases in wisdom and age and grace, just as we have done;

• Truly divine - stripped of glory to dwell in our midst and show us the way.

He is, in the prophetic words of the first reading, peace. He is not judgment, not condemnation, not vindication of our ways over others', but an offer of peace when we are rooted in him. Peace among all peoples, all families, all friends.

Jesus has taken flesh, not only in Mary's womb, but also in our own selves. We carry him with us and we - male and female - give birth to him in a world which questions whether Jesus and many an expected child is really good news.

If we really believe that this pregnancy, Mary's and ours, is good news, can we keep it secret any less than Mary? Shall we let anyone who will listen know that the child who has taken flesh in us is God's own? That the child born to give life to all our brothers and sisters, is peace for our troubled world?

This morning we gather at this table for a life-saving 'transplant.' Here, Jesus gives us his word and gives us his body and blood as real food. Here, we, in turn, become his body to go forth from our celebration and give life to the world that hungers for him - even when they do not realize it.

When and if the opportunity presents itself -- as when we hear the politically correct "happy holiday" instead of "Merry Christmas" -- will we acknowledge Jesus as the reason for the season? Let's not miss the opportunity. (www.oblates.org/homily-helps-feed/fourth-sunday-of-



#### **Gospel Meditation**

St. Augustine tells us that a "Christian is a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and a hand through which Christ helps." As we look around and out at the world, we do not have to search too far before we come face to face with inequity and injustice. There is so much unfairness, prejudice, anger, hatred, violence, and want. The stories of human heartache, people being hurt, deprived of life's necessities, loneliness, and sickness are far too commonplace. For many of the world's ills, the vices of greed, lust, pride, gluttony, and jealousy are clearly among the more significant root causes.

Why doesn't God just step in and fix this mess? After all, God created this world, and one would hope that he would step up and take some measure of responsibility for it! Once we sit with this thinking for a while, we can begin to realize just how flawed it really is. God did take responsibility and God did fix the problem! God sent us Jesus Christ as the divine solution to the world's ills. It is not God who has shirked responsibility, we have. We are the ones who continually fail to set our own personal needs, wants, and securities aside so that One more powerful than us can use us.

Mary had to set her needs aside in order for the Son of God to come into the world. Put simply, Mary listened and believed. Having opened herself to being an instrument of the Divine. God could use her as his mind, heart, voice, and hand. She became God's vessel so that God's greatness could reach the ends of the earth and peace could come upon the world. God's fix for the world's difficulties is you and me. We are the ones who confess that Jesus Christ came into the world as the Son of God, the Prince of Peace, and herald of justice. All we have to do is believe, as did Mary, that what has been spoken to us by the Lord will be fulfilled. Then, we can step aside and be the Christians we claim to be. What a difference it would make if every person who professed to be Christian truly understood that their one and only vocation is to be God's instrument. ### Catholic Q and A

#### Q: "Delta" "Omicron"

In this time of pandemic, echoes of the ancient Greek alphabet derived from Greek numeric values have become part of our lexicon, by way of designated COVID variants. In this week's scripture readings we find more Greek terms among the sacred words from the first chapter of the Book of Revelation: "I am the Alpha and the Omega." This pronouncement by God of the first and the last is part of the evolution of faith; God's plan that guides the direction of our Church and its liturgy, as part of the economy of faith and the economy of salvation discussed in the *Catechism*. We now say together, "I believe in God..."

The debates that resulted in the formulation of that Nicene Creed, sanctioned by the converted Roman Emperor Constantine, and written in the Greek language in the year 325, sought to separate doctrinal truth from heresy. Some of the elements of that debate included: Baptism; the Eucharist; the Son being of the same substance of the Father; along with other truths of divinity, all of which resulted in the constructs of the Council's profession of faith.

From that council, held in the Roman city of Nicea, (now Iznik, Turkey), came some of the essential elements of the "Christian statement of faith." Now, nearly 17 centuries later, we join in reciting that creed during the Mass: "I believe in God..." This prayer, said with true, zealous, and active devotion finds us as a united body of believers, which that long ago Council envisioned and sought to establish in their world of ancient and ongoing uncertainty, disunity and chaos.

What does the *Catechism* teach about that Council that we honor today as part of our worship of the "comprehensiveness" of our God?

A: Catechism Paragraph #198 is marked as what we believe by the Magisterium, (teaching arm of the Church), as well as the United States Conference Of Bishops: "Our profession of faith begins with God, for God is the First and the Last, the beginning and the end of everything. The Credo begins with God the Father, for the Father is the first divine person of the Most Holy Trinity; our Creed begins with the creation of heaven and earth, for creation is the beginning and the foundation of all God's works. Catholic belief is succinctly expressed in the profession of faith or credo, (from the Latin, 'I Believe'), called the Nicene Creed."

Pope Francis is visiting the country of Greece this week and among other issues he is, in general, professing the faith within those finite roots of the doctrinal lines drawn centuries ago in Nicea. He also, it is reported, added contemporary words of broad advice to all. The Holy Father called for "unchaining ourselves" from that cell phone and from social media, which he said can make us rather more unsociable to one another.

Bottom line, we are called to focus on the unity of our faith so that in any language, time, or place, we may continue to say, (together):

"I believe in God ... "




